A letter was read from the Irish Assoc for Prevention of Intemperance in reference to obtaining a supply of whisky water for drinking fountain at Bray Station ordered terms of Town Council letter of 8th April to be carried out.

522

Letters were read from the Mgr of the D.W.R.R. stating that the Company would be satisfied to run a train to the Dublin markets if guaranteed 100 passengers.

Mr Coffey made a book to get a list signed by the parties who would use the train and the Town Clerk was directed to communicate the decision of the Railway Company to the Commissioners of the other suburban Townships.

523

Plan submitted by Mr McCullagh for new shop front at No 4 Goldsmith's Tee was approved of.

524

A letter was read from Mr George of Main St asking that either the post of gas lamp or that of Electric Light opposite his house should be removed.

Ordered gas lamp to be removed as soon as Electric light is ready.

525

Miss Tracey of Pembroke Vale made complaint

of lamplighter neglecting his duty in reference to lamps on Harbour-roads. Ordered lamp lighter to keep lamps lighted.

526 A letter from Mr Bewley in re Gas Stand for Rydenham Villas was read & referred to next meeting of Gas Committee.

527 It was proposed by Mr Blenkins seconded by Mr Langton and adopted:-

"That the Engineers' attention be drawn to the necessity of stone facing southern face of south breakwater from level of beach"

528 Mr Hayes's account for £210 for report on Harbour works was submitted:-

Mr McCormick proposed and Mr Langton seconded.

"That a cheque for £105 be sent to Mr Hayes in full discharge of his account for report on Harbour Works".

Passed unanimously.

529 Correspondence in re Electric Lighting of Township having been considered, it was ordered:- That the Town Clerk be instructed to press Messrs Gordon & Co to proceed with laying of underground mains & that the selection of sites of incandescent lamps be left in the hands of Mr Comber to arrange with Mr Metzger; it being open to any member of the Board to attend.

530 It was ordered that Mr Comber should be again written to in re shelter for Esplanade.

Pursuant to advertisements tenders were received for concreting footpath on West side of Carter Street zone:-

Messrs Brady & Son £98-0-0; Mr Thomas Doyle £94-16-0; and Messrs Cordiner & Son £44-0-0. It was decided to postpone consideration of tenders until Monday 25th Inst so that Messrs Cordiner who had enquired some of the specified works could see specification. Town Clerk was directed to forward specification accordingly.

531 Mrs Kathleen Balayon made enquiry that the Township Engineer should be asked to meet Mr Muller in reference to Bray Industrial School. Ordered Mr Comber to arrange whatever is required it being understood that all expense in the matter will be borne by the School Authorities.

540 Dr W G Toomey re Surface Water Collector " " Overseer.

It was ordered that Firepost at Royal Hotel should be removed.

535 Correspondence in reference to obtaining possession of house on Fair Green having been submitted it was ordered that the matter should be placed in the hands of Mr Craig.

536 Mr David Towson tendered for putting new estate in waterup carts & painting it. Offer accepted.

538 The Under Secretary for Ireland made enquiry for a return showing the expenditure

of the commissioners from 1886 to 1891 both (years) inclusive.
The Town Clerk submitted return which was certified
by the Chairman and forwarded.

538 The Roads overseer reported that Mr Brady had
interfered with roadways at Sidmonton Square &
Sidmonton-road Novara Avenue, and made con-
nections to Commissioned Main Sewer in con-
travention of the regulations. It was ordered that
the drains in question should be disconnected
from main sewer and Mr Brady summoned.

542 Mr Plunkett gave notice that at next meeting he would
move a resolution in reference to the cross-roads
on Quinn Estate, and the Town Clerk was directed to
write to the owners of the plot opposite Novara Terrace
and to the solicitors of the Quinn estate with a
view to ascertaining whether they would
favour the connection of the road in question
with Novara Avenue at a point near small cottages
on Kyns mill property.

543 The minutes of meetings of 18 and 25th April were read
and confirmed.

544 The minutes and reports of Finance Committee; Harbour
Committee; and Public Health Committee were read
and adopted.

545 546
553 Mr Garrison Hayes wrote under date 29th April returning
cheque for £105-0-0 sent him by Town Clerk
in settlement of his account for report on Harbour
Works and requesting that a cheque for £20-0-0
should be forwarded to him.

