SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

The Contractor will observe that the County Surveyor will give no notice of inspection, but will expect to find the road in perfect and thorough repair at any time he or his assistant may happen to visit it.

The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

2—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present working way; but in no case less than 18 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns and villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

SIDES.

3—The sides to be formed of sods or clay, at least two feet wide, and kept to the height of 5 inches over the watertables. These sides are to be kept neatly, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, the width to be increased with stones, sods, and clay.

WEEDS, HEDGES, TREES, ETC.

4—The spaces between the margins of the working way and the boundaries to be kept clear of weeds, loose stones, brambles, and all rubbish whatsoever.

The Contractor shall also cause injurious or obstructive hedges and trees to be cut or plashed.

DRAINAGE.

5—Watertables, outlets, side, back, and catch drains to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones formed where necessary.

Gulleys to be cleaned out and repaired when required. This drainage and the edging above described to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, beginning of April, and October, and at all other times as may be required.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

6—The roadway and watertables shall be scraped and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

The surface of the working way is to have a rounding from the centre to the sides of one inch per yard. Where the road has not at present this form it is to be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes carefully filled with fine metalling.

Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be repaired with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust. They are to be spread alternately at short intervals on each side of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 2 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well metalled over.

In no case will drills or small patches be allowed. All loose and rolling stones to be picked off.

Nine-tenths of the quantity of stones as given below to be spread during the late Autumn, Winter, and Spring, and one-tenth in wet weather in Summer and early Autumn.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

7—The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within two miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

8—There are to be supplied annually for the use of the road cubic yards of broken stone, or more if required, for its proper maintenance. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, before 1st October in each year. The heaps to be outside the working way.

Notice in writing of the delivery of the material to be served on the assistant for the district before 25th September in each year.

N.B.—When the contract is entered on at Spring Assizes sufficient material to be at once provided for the proper repair of the road, which quantity must be entirely independent of the regular annual supply.

WASTE STUFF.

9—All road scrapings, trimmings, etc., to be used for levelling the sides, repairing fences, etc., and the surplus carted off the road; but on no account are they to be left on the working way, or thrown on the sides.

COUNTY WORKS.

10—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

11—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained. Gravel paths to be repaired as follows:—

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled to be re-sodded, and the whole neatly trimmed to a fair line on inner and outer edges. Grass on sides to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair the outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ¾-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1½ inch per yard towards the road. All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, sunk or removed, to be renewed and re-set with new gratings of the original form.

RESOLUTIONS

OF THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

Resolved—That all certificates for repairing sudden damages be henceforth lodged in the Secretary's Office, at least three clear days before the Assizes, great confusion having arisen from the contrary practice being pursued.

Resolved—That no Presentment will, in future, be made in aid of any Infirmary or Fever Hospital, unless the same shall be accompanied by the account and accurate list of subscribers' names, and the amount severally subscribed by them.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

DUTIES OF THE FOREMAN.

Printed pursuant to the annexed order.

First—Call the names of the gentlemen comprising the Grand Jury.

Second—Examine all applications for Presentments in the following order, viz :

- First County at Large.
- Second Malicious Injuries.
- Third Barony of Talbotstown Upper.

Resolved—That the space within the Bar in the Grand Jury Room be strictly reserved for the use of the Grand Jury and the Officers of the County connected with the duties of the Grand Jury, and that all others be kept beyond the Bar, unless specially introduced.

Resolved—That in future, if any subject of complaint should exist, or if any charge is preferred against the County Surveyor, or other County Officer, such complaint or charge shall be made specially in writing on the first day of the Assizes, evidence of the facts shall be afforded in the consideration of the same, and that Notice of the intention to prefer such complaint shall be previously given to the party complained of.

Resolved—That we recommend the Coroners to employ the Dispensary Physicians, whenever it may be necessary to call in a medical man, and to pay them a fee of £1 1s. for each attendance.

Resolved—That in future, all tenders postponed to the assizes, if not lodged with the Secretary the day before the commencement of the Fiscal Business, will not be entertained by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That the attention of the several Baronial Collectors be called to the Presentment of the Grand Jury of Summer Assizes, 1854, requiring them to lodge the amount of their Warrant and perfect their Bonds on the first day of each Assizes ; and that should they fail in doing so, the Solicitor to the Grand Jury is hereby empowered to make his legal professional charge for performing same.

