"That, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government (Ireland) Act 1898 to 1902; the Bray Township Act 1866 to 1895; the Public Health (Ireland) Act; the Electric Lighting Act; the Technical Instruction Act 1889 to 1891; the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act 1889; the Public Parks Act 1869; the Housing of the Working Classes Act and other Acts and Orders incorporated here with or in force in the District, we hereby make the following rates or assessments to be levied on all rateable property within the said District for service of year ending 1st March 1906 viz:-"

A Bray Township Rate of Four Shillings Sixpence and Five Pence in the Pound, whereof One Shilling and ~~Four~~<sup>Four</sup> Pence is for the General and Sanitary Expenses of the District, under and pursuant to the Bray Township Act 1866 to 1895; Two Shillings and Five Pence is for Sanitary expenses under and pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 and for charges in respect of fees under the Public Health (Ireland) Act; the Housing of the Working Classes Act; the Electric Lighting Act &c. and the other Acts according the same; One Penny in the Pound is for technical and agricultural instruction, pursuant to the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act 1899, and the Technical

Act 1889 to 1891.  
A Rate of Fivepence in the  
Pound for the Purpose of defraying  
the expenses in Connection with  
the Water Supply of the District, to  
be called the Bray Township  
Water Rate, and of which Threepence  
is for Domestic Purposes and  
Two pence is for Public Purposes.

A Rate of Sixpence in the Pound  
to be called the Bray Township  
Sinking Fund Special Rate for the  
purpose of providing charge in  
the money borrowed and lent  
thereon.

A Bray Township Harbour Rate  
of six Pence in the Pound for the  
purpose of paying Interest &c on  
money raised under the provisions  
of the Bray Township Act 1890 and  
1895, for the Construction of Bray  
Harbour and Purposes connected  
therewith.

That the said Rates and arrears  
of Rates be payable in equal instalments,  
the first moiety and arrears forthwith  
and the second moiety on the 1st October 1905.
