Dear Mr MacDonell,

I learned for the first time on opening your circular convening special meeting yesterday, which I only received late last night readdressed from Mount Temple here, of the deplorable accident at the Electricity Works. Following this I read with feelings of horror the details given in the Irish papers which had just arrived by the same post; these feelings I cannot express, as I think you know though opposed in many ways to the Works schemes I have really at heart a very deep interest in its welfare, and I would willingly do anything in my power that I honestly thought would be to its advantage.

At a time of this sort all differences of opinion are overshadowed by death and by the fact that those in our employ as a Council have been killed and seriously injured, all now placed in a position of trust. I assure you that had I been at home I would

have been on the spot at the earliest possible moment. I little thought when going round the works and having the Diesel Engine started for Mr Cowan's inspection a short week previously, that on that day week such a shocking accident would occur. Need I assure you that there is no member of the Board or Official of the Council could deplore this more than I do. I feel it all the more as one who took an active part in the installing of this particular machine.

I have wired you this morning formally expressing sympathy with you and all and assuring you that if I can be of any service at the works or to the Council or Ratepayers in this time of trouble and anxiety I shall willingly return home and take my part. meantime will you please assure the mourners, those injured and their relatives of my sincere sympathy with you and all. One touch of sorrow levels all opposition and differences of opinion, under the shadow of such a serious calamity I assure you no one could possibly feel this more than I do, as I write my thoughts and sympathies are in Bray and with those in trouble and sorrow.

The council decided to keep the report private until further order.

Mr Windle, on behalf of Messrs. Birles Buckton and Day, and Mr Gauthery on behalf of the National Boiler and General Insurance Co., attended and gave their views as to cause of accident.

Letters were read from the Norwich Fire Insurance Co., enclosing claim forms for completion in re accident.

Letters were also read from The Norwich Union, Hibernian, and Fine Art Insurance companies stating that no claim lay in re fire policies.

Staff) to receive during sickness and disablement not  
less than the following allowances on production of  
Medical Certificate:-

For four weeks	----- Full Pay.
For 26 weeks	----- Half Pay or at least 10/- per week.
For 22 weeks	----- Quarter Pay or at least 5/- per week.

And subsequently five shillings per week during disablement,  
such payment to be continued until recipient reaches 70  
years of age or obtains a pension.

The Council shall grant a sum equal to the "Capital Sum"  
referred to in Section 9 (4) of the National Insurance  
Act 1911, to any person leaving their service and becoming  
a member of an Approved Society.

The above terms are to apply to all persons on permanent  
staff deemed to be employed in manual labour, no matter what  
their rate of payment.

They shall apply to Probationary Employees during the term  
of their probation in like manner as if they were permanent  
employees.

No employee shall be paid during the first twenty-six weeks  
of sickness less than (in case of a man) ten shillings  
and (in case of a woman) seven shillings and sixpence per  
week, or during any subsequent period of sickness or disable-  
ment less than five shillings per week.

No person shall be bound to leave the employment of the  
Council compulsorily on marriage.

All the above terms, with the exception of the rate of sick  
pay, shall apply to the Clerical, Professional and Sanitary  
Staff (including Rate or other Collectors receiving less  
than £160 per annum) of the Council, such officers and  
professional assistants to be entitled to receive, as before,  
full pay during sickness.

And that application be made to the National Health Insurance  
Commission for exception under the above mentioned Schedule


