to 1902, the Local Government Order thereunder, the Poor Law (Ireland) Acts, and the other Acts and Orders having reference thereto, and the Estimate of the County Wicklow County Council or Bray Urban District dated 24th February 1910, and in the manner prescribed or authorized in said Acts and Orders, we the Bray Urban District Council hereby make the following Poor Rate for the service of the Year ending 31st March 1911 to be levied on all rateable property within the Urban District of Bray viz:-

A General District Poor Rate of ^{one penny} two shillings and two pence ($2\frac{1}{2}$) in the £, whereof one penny in the £ is in respect of County Charges and Diocesan Rates in the £ is in respect of Union Charges.

That the said Rate shall be payable in two moieties on 29th March 1910 and 21st October 1910, and that notice of having struck said Rates be published as required by law.