Resolved—That in future the several High-Constables shall be required to furnish the amounts of their respective insolvencies every two years, pursuant to 6 & 7 Wm. iv., cap. 116, sec. 149.

RESOLVED—That this Grand Jury having had before them the report of the County Surveyor, hereby strongly recommend to the Justices and Cess-payers at the Presenting Sessions the necessity of seeing that the Applications for Presentments be based upon a sufficient amount, and, they are further of opinion that the strongest inquiry be made in all cases, as to the competency of contractors and their sureties, so as to ensure a due performance of their obligations.

RESOLVED—That when roads under contract pass through towns and villages, the County Surveyor be directed to include, in future, the keeping of the street portions properly scraped, and the side channels kept clean, as part of the several contracts.

RESOLVED—That, on reading that portion of the Auditor's Report, calling upon the Grand Jury to enforce the Order in Council as well as the Resolution at Spring Assizes, 1879, requiring Barony Constables to lodge, with the Treasurer, all moneys collected at not longer intervals than one fortnight, or whenever such Collections shall amount to £100, this Grand Jury hereby direct the especial attention of the Barony Constables to the observance of such conditions, as well as to the necessity of furnishing the blocks of their books duly filled, in failure of which duty their re-appointment at ensuing Assizes is not likely to take place.

It is further ordered that a copy of the foregoing Resolution be sent to each Barony Constable within the county.

RESOLVED,—That, it having been represented by the County Surveyor that considerable damage has recently been caused to some of the County Roads by Traction Engines, it be referred to the solicitor of the Grand Jury to examine the Acts relating to the use of such Engines, and, in conjunction with the County Surveyor, to take such steps as may be necessary for the protection of the public roads.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have Audited the Accounts of the Secretary of the Jury of the County of Wicklow, following the last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the accompanying account duly declared and certified.

In my last report I called attention to the very large balance on the debit side of the account, which I stated was owing to the heavy demands on the funds of the county for the expenses of prosecutors and witnesses at the Winter Assizes.

Orders were issued on the Treasurer of the County Wicklow at those Assizes for payment of the expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, amounting to £1,516 19s 5d, of which sum £62 9s 6d only related to the criminal business of the County Wicklow, £1,454 9s 11d being expended in respect of the other counties in the Winter Assize.

The National Bank has charged the county with interest on the amount overdrawn, amounting to £19 18s 0d.

The recent order in Council of the 9th November last will prevent a recurrence of this state of things, but I think that in equity the County Wicklow ought not to be at the loss of this money, and I would suggest that the county be recouped this amount by the Government.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

(COPY).

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses during the half year ended on the 31st December, 1883:—

Two specimens of water were analysed for the Guardians of Rathdown Union, one was almost the most impure water that has ever come under my notice. Its chemical composition indicated extensive pollution with sewage or similar matters, and it had an offensive odour, due to the presence of sulphuretted hydrogen gas.

For the Medical Officer of Health, Gorey, a specimen of water was analysed. One Imperial gallon (70,000 grains) contained

The water was yellowish and turbid, and as its analyses shewed that it contained 0.37 grain of ammonia and $6\frac{3}{4}$ grains of nitric acid, it was evident that sewage and the products of sewage decomposition (nitrates and nitrites) were largely present, and that consequently the water was unfit for use.

Two waters from Barrenderry were analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union; one was of excellent quality, the other was extremely impure and was unfit for use.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,
ASSEMBLED AT SPRING ASSIZES, 1884.

Bray, 18th March, 1884.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN OF THE GRAND JURY,

The applications approved of at the Baronial Sessions, as set forth in the schedule before you, are, with a few exceptions, for the ordinary works of maintenance and repair of roads, for the repairs of bridges, gulleys and walls, together with some for new walls, gulleys, footpaths, and other special works, either useful or necessary. The total number is 118. They were duly advertised, and all but nine contracted for. These latter have been again advertised, and will come before you to let them by contract, give them in charge to the Surveyor, or reject them, as you may consider expedient.

