vernment to him, and the sums repaid to the Collector of Excise, to be as follow : viz.—We find that the late Treasurer has received from Government £ 52,726. 11s. 8d. that he has repaid to the Collector of Excise up to this period £ 26,973. 3s. 9½d.—that a sum of £ 3706. 10s. 9d. is unpaid to the Treasurer, through the default of some of the Barony Collectors—that a further sum of £ 986. 4s. 1d. has been advanced by the Treasurer (out of money that ought to have been paid to the Collector) to the Contractors of the Mail Coach line of road, and that a further sum of £ 4204. 5s. 11d. was omitted to be raised at Spring Assizes 1813,—and find that a sum of £ 3000. is now payable to the Collector by the present Treasurer—all these sums making together the sum of £ 38,870. 4s. 6½d. which sum corresponds with the sum stated to be claimed and payable to the Collectors of Excise—and we further find, that a sum of £ 1076. heretofore presented, has not yet been advanced by Government.

WM. PARNELL.

WE present the sum of £ 6132. to be raised off the County at Large in twelve equal installments, for the purpose of finishing the new line of Eastern Mail Coach Road from Dublin to Wexford, between Rathnew and Gorey, through the towns of Rathdrum and Arklow, the first installment, being a sum of £ 511. to be levied and raised immediately after the present Assizes, and one installment after each succeeding assizes, until the whole be raised and paid, as directed at Summer Assizes.

☞ The sum of 31l. 11s. 5d. of the foregoing presentment to be paid to William Parnell, Esq. to make a battery to defend Rathdrum bridge from the floods on the Mail Coach Road—and 100l. 8s. 7d. to G. M. Drought, to repair the road from Rathnew to Glaneley—900l. to Wm. Parnell for the road from Glaneley to the bridge of Rathdrum—1100l. to D. M. King, for the road between Rathdrum bridge and the Meetings bridge,—and 4000l. to Hon. G. L. Proby, and the Rev. James Symes jointly, for the road from the Meetings bridge to the bounds of the County of Wexford. This presentment to be in lieu of one passed last Assizes.

WE appoint the Hon. G. L. Proby, an additional Overseer of the mail coach road from Newbridge to Arklow, with the Rev. James Symes, to whom the money is to be paid in equal proportions.

WE appoint Messrs. King, Hoey, Eccles and Drought, to be a Committee to enquire into the conduct of Mr. Duncan M'Intosh, as overseer of the new line of mail coach road, and they are desired to report at next assizes.

WE present that the Overseers of the mail coach road between the Slaney and the bounds of the County of Dublin, be at liberty to pay out of the saving, to Donald Ross, the proportion of his salary for nine months that he was employed over and above the two years for which he was originally engaged.

WE present the sum of £ 5865. 13s. to be raised off the County at Large by twelve equal installments, commencing at Lent Assizes 1820, to be expended on the Western Mail Coach Road, in the proportion mentioned in the estimate, but not until a presentment shall be passed in the County of Dublin to the bounds of the County of Wicklow.

WE appoint Mr. Drought, Rev. James Symes, Mr. Greene, Mr. King, Mr. Chritchley, Colonel Howard, and Mr. Parnell, to be a Committee, to report on the new line of road, and scite of a new bridge at Ballymanus, and the opening of the new line is desired to be suspended, till the said Committee report on it, and the said Committee report on the bridge, and new line of road at the rere of Mr. Tate's house.

AS it is desirable to have Accounting Affidavits more particular than they have hitherto been, and to introduce uniformity in the wages paid for public works, and to encourage task-work wherever practicable, we recommend no Accounting or Supervisor's Affidavits to be hereafter passed, where there is not particularly stated the quantity and kind of work done on each town-land, and in what months, and the distance and places from whence any materials shall be brought, and the number of hours worked on each day, where men and horses are charged by the day;—and that no higher rates than the following, will be hereafter allowed in the Half Baronies of Shillelagh and Upper Talbotstown.

In the months of November, December, January, and February, for each day, not less than seven hours—for Men 10d.—for Horses 2s.

For the other eight months, each day, having ten hours work over and above the time taken for breakfast and dinner—for Men 1s. 1d.—for Horses 2s. 6d.

TASK WORK.

1. For every hundred and a quarter weight* of gravel stones filled and drawn any distance not exceeding a quarter of a mile, the sum of—one Farthing
2. Where it exceeds one quarter, and does not pass three quarters of a mile—one Halfpenny.
3. Where the distance is more than three quarters, and less than a mile—three Farthings.
4. Where drawn more than a mile—one Penny
5. Where above a mile and a quarter—one Penny Farthing.
6. Where the distance (an hundred and a quarter weight is drawn) shall be above a mile and a half, and not exceeding two miles, there may be charged—three Halfpence.
7. And for every additional half mile, a Farthing to be added.

* Note, a Bushel 9½ Inches Deep, and 16½ Square, holds about One Hundred and a Quarter weight of Gravel.
