and made at least self-supporting the rate for current will be increased to the maximum price laid down by Parliament in the Electric Lighting Order of 1896"

"That we, the Bray Urban District Council, having been satisfied, and having by our resolution of 29th July 1907 decided, that a prima facie case had been made out for the making of a Closing Order under Robt Haws Act 1904, and having published notice of intention to make said Order in the manner prescribed in the Regulations of the Govt. of Ireland under and pursuant to the said Act, and having issued Draft Order and considered objections received within four weeks from the date of publication of intention to make such Order, and that two-thirds of the Shopkeepers to be affected by it and being still satisfied that it is expedient to make a Closing Order, and that two-thirds of the Shopkeepers to be affected by it have approved hereof, by their signatures which have been duly verified, hereby, pursuant to the powers vested in us as local authority under the Act, make the following Closing Order:-

Whereas the Bray Urban District Council, as the Local Authority, are under and by virtue of the Shop Hours Act 1906 and the Shops Regulation Act 1892 to 1906, are empowered to make a Closing Order subject to approval and Confirmation as herein provided and, Whereas the said Council on the 29th day of July 1907 was satisfied that it was expedient to make the Order, and that the Proprietors of at least two-thirds of the number of Shops to be affected by such Order approved thereof, a Closing Order was made accordingly viz:-

Now we, the said Local Authority, being satisfied of the expediency of making a Closing Order as hereinafter provided and that the Proprietors of at least two-thirds of the number of Shops to be affected approve thereof, do hereby make a Closing Order pursuant to the aforesaid Statutes, to have effect within the Urban District of Bray in all cases in which the following Trades or any of them are carried on viz:-

The Trade of Drapers, Haberdashers, Cufffitters, Milliners, Boot and Shoe Dealers and Pawnbrokers, and we do hereby fix the hours of the several days of the week at which all the respective Shops in the above Classes shall be closed for serving of Customers viz:- On all Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursday and Fridays (except any of these days happen to be the Eve of a Public Holiday) the Closing hours shall be 7 P.M. and on all Saturdays and the eves of

Public Holidays as aforesaid the Closing Hours shall be 10 P.M.

This Order shall not apply to any of the seven working days immediately preceding Christmas Day, on which days the closing of the Businesses will be left entirely to the discretion of each Proprietor, and,

We do hereby prohibit the carrying on of any Retail Trade of Drapers, Haberdashers, Cufffitters, Milliners, Boot and Shoe Dealers and Pawnbrokers, after the said Closing Hours in any place not being a Shop within the Urban District.

Provided always that all Customers in Shops before or at Closing Hour may be served, and that in the case of emergency, such as an Accident or Mourning Order, the Customer may be served after Closing Hour, but not otherwise.

And we hereby authorize that the Order be sealed and forwarded to the Lord Lieutenant for Confirmation in the prescribed manner.