The competition for these works appears, with some few exceptions, to have been confined within healthy limits. I shall note these exceptions as you come to them, and am of opinion, as the public will suffer no inconvenience from these few roads being without contractors until July next, that these contracts should be cancelled. In such cases, when contracts are let at prices very much under those allowed at Sessions, it is almost impossible to compel contractors to discharge their duties, as they naturally resort to every means to escape their obligations, which they can only fulfil at heavy loss to themselves. Applications for three important works were approved of at Sessions for first time, they are

1—The substitution of a permanent structure for the present Inchnagrush bridge, which is of timber and unsafe, over the Ow river, on the road from Sheeanamore to Aughavannagh, barony of South Ballinacor.

2—A sea wall at Greystones to check the encroachment of the sea towards the public road, barony of Rathdown.

3—A new road between Kilcommon bridge and Rosnastraw bridge, through the townlands of Mountpleasant and Coolroe, barony of Shillelagh.

These works are now merely to be certified, but if again passed at Sessions, must come before the next Grand Jury for final consideration.

I have, however, to inform you that Inchnagrush bridge is unsafe for traffic, and am of opinion that it would be desirable for you to instruct me to proceed with the work at once, under the 38th section of the Grand Jury Act.

Very few contractors have supplied their contract quantities of broken stones for their roads in time for measurement. The few roads on which the proper quantities have been supplied, are much improved.

Many of the roads suffered much damage, owing to the recent heavy rains, but until then the season was rather favourable than otherwise.

The contractor for the mail car road from Ballinacash to Mongnacool, South Ballinacor, abandoned his road. Proceedings were taken against him and his sureties, and a decree obtained for the amount of the bond.

Processes have also been issued against several defaulting contractors and their sureties, for next Quarter Sessions.

The traffic over several roads in the barony of Lower Talbotstown is considerably increased, owing to the drawing over them of heavy materials for the new railway. The contractors of the roads from Ballyknoekan quarries to Poulaphouca have made little effort to meet this traffic, and in consequence these roads are almost impassable, to the great inconvenience of the public. Proceedings have been instituted against these contractors and their sureties.

A subject of some importance has been discussed by some of the Grand Juries this month, namely, that it appears reasonable that Government should defray a portion of the cost of maintaining the mail car roads. In this county the length of roads over which mail cars run is 57 miles, the annual cost of which is £1,200.

The work contemplated at Burgage bridge, barony of Lower Talbotstown, has only been partially carried out, chiefly on account of the difficulties met with, owing to floods. £120 out of the presentment of £220 have been expended.

A bill is now passing through Parliament to enable the Great Southern and Western Railway Company to extend their railway, now in course of construction, from Baltinglass in this County to Tullow in the County Carlow.

This line will traverse your county for nearly three miles, and will affect the county roads as follows:—

The Tinoran road near its junction with Mill-street, Baltinglass, is to be closed, and a new road made between the Tinoran road and Belan-street.

All the traffic from Baltinglass in this direction will thus have to ascend a steep gradient of about 1 in 11, instead of, as at present, an easy incline of 1 in 22. This inconvenience could possibly be obviated by lowering the Tinoran road and crossing it on the level.

It is proposed to cross under the Irongrange road by diverting and lowering it. The gradients proposed for the approaches are 1 in 20 on each side. I am of opinion that a gradient of 1 in 30 should be given next Baltinglass, and a level approach on the other side. The present gradient of the road is 1 in 27.

It is proposed to cross under the road from Fortgranite to the county bounds at Yellowford by diverting and raising it. I can see no reason for diverting this road, and the approach on one side should be made level, instead of 1 in 20, as proposed.

I beg to submit a separate report on the proposed railway from Shillelagh to Newtownbarry.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO CONSIDER THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

The undersigned, having been appointed a Committee to examine and report on the statement for last half-year handed in by the County Surveyor, beg to report as follows:—

That the attention of Magistrates and Cesspayers at Adjourned Sessions, should be again called to the great importance of enquiring most particularly into the solvency of sureties, and also to ascertain that their property be such that the amount of their bonds can be recovered without difficulty, in the event of the contractor failing to fulfil his obligations.

And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

Owing to the very dangerous state of Inchnagrush bridge, in fact, it being, as reported by the County Surveyor, quite unsafe for traffic, we suggest that he be empowered to proceed under the 38th section of the Grand Jury Act.

