RESOLUTIONS

OF THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

Resolved—That all certificates for repairing sudden damages be henceforth lodged in the Secretary's Office, at least three clear days before the Assizes, great confusion having arisen from the contrary practice being pursued.

Resolved—That no Presentment will, in future, be made in aid of any Infirmary or Fever Hospital, unless the same shall be accompanied by the account and accurate list of subscribers' names, and the amount severally subscribed by them.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That the space within the Bar in the Grand Jury Room be strictly reserved for the use of the Grand Jury and the Officers of the County connected with the duties of the Grand Jury, and that all others be kept beyond the Bar, unless specially introduced.

Resolved—That in future, if any subject of complaint should exist, or if any charge is preferred against the County Surveyor, or other County Officer, such complaint or charge shall be made specially in writing on the first day of the Assizes, evidence of the facts shall be afforded in the consideration of the same, and that Notice of the intention to prefer such complaint shall be previously given to the party complained of.

Resolved—That we recommend the Coroners to employ the Dispensary Physicians, whenever it may be necessary to call in a medical man, and to pay them a fee of £1 1s. for each attendance.

W. W. F. HUME, M.P., Foreman.

Resolved—That in future, all tenders postponed to the assizes, if not lodged with the Secretary the day before the commencement of the Fiscal Business, will not be entertained by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That in future the several High-Constables shall be required to furnish the amounts of their respective insolvencies every two years, pursuant to 6 & 7 Wm. iv., cap. 116, sec. 149.

Resolved—That the County Printer shall be required to have the "Schedule of Applications," previous to each Assizes, printed and ready for distribution, within fourteen days from the day on which the copy of same is given to him by the Secretary; and that he shall have the "Abstract of Presentments," after each Assizes, printed within twenty-one days after he receives the materials for same from the County Treasurer.

Resolved—That in future any party who, having duly entered into a Contract, shall sell, transfer, or dispose of it to another, such contract shall upon proof thereof be declared "null and void" by the Grand Jury, and the money levied for it shall be re-presented to the credit of the County or Barony, where the fraud has been committed.

RESOLVED,—That, it having been represented by the County Surveyor that considerable damage has recently been caused to some of the County Roads by Traction Engines, it be referred to the solicitor of the Grand Jury to examine the Acts relating to the use of such Engines, and, in conjunction with the County Surveyor, to take such steps as may be necessary for the protection of the public roads.

RESOLVED—That, if from any cause the sums payable on any contract remain undischarged for two successive half-years, such sums be re-presented to the credit of the county or barony, as the case may be, without delay, unless special reason for not doing so be shown to the satisfaction of the Grand Jury.

RESOLVED—That, in future no new contract for any works or roads shall be entered into or entertained, unless all money levied for the previous contract has been previously discharged, or is approved of, or ordered to be re-presented.

RESOLVED—That with the view to avoiding the expense of unnecessary Printing, all obsolete or revoked resolutions be omitted from the Abstract.

Spring, 1883.

GEORGE HODSON, Bart., Foreman.

RESOLVED—That the Court Keepers, Official Managers of Reformatories, and all others whose claims for payment have to be brought before the Grand Jury at Assizes, be requested to furnish their several accounts to the Secretary to the Grand Jury, on or before the 15th of February and the 15th of June, in each year, in order that they may be entered in the printed Schedule, and that no account or claim be submitted to the Grand Jury unless this direction has been complied with.

RESOLVED—That in future the Schedule do only contain the new works, and such matters as should, in due course, come before the Grand Jury at each Assizes, and that the "existing contracts" be omitted from the Schedule, but that all county works be printed in the Abstract, which should be made as complete as possible.

RESOLVED—That, in order to entitle the Solicitor to the Grand Jury to payment for the High Constables' Bonds, he shall have them registered and returned to the Secretary, within one calendar month from date of receiving same from him for that purpose.

RESOLVED—That the attention of Magistrates and Cesspayers at Adjourned Sessions should be again called to the great importance of enquiring most particularly into the solvency of sureties, and also to ascertain that their property be such that the amount of their bonds can be recovered without difficulty, in the event of the contractor failing to fulfil his obligations. And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

GEORGE HODSON Bart, Foreman.