It was proposed by Mr McCormick &
seconded by Mr Hennessy:-

"That the Commissioners having heard
read Mr Hayes' letter returning cheque
direct the Town Clerk to reply thereto: That,
on the occasion of Mr Hayes' visit the Harbour
Committee distinctly explained to him,

that they had no authority to interfere with the arrangements entered into with the Commissioners, and that Mr Hayes' letter of 1st January 1892 (B349) stated that in no case would his fee exceed 100 guineas and that it might be less. The commissioners however were willing to pay the expenses incurred by Mr Hayes from Holyhead £8.

Passed unanimously.

554 Mr Coulter reported that he had as instructed visited Bray Industrial school with Mr Fuller to arrange as to drainage. It would be necessary to carry the sewer through Mr Mulley field to school. Mr Brady offered to do the works for £16-14-0 which was a reasonable charge and be recommended its acceptance. The school authorities would bear all expenses in the matter. Report adopted and to be carried out on school authorities laying £6 in money usual for sanitary connections.

555 Mr R. Simpson wrote asking permission to open roads for taking up and relaying of a water main for T.W. Kelly Co. Ordered:- Commissioners would prefer not to have roads torn up during the summer season application to be renewed for consent at 2pm in next month or postponed until next winter.

556 Mr G. W. Crossley organiser of Irish Tourist Development Assoc wrote asking for the support of commissioners for his project. Referred to Amusements Comt.

558 On the motion of Mr Lupton the following resolution forwarded by the Town Clerk of Dublin was adopted:-

"That in the opinion of this Board the Christian Brothers schools are eminently entitled to aid from the state and education bill in which they are not included will meet the wishes of the Irish people."

559 Consideration of tenders for concreting & footpath Little Bray was postponed until next meeting.

560 Several letters were read in reference to closing of connections made by Mr Brady to Rivers in Edmundston Place and Novan, including an apology from Mr Brady who undertook to pay all costs incurred by the commissioners in the matter. On the motion of Mr McCormick, Mr Brady's apology and undertaking were accepted and it was ordered that the prosecution should not be proceeded with under the circumstances.

563 It was ordered that a special meeting of Finance Committee should be called for Tuesday 3rd May at 11 am to decide as to best course to be adopted in re Mr Keoh's costs.

564 Mr Blenketts motion in re roads through Queen Mauds estate was postponed until next meeting.

566 The Hon Sec of The Dublin Health Society, for a series of lectures under the auspices of the Society, granted at a reduced fee of 1/- per day.

567 Mr Clew McDowell wrote stating that he was executing sanitary works at Head View and Clifton Hill and that he found the water supply insufficient for want of a 2" main at the place. Ordered water inspector to lay 2" main as soon as possible.

568 Mr Bailey constable Town Hall wrote asking that his apartments should be painted, and papered. Ordered - To be done.

570 Mr James Harold submitted plans of houses on Bray Commons which were considered as not sufficiently explicit. Not approved.

541 It was proposed by Mr. Byrne seconded by Mr. McFarlands and adopted:

"That we beg to convey our sincere sympathy to Mrs. Richard Cuthbert in her bereavement caused by the death of her husband who had been a goods employer, an enterprising townman & for many years a member of this body". A copy to be sent to Mrs. Cuthbert."

Messrs Casey and Clay wrote stating that they would attend to the taxation of costs for sum £10-10-0 to £8-15-0 for Irish business (not to exceed latter sum) and £3-3-0 for taxation of Parliamentary costs in London.

Mr Langton proposed and Mr Coffey seconded:

"That the commissioners accept Messrs Casey and Clay's offer as per letter of 4th May 1892 for taxation of Mr Keoh's bills of costs and that they be instructed to proceed with taxation forthwith."

Passed unanimously.

576

The tenders for concreting of footpaths in Little Bay received on 25th April 1892 were reconsidered:— Meets cordially not having agreed to comply with terms of specification— It was proposed by Mr Langton and seconded by Mr Byrne.

"That the tender of Mr Thomas Doyle for concreting footpath in Little Bay for £94-16-0 be accepted."

Passed unanimously.

577

Mr Hayes wrote under date 6th May 1892 stating that he required payment of £210 for his report on Harbour Works. Ordered Town Clerk to reply in terms of previous order and letter.

578

Communications received from Engineers and Clerk of Works in re Harbour matters were read & referred to Harbour Committee.

579

Mr Keoh wrote asking that the Taxing Officer should be advised that Electrical Agreement was desired in duplicate. Ordered— Town Clerk to inform Mr Keoh that commissioners cannot interfere in the matter.

580

Mr Comber wrote enclosing plan of proposed shelters for esplanade. Ordered postponed for future consideration, Mr Comber to state probable cost of carrying out plans, furnished.

