"A rate of sixpence in the pound is for the purpose of defraying expenses in connection with the water supply of the District to be called the Bray Township Water Rate, and of which three pence is for domestic and three pence for public purposes.

"A rate of ten pence in the pound to be called the Bray Township Sinking Fund Special Rate for the purpose of providing charges in re money borrowed and for the interest thereon.

"A Bray Township Harbour Rate of one shilling in the pound for the purpose of paying interest etc. on money raised under the provisions of the Bray Township Acts 1890 to 1895 for the construction of Bray Harbour and purposes connected therewith.