Resolved—That the provisions of the Grand Jury Act, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., cap 116, be strictly adhered to in respect to the applications for payment to be made by contractors to and at the respective Presentment Sessions. All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to

the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

Resolved—That the coroners' accounts be now received and sent to the sub-committee, but that the coroners shall now take notice that if their accounts are not in future sent to the Secretary ten clear days before the Assizes, he is not to receive them.

Summer, 1885.

Resolved—That the attention of the Barony Cess Collectors be called to the necessity of giving in to the Treasurer's Office, at least two days before the first day of every Assizes, the amount of the assessments collected by them, as required by their warrants, and by 4 Geo. IV., cap. 33, sec. 7, as their fees will not in future be allowed till this be complied with.

Resolved—That the Court-keeper be instructed in future to see that the Grand Jury are properly supplied with blotting and writing paper for their use on each day they sit, whether for fiscal or criminal business.

Resolved—That it be a direction of this Grand Jury to their Secretary that he shall in future keep a record of all resolutions passed in a minute book, and that the Foreman sign such minutes.

Resolved—That the County Presentment Sessions should require that the accounts of the County Infirmary and the several Fever Hospitals be audited by a competent person.

Spring, 1888.

C. G. TOTTENHAM, Foreman.

Resolved—That a committee of the Grand Jury, consisting of Colonel R. Pratt Saunders, Lieut.-Colonel Tighe, and W. R. Bulwer be appointed, who, in case of any difference between County Surveyor and Tramway Company, shall decide as to what may be reasonable requirements in accordance with the report of the committee adopted by the Grand Jury at this Assizes. The Tramway Company undertake to carry out what this committee may direct, and failing their so doing the committee are here by empowered to direct such legal proceedings to be taken as they may think desirable.

Resolved—That the Harbour Commissioners elected at Presentment Sessions be asked by the Secretary to the Grand Jury to draw up a report of the accounts of the Harbour Board for the information of the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes; that a Committee be appointed to examine it; and their report be printed in the Abstract, so that the Cesspayers of the guaranteeing Baronies may know something of the income and expenditure.

Resolved—That the Governors of the Richmond District Lunatic Asylum be requested to furnish to the Secretary of this Grand Jury before each

Spring Assizes the names of the lunatics charged to this county, with the Petty Sessions District from which they have respectively been committed, and the date of each committal, and the total number of patients in the asylum during the period for which the yearly charge is calculated.

C. G. TOTTENHAM, Foreman.

Resolved—That the accounts of the Blessington Steam Tramway guarantee tax be kept by the Secretary and Barony High Constable as distinct from the ordinary county cess, and that a book showing such account, with all its credits and debits, be laid upon the Grand Jury table on the first day of the Grand Jury meeting in each half-year.

Resolved—That a copy of the resolution as to Lower Talbotstown be sent to the High Constable, and he be ordered to make a separate return from time to time, when and as required by the Secretary, of the amounts collected for the guarantee, and informed that if he neglect to do so his fees will be stopped by the Grand Jury.

November 10th—A specimen of milk analysed for Miss Williams, French School, Bray, was under the average quality of pure milk.

November 7th—A most careful analyses failed to discover any poison in the viscera of a calf, the property of James Gower, Esq., Roundwood Park, Greystones.

November 12th—A specimen of milk analysed for Miss Williams, French School, Bray, was of good quality.

No. 1 was a very soft tolerably water; No. 2 was much the same; and No. 3 was pure and somewhat hard.

November 17th—A specimen of water analysed for Colonel Sweetenham, Enniskerry, had the following composition: One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 26.600; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.010; saline ammonia, 0.002; nitrous acid, none; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 1.093; equal to sodium chloride, 1.801; sulphuric acid, 2.880; equal to calcium sulphate, 4.000; hardness, 19.6°. This was a good water.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, a specimen of water was analysed, with the following results: One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 42.000; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.016; saline ammonia, 0.009; nitrous acid, trace; nitric acid, 1.323; chlorine, 3.876; equal to sodium chloride, 6.888; sulphuric acid, 10.800; equal to calcium sulphate, 15.000; hardness, 31.7°. A rather second rate water.

To spare the time of the Grand Jury, I have given only an epitome of the analyses of water; in the original reports, full details, chemical, microscopical and bacteriological, were given.

