

A Bray Township Rate of Four Shillings and Sevenpence in the pound whereof Two Shillings and Threepence is for the General and Sanitary Expenses of the District under and pursuant to the Bray Township Acts 1866 to 1895. Two Shillings and One penny in the pound is for Sanitary and other Expenses under and pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Acts; the Public Parks Act 1869, and the Open Spaces

Acts 1877 to 1890; and for charges in respect of loans under the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, the Housing of the Working Classes Acts, the Electric Lighting Acts, etc., and the Act amending or extending same. One penny in the pound is for Technical Instruction pursuant to the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act 1899, and the Technical Instruction Acts 1889 to 1891. One penny in the pound is for Expenses pursuant to the Public Libraries Act; and one penny in the pound is for Expenses of Advertising the District pursuant to the Health Boards and Watering Places (Ireland) Act 1909.

A Rate of Fivepence in the pound for the purpose of defraying the Expenses in connection with the Water Supply of the District to be called the Bray Township Water Rate, and of which Threepence is for Domestic and Two pence is for Public purposes. A Rate of Tenpence in the pound to be called the Bray Township Sinking Fund Special Rate for the purpose of providing charges in respect of money borrowed and interest thereon. A Bray Township Harbours Rate of Tenpence in the pound for the purpose of paying interest etc., on money raised under the provisions of the Bray Township Act 1890 to 1895 for the construction of Bray Harbour and purposes connected therewith.

That the said Rates and Arrears of Rates be payable in two months, the first month and arrears forthwith, and the second month on the 1st October 1913.

There voted (for) Councillors Reigh, O'Carroll, Doyle, Dempsey, Mackay, O'keel, Rooney, Byrne, Haynor, Mages, (Against) Councillors Bradshaw, Scannell, Moran and Bergin, (4).