586

Mr Plunkett handed in a memorial signed by a large number of rate payers in favour of opening road from Gloucester Road to Moon Avenue.—

It was proposed by Mr Plunkett seconded by Mr Coffey and carried by majority—

"That we (this Board) are willing to take over

The road from Quinnsboro's road to Novara (via Mr McCormick's new house) on consideration that the Quin Estate straighten said road (to run towards Thipsmill ad hoc) and we will guarantee to them take the necessary steps to open said road to Novara Avenue."

Mr Hennessy gave notice that he would move at next meeting of the Board to have the foregoing resolutions rescinded.

The Estimates for current year (as per notice paper) were submitted by Town Clerk and considered:-

584 It was proposed by Mr Hennessy and seconded by Mr Laughton.

of the Board be appointed to consider statements submitted and make arrangements for consolidating loans &c".

589 Mr. J. Harolds wrote enclosing plans of a cottage he proposed building on Bray Commons. approved.

590 A letter was read from Mr O'Hanlon asking that he should be allowed to remain in house on Fair fees until following day, being one day beyond time given by the const for obtaining possession. Ordered Michael Doyle to be instructed to get up possession of house.

591 The Town Clerk was directed to advertise in Financial News and General Advertiser asking for tenders for rearing of site and powers of commissioners in re Promenade Field.

Pursuant to advertisement which was read the following tenders were received for letting of Ladies Baths from 1st June to 1st November 1892 viz:-

Claim and account submitted by Mrs Fitzgerald on account of 1890 contract were also considered.

It was proposed by Mr Hennessy and seconded by Mr M'Farland.

Passed unanimously.

It was proposed by Mr Hennessy and seconded by Mr O'Byrne:-

That the tender of Mrs Fitzgerald be accepted as £100 with £4-3-4 balance of old tender added on conditions that the Baths be kept open during the season from 6 am to 5 pm or for such other hours as the commissioners may from time to time arrange. Ladies lavatory to be kept open with an attendant until 9 PM every day, charge (not including bathers) not to exceed one penny. The commissioners will only accept responsibility for furniture or dresses which the order their effects."

Passed unanimously

It was decided that Messrs Rath Doyle (Powers Stables) and Nicholas Redmond (Main St) should be accepted as sureties and that Mr Craig should execute bond as Mr Fitzgerald's expense.

600 Notices issued of "Intention To Strike Rates" were submitted and read together with estimate and statement of rates:-

It was proposed by Mr Hennessy and seconded by Mr O'Byrne:-

"That the following rates be assessed on all rateable property within the Township of Bray for the year 1892 viz:- a Bray Township rate of one shilling and one penny in the £ for the purpose of defraying expenses in connection with the general expenses of the township

a rate of five pence in the pound for the purpose of defraying the expenses in connection with the supply of water to the Township and to be called the Bray Township water rate; a rate of two shillings in the pound to be called the Bray Township sinking fund rate for the purpose of defraying the sinking fund necessary to be provided for money borrowed and interest thereon. A sanitary rate of suspense in the pound for the purpose of defraying (Public Health Act) expenses connected with the sanitary purposes of the Townships; and Harbour rate of suspense in the pound for the purpose of paying interest on money raised under Bray Township act 1890 for building of Bray Harbour and purposes connected therewith. First moiety to be payable on 24th May 1892 and second moiety on 24th November 1892.'

Passed unanimously.

Before going resolution was entered in rate book & sealed & signed by Commissioners present:-

602 On the motion of Mr. Kennedy seconded by Mr. O'Byrne the Town Clerk was authorized to publish necessary notices, and to order all ratebooks, receipt books, notices, and posters required.

603 A letter having been read from Mr. F.J. Allen:-

Mr. Kennedy proposed & Capt. Parrotson seconded:-

"That the notice in reference to rates be published in Irish

Daily Independent."

(Passed).

There voted for the resolution's Capt. Parrotson messrs Kennedy, Mr. O'Byrne and the Chairman (4). Against Messrs Plunkett, Byrne, Durme and Coordan (4). The Chairman gave his casting vote in favour of the resolution and declared it carried.

It was ordered that the advt should also be published in the Freemans Journal, Irish Times and Mail.

Mr. O'Byrne gave notice that at next meeting he would move that the Rate Collector's paydays should be reduced by 2^d; and that a new board should be entered into for collection of current year's rates and confined to that warrant, also that sureties should not be members of the Board.