No articles of food, &c., were sent for analyses by the Constabulary, though in the neighbouring County of Wexford, many were sent, of which a large proportion were adulterated.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT
TO THE
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,
Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1897.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for renewals of road maintenance contracts and for special works, approved of at last December Baronial Sessions, may be classified as follows:—

22 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
5 repairs of roads.
1 new road.
5 repairs of bridges.
2 new bridges.
8 gulleys.
4 fences and walls.
4 footpaths.
0 miscellaneous works.

Total, 60

I shall here only refer to the following works; but am prepared to afford any necessary information that may be desired with regard to the others as they come before you for consideration.

In Arklow barony the chief application is for widening Arklow bridge by an overhanging footpath, £850. Half on the barony and half on the county at large. This work having been frequently under discussion during the last three years does not now require any comment from me, except that it is now open for tenders.

Another important application in this barony, although only for a permissive presentment, is for diverting the present county road along the convent wall in Wicklow, in order that part of the ground on which the present road stands may be added to the convent lands.

The proposal cannot be properly understood without reference to the plan, from which it will be seen that it is proposed to reduce the present fair green to nearly half its present area, to compensate for which a new fair green is to be formed on the west side of new road. The new road will be in continuation of New-street, and the road from Kilmartin Hill is to be diverted across the present fair green to it. The Town's Commissioners of Wicklow were fully represented at the Presentment Sessions and highly approved of the proposed work. Looking at the proposal simply as to its effect on the county roads it would be better to leave them as they are.

Arklow Nos. 75 and 76—To pave and flag footpaths in Arklow, together £149 9s, half of which is to be contributed by the Town's Commissioners. Both are useful works.

North Ballinacor, No 43—To rebuild Boleyhorrigan bridge, £450. Half on the county at large. This work is now again open for tenders.

South Ballinacor, No 57—To repair the footbridge and paved ford on the road from Rathdangan to Ballingule, £21. This bridge and ford are at the bounds between the baronies of South Ballinacor and Upper Talbotstown. Applications were duly brought before the Road Sessions for each barony for a moiety of the amount. Upper Talbotstown disallowed the application and South Ballinacor allowed the whole sum. It has hitherto been held that where a work is situated in two baronies each bears half the cost.

Rathdown No 42—To keep in repair for 5 years 82 perches of road, known as Church Lane, Greystones, at 3s per perch. This road not having previously been under presentment was properly brought forward as a new road, a map being lodged and notices served. The map indicates that the road is to be widened to an uniform width of 18 feet, and section 55 of the Grand Jury Act limits the least width of a new road to 16 feet.

The present lane is very narrow, only 10, 11 and 12 feet wide in places. The Presentment Sessions, however, changed the application for a new road to that for an ordinary maintenance contract, making no provision for widening.

Upper Talbotstown No 67—To repair Gibstown bridge, £70. This is a necessary work.

Upper Talbotstown No 68—To rebuild the gullet in Stratford-on-Slaney, £20. This work, which has been before you previously, is not required for county purposes; but for the drainage of the lands above it.

Upper Talbotstown No 70—To flag and curb a footpath in Church-street, Baltinglass, £38. This is a desirable work of improvement.

Lower Talbotstown No 71—In this case as the road commences at a gate across it, ends in a bog and has no house along it, it would not appear to be a proper case for maintenance by the county.

I have to report that part of the Blessington and Poulaphuca line still remains uncurbed as mentioned in previous reports. On 16th January the contractor wrote to me stating he intended having it done; but on the 8th inst., when I last inspected the place, nothing was done. I think it would be right that notice should be served on the Company by your solicitor, and that if not done within a reasonable time, that he should take legal proceedings in the matter.

I have examined the plans deposited by the Dublin, Wicklow and Wexford Railway Company for their proposed connecting railway between Shillelagh and Scarawalsh, and find that only two public roads will be interfered with in this county. One at Shillelagh bridge and that at Balisland bridge. In each case it is proposed to carry the road over the railway by bridges with embanked approaches having gradients of 1 in 20 in each direction. In each case part of the proposed embankment will be over the existing bridge. At Shillelagh, where the thoroughfare is an important one, the existing bridge is narrower than the road on each side, and is not sufficiently strong to carry the increased load. It will, therefore, in my opinion, be necessary to reconstruct this bridge of the full width of the road and of sufficient dimensions for its new duty. Balisland bridge will require to be strengthened or partly rebuilt to enable it to carry the increased load.

