transferring the payment of the rates from landlords to small tenants require to be amended, inasmuch as they work out to be a great injustice to the traders and shopkeepers of our towns, by exempting the landlords of small dwellings from payment of rates on those houses, and the occupiers thereof being unable to pay. The rates thereon are consequently returned as uncollectable, with the result that the amount thus short has to be carried to next assessment, and the rates on the shopkeepers thereby unjustly increased, by the unpaid taxes formerly and justly paid by the landlords of those houses.

We therefore confidently call on the Government to amend the Act so as to compel the landlords to pay the rates as before for all tenement houses of and under £x valuation, and thereby protect our struggling traders from this very gross injustice."