The same Company also propose to divert their line further inland for over $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles measured northwards from the bridge, carrying the railway over the county road at Greystones. This will necessitate building a new bridge over the county road leading to Ennis's bridge; but it is not proposed to alter the level of this road.

Early in December last a serious breach occurred at Wingfield, on the Kileroney road. A sudden damage order for £50 was promptly signed and the work of repair was soon after completed in a satisfactory manner.

Mr Keating, assistant for the baronies of Arklow and North Ballinacor, having resigned his situation on 18th December last, I appointed Mr Thomas Little, of Rathdrum, in his place.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, EXISTING CONTRACTS, DISCHARGED & UNDISCHARGED QUERIES.

Committee—Major Gun Cuninghame, Colonel William Kemmis and Richard J. Hornidge, Esq.

1—County Surveyor's Report.—Rathdown No 42. This road having been brought forward as a new road, and a map lodged and notices served accordingly, the committee are of opinion that the presentment sessions could not deal with it as an existing road, particularly as it never had been upon the county. As a new road, according to the Act, it must in least width be 16 feet, and not being so, it would appear that the Grand Jury have no power to pass it. The presentment should, therefore, be thrown out. To pass such a presentment would, in the opinion of the committee, be a very dangerous precedent.

Lower Talbotstown, No 71. This application was thrown out upon a former occasion, and the committee think that it should be similarly treated now, the road not being necessary for county use.

With regard to the part remaining uncurbed on the Blessington and Poulaphuca line, the committee think that the Solicitor of Grand Jury should serve notice on the company, and if the work was not done within six weeks after he should take legal proceedings against the company. It is to be remembered that a good deal of trouble has been already gone through in getting the company to fulfil its obligations.

As to the proposed connection between Shillelagh and Scarawalsh, the committee understand that the secretary of the company has notified to the County Surveyor that the company will satisfy all reasonable requirements with regard to the reconstruction of Shillelagh bridge, and they suggest that the company be asked to give the same undertaking in regard to Balisland bridge.

Mr Kennedy, solicitor, on behalf of Mr Molony, executor of the late Andrew Caulfield, requested that the payment No 35 North Ballinacor be withheld, though expressly sanctioned by the said Mr Molony to be made to Myles Caulfield, and that the sum so withheld be now paid to himself.

Mr Toomey appeared before the committee with respect to presentments No 35 and 38 Newcastle, on behalf of the Wicklow Town Commissioners, who complain that the contractors have not fully carried out their obligations, but have left road scrapings heaped longer than should be, and thereby caused liquid mud to get into the water tables, as well as put residents to inconvenience and annoyance.

Mr Pansing, assistant county surveyor, has, however, undertaken that this defect shall be attended to, and shall not occur again.

With regard to the application (permissive) for altering present county road in Wicklow, the committee understand that in their absence the Grand Jury have dealt with it.

2—The Discharged and Undischarged Queries are correct.

We have struck out of some of the lists some items returned in arrear, and have directed the barony constables to endeavour to obtain payment of same.

Mr Wynne, Secretary of the Grand Jury, complains that Mr Boothman, High Constable, Barony of Lower Talbotstown, has not furnished him with the list of cesspayers, or lodged the whole of the county cess collected at the proper time.

As Mr Boothman has on several previous occasions been ordered to comply with the directions laid down, and has habitually neglected to do so, we think that serious notice should now be taken of his conduct.

Coroners' Accounts.—We have examined Mr Jones's accounts, which amount to £33 11s 6d, and we certify that sum as due to him.

We have also examined Mr Germaine's accounts, which amount to £39 11s 6d. We have deducted 4s errors in mileage, and have disallowed £3 0s 6d, amount claimed for printing and stationery, no account or voucher having been produced for same. We certify £37 6s as due to him.

Mr Germaine was unable to attend, being at present employed as a temporary Land Commissioner.

One inquest was held at Baltinglass by two magistrates, and a medical fee, £1 1s, was paid on same, which we certify as due to them.

Solicitor's Account.—We find the account of the Solicitor to the Grand Jury, amounting to £23 2s 6d, to be correct. A sum of £10 towards these costs has been already paid to Mr Browne, on his application, by the Arklow Town Commissioners, to be applied towards the costs incurred in bringing the case of the Arklow bridge, reserved by the Judge at Assizes, for the decision of the Judges in Dublin.

As this decision affects the whole of the county, we think the county should bear the entire of this charge, the total costs amounting to about £13, in connection with this case.

Public Analyst.—No report or account has been presented to us, and no presentment for salary appears in the present schedule.

We have read the letters from the Local Government Board and Sir Charles Cameron, which have been handed to us, and we beg to call attention to the letter from the Local Government Board to Mr Wynne, in which

they state that the Grand Jury had no power to dismiss Sir Charles Cameron, and that the Grand Jury were not entitled to proceed to advertise for another analyst.

It appears to us, therefore, that Sir Charles Cameron still occupies the position of Public Analyst to the Grand Jury, and is entitled to the usual half-year's salary, £12 10s. We think the whole question should be re-considered by the Grand Jury, as it appears to us doubtful if it is desirable to make any change in the present arrangement.

RESOLVED—That the Court Keepers, Official Managers of Reformatories, and all others whose claims for payment have to be brought before the Grand Jury at Assizes, be requested to furnish their several accounts to the Secretary to the Grand Jury, on or before the 15th of February and the 15th of June, in each year, in order that they may be entered in the printed Schedule, and that no account or claim be submitted to the Grand Jury unless this direction has been complied with.

RESOLVED—That in future the Schedule do only contain the new works, and such matters as should, in due course, come before the Grand Jury at each Assizes, and that the “existing contracts” be omitted from the Schedule, but that all county works be printed in the Abstract, which should be made as complete as possible.

RESOLVED—That, in order to entitle the Solicitor to the Grand Jury to payment for the High Constables’ Bonds, he shall have them registered and returned to the Secretary, within one calendar month from date of receiving same from him for that purpose.

RESOLVED—That the attention of Magistrates and Cesspayers at Adjourned Sessions should be again called to the great importance of enquiring most particularly into the solvency of sureties, and also to ascertain that their property be such that the amount of their bonds can be recovered without difficulty, in the event of the contractor failing to fulfil his obligations. And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

Resolved—That the provisions of the Grand Jury Act, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., cap 116, be strictly adhered to in respect to the applications for payment to be made by contractors to and at the respective Presentment Sessions. All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to

the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

Resolved—That the coroners’ accounts be now received and sent to the sub-committee, but that the coroners shall now take notice that if their accounts are not in future sent to the Secretary ten clear days before the Assizes, he is not to receive them.

Resolved—That the attention of the Barony Cess Collectors be called to the necessity of giving in to the Treasurer’s Office, at least two days before the first day of every Assizes, the amount of the assessments collected by them, as required by their warrants, and by 4 Geo. The Tramway Company undertake to carry out what this committee may direct, and failing their so doing the committee are here by empowered to direct such legal proceedings to be taken as they may think desirable.

Resolved—That the Harbour Commissioners elected at Presentment Sessions be asked by the Secretary to the Grand Jury to draw up a report of the accounts of the Harbour Board for the information of the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes; that a Committee be appointed to examine it; and their report be printed in the Abstract, so that the Cesspayers of the guaranteeing Baronies may know something of the income and expenditure.

The Coroner appeared by counsel and traversed the non-presentation. O'Brien, C. J., after consultation with Pallas, C. B., confirmed the finding of the Grand Jury, ruling that the words of the section quoted were mandatory, and a condition precedent to obtaining a presentment.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following last Spring Assizes, and I forward herewith an Abstract thereof certified and declared in the usual manner.

I have pleasure in repeating the favourable testimony hitherto borne as to the satisfactory manner in which the accounts continue to be kept.

I examined the security bonds of the High Constables; they appeared to be in order. Having regard to the report of the committee on Barony Constables' accounts referring to the High Constable of the barony of Lower Talbotstown, I was surprised to find that the amount of his fees had been paid apparently without any special order. I have informed the Secretary that should a similar state of things arise in future I would require evidence of the fact that the presentment had been specially slated, and payment thereof specially ordered.

An Exchequer Bond to the amount of £1,000 has been paid off since last account, and this sum, together with a sum of £500 similarly paid off some time ago, is lying on the current account in bank.

A sum also of £500 appears on the face of the account as having been lodged to secure the due execution of works for the alteration of the Kilmantin Hill Road.

I am disposed to think that the first-mentioned sums, amounting to £1,500, should either be invested for the benefit of the county, or, if expended, should be applied to works of a permanent character, as distinguished from ordinary maintenance; the latter item of £500 should, I think, be placed on deposit pending the execution of the works in respect of which it has been lodged as security.

January 18th—Strychnine was discovered in the viscera of a spaniel sent by A. Tailyour, Esq., J.P., Lamberton, Arklow.

March 16th—For Dr Raverty, Medical Officer of Health, Bray, 4 drugs were analysed—namely, tincture of gentian (compound), spirits of nitrous ether, rectified spirits of wine, and compound camphor liniment. The tincture of gentian was very slightly deficient in alcohol. The spirits of nitrous ether was of fairly good quality. The spirits of wine was free from methylated spirit and of correct strength. The compound camphor liniment contained less than one-third the proper amount of ammonia. As regards its other constituents, it was correct.

May 6th—On this date a specimen of milk analysed for Dr Raverty, Bray, was slightly over the average quality of pure milk.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 2 specimens of water were analysed, with the following results:

No. 1 was an inferior water, and No. 2 a good one.

For Rathdown Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 8 drugs and a specimen of water were analysed. The water had the following composition: One imperial gallon contained in grains— Total solid matters, 19·600; including albuminoid ammonia, 0·020; saline ammonia, 0·010; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 1·790; equal to sodium chloride, 2·950; sulphuric acid, none; equal to calcium sulphate, none.

This water was slightly polluted. In the original reports on this and other waters, full details of their analysis were given. One of the 8 drugs was slightly deficient in strength, the others were correct in strength, and free from adulteration. They were—Compound tincture of camphor, 2 specimens; compound tincture of lavender, tincture of perchloride of iron, tincture of henbane, tincture of opium, compound tincture of chloroform, and tincture of senega.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,
Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1897.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for public works approved of at last May Presentment Sessions and which will now be submitted for your consideration are for the usual works connected with the maintenance and improvement of the roads, bridges, &c., in the county. They may be classified as follows:—

- 26 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
- 1 new road.
- 3 repairs of bridges.
- 8 new gulleys and repairs of old ones.
- 9 recurring footpaths.
- 1 new bridge.
- 9 miscellaneous works.

Total, 57

I shall here only refer to the following works; but can give any necessary information with regard to the others as they come in order before you.

Arklow, No. 74.—To build a gullet on the road from Connary cross-roads to 3 roads at Knockanree Lower, £49 15s. This work was disallowed by the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes of last year. Its object is to bridge over a ford at the south end of the road, which is not an important one; but such works are useful.

Rathdown, No. 47.—To curb part of the footpath on the road between Bray Township bounds and Hollybrook gate, £84. This is a most useful work as the present footpath badly needs widening and re-curb-ing.

Rathdown, No. 49. To clear up the river courses above and below Kilmacanoge bridge, £11 10s. This work is not required for county purposes, and in my opinion should not be presented for.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 66. To repair Factory bridge, £126. This is a necessary work.

I have been requested by his Honour Judge Kane to provide some means of warming the court-house at Baltinglass, where no arrangement at present exists. I brought the matter before the last Presentment Sessions there for the purpose of eliciting the opinion of the justices thereon, when an adverse opinion was expressed to the proposal. I should therefore be glad to have your instructions in the matter. Should you order the work to be done, probably the best arrangement for doing so would be to remove the present cumbrous dock and to fix one of Musgrave's slow combustion stoves, where it now stands.

With regard to the non-completion of the Blessington and Poulaphuca Tramway, so often brought under your notice, I have to report that at my last inspection I found some progress had been made with the necessary work; but that it still remains incomplete.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1897.

Mr Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

I have made the usual annual inspection of the part of the line in the County Wicklow, also of the buildings, engines, rolling stock and plant.

With regard to the permanent way, while the ballasting is sufficient for the present, having been slightly added to during the past year, the line has a discreditable appearance from the large quantities of grass and weeds growing on it.

The fastenings of the rails have been improved and strengthened on part of the line; but this improvement should be continued over the rest with as little delay as possible.

Mile, half and quarter mile posts have also been provided; but they are of a temporary description.

The number of milesmen looking after the permanent way was decreased at the beginning of the year to a number which I consider is insufficient to keep the line in the order in which it should be kept.

Since my last report the rolling stock has been increased by a bogie wagon suitable for the carriage of long timber; but within the same period a wagon was destroyed by fire while lying at Brittas siding. I am informed an application for compensation from the County Dublin has been lodged by the Company.

The rolling stock continues to be well looked after. Engine No. 2 is at present undergoing repairs and engine No. 3 is being rebuilt with new boiler. All but two of the passenger cars have been repaired and repainted; but it is time that the engines were also repainted, as they have now a rather shabby appearance.

It would be desirable to extend the engine shed at Templeoge as at present it only holds five engines; but room for seven is necessary.

RATHDRUM AND GLENDALOUGH (SEVEN CHURCHES) LIGHT RAILWAY.

PRESENTMENT OF THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

WE, the Grand Jury for the County of Wicklow, assembled and empannelled at this Assizes, in and for the same County, do hereby present, approve, order, and direct, as follows, that is to say:—

That the Rathdrum and Glendalough (Seven Churches) Light Railway Company, Limited, shall be at liberty within a period of three years from the date of the Order of the Privy Council confirming this presentment, but not afterwards, to construct and afterwards maintain and work in the County of Wicklow, the Rathdrum and Glendalough (Seven Churches) Light Railway, which is described as passing from, through, or into the townlands of Corballis Lower, Corballis Upper, Rathdrum, Ballygannon, Cospse, Ballyhad Lower, Ballyhad Upper, in the parish of Rathdrum; the townlands of Knockrath Little, Knockrath Big, and Cullentra, in the parish of Knockrath; and the townlands of Derrybawn and Brockagh, in the parish of Derrylossary, and all in the County of Wicklow, in the directions and levels specified and described in the plans and sections, and Book of Reference deposited with the Secretary of the said Grand Jury.

That before the promoters shall make application to the Privy Council for confirmation of this presentment they shall enter into a binding agreement with the Dublin, Wicklow, and Wexford Railway Company for the working of the railway, and that such working shall be continuous during the whole of the year to the extent of at least two trains each way per day, and that a physical junction shall be constructed at Rathdrum so as to admit of exchange of goods traffic without transshipment.

That the line between the north end of the passenger approach to Rathdrum Railway Station and the Sentry Box cross-roads be carried on a raised platform continuously curbed.

That the present retaining and parapet walls be rebuilt and raised, and the road level raised between the latter point and the rectory gate, according to plans to be submitted to and approved of by the County Surveyor, so as to make the grade 1 in 20 instead of 1 in 11.

That between the Sentry Box cross-roads and the turn to the Seven Churches road the rails be of the grooved girder type, laid level with road surface, and the whole width of carriage way from kerb to kerb be paved with squared sets on a six-inch bed of concrete, and that such paving be hereafter kept in proper repair at the expense of the company.

That for the rest of the railway, the road for its full width between existing fences be not interfered with (except where the railway is shown on the deposited plans to be on "public road," at which places the road on the side opposite the railway is to be widened so as to have at least its present width exclusive of width of railway), and that either the present fence be left between the road and railway or another substituted for it of a description to be approved of by the County Surveyor.

That in all cases new bridges and culverts be built for the railway quite independent of the present road, bridges, and culverts.

That the plans of all such portions of the line as affect or may affect the county road or works shall be submitted to the County Surveyor, and approved by him before work is commenced on such portions of the line.

That the promoters shall contemporaneously with the lodgment of the deposit provided by the Tramways Act, of 1860, deposit in the names of Colonel C G Tottenham, Sir Robert Hudson, Bart., and Francis Gubbins, Esq, in the National Bank on deposit account bearing interest or invested in said names in approved trustee or court securities the sum of £1,500, which is to be retained until the line is opened for public traffic and the works affecting the county roads and works completed to the satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

That the Dublin, Wicklow and Wexford Railway before the meeting of the Privy Council shall give an undertaking that they will by the time the proposed railway is completed form junctions between the proposed line and their line at Rathdrum and between their line at Wicklow and the port of Wicklow so as to admit of through traffic without transshipment.

That the County Surveyor be paid by the promoters half the fees payable under the Order in Council for guaranteed lines laid on the public roads.

That the Grand Jury be represented before the Privy Council by counsel.