The County Surveyor, acting as directed by the Grand Jury, has caused proceedings to be taken against several defaulting contractors, together with their sureties, and we would impress upon him the necessity of so acting in all cases where the contractors fail to carry out their obligations.

We fully endorse the suggestions of the County Surveyor with regard to the proposed alterations of roads, &c., by the proposed new line of railway from Baltinglass to Tullow, and we suggest that he be directed to lay same before the directors of the Great Southern and Western Railway, with a view to their being carried out as far as possible.

We consider it would be reasonable for Government to defray a portion of the cost of maintenance of the mail coach and car roads, as is the case in England, and that an application to this effect be forwarded to the proper authorities.

PRESENTMENT OF GRAND JURY OF COUNTY WICKLOW.

WHEREAS it is proposed by the Shillelagh and Newtownbarry Light Railway Co. (Limited), hereinafter called the Promoters, to construct, maintain, equip, and work a Light Railway from Shillelagh, in the County of Wicklow, through part of the County of Carlow, to Newtownbarry, in the County of Wexford, hereinafter called the Undertaking; And whereas it is proposed that the said Light Railway should run through the Barony of Shillelagh, in the County of Wicklow, and through the united Baronies of St. Mullin's Upper and Forth, in the County of Carlow, and through the Barony of Scarawalsh in the County of Wexford;

And whereas an application has been made by the Promoters to the Grand Juries of the Counties of Carlow and Wexford respectively to sanction the said Undertaking for the portion thereof running through the said Counties, and for a Presentment for the said portions, and which said applications have been granted, and whereas the Promoters have also obtained from the Grand Jury of the County of Wexford a Presentment and guarantee for constructing a line of Light Railway from Newtownbarry to Scarawalsh, in the County of Wexford;

Now we, the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, do present, approve, order, and direct as follows, that is to say—

First.—That the said Promoters shall be at liberty to construct, maintain, and work in the said County of Wicklow, the portion of the Light Railway from Shillelagh to Newtownbarry which it is proposed by the Promoters shall run through the said County of Wicklow, in the direction and according to the levels specified and described in the plans, books of reference, and sections deposited by the Promoters with the Secretary of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, provided, however, that if the Board of Works still require the alteration mentioned in the report of their Surveyor, W Smith, Esq., dated the 15th of February, 1884, to be made, then we approve of said Plans subject to such alteration. Second.—That a dividend at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum on a sum not exceeding £20,000, shall be guaranteed and paid half-yearly by the Barony of Shillelagh, on so much of the share capital of the Shillelagh and Newtownbarry Light Railway Co. (Limited), as relates to the said Undertaking, and is, for the time being, paid-up capital as defined by the Tramways and Public Companies (Ireland) Act, 1883, and the said Barony of Shillelagh shall become chargeable under the circumstances specified in the last mentioned Act, with the payment from time to time of such sum as may be required for completing, working, or maintaining the Undertaking. Provided, however, that the proportion of the said liability which the said Barony of Shillelagh, as between it and the said other Baronies, shall be bound to contribute in respect of such guarantee and charge as aforesaid, shall be in proportion to the following sums, viz:—the Barony of Scarawalsh, £14,000; the united Baronies of St. Mullens Upper and Forth, a sum of £8,000; and the Barony of Shillelagh a sum of £20,000. Third.—The said County of Wicklow shall be represented in the direction and supervision of the affairs and finances of the Promoters by a Director and by an Auditor, who may from time to time be appointed by the Presentment Sessions of the Barony of Shillelagh. Such auditor to be at liberty to inspect the books and accounts of the Promoters so far as they relate to the said Undertaking. Fourth.—Provided, however, that the said guarantee shall not come into operation until the Undertaking, and also the said line of Light Railway from Newtownbarry to Scarawalsh as aforesaid, shall have been constructed and open for Traffic, and the said guarantee shall continue for a period of 35 years from the date of the said opening and no longer. Fifth.—Provided also that the said guarantee shall not take effect or be operative unless and until the Promoters shall have duly entered into a contract with the D. W. and W. Railway Company to the following effect:—

1. That the said Railway Company shall at their own expense, for a period of 35 years from the date of the said opening, equip, maintain, and work the said Undertaking.
 2. That the said Railway Company shall half-yearly during the said period of 35 years pay to the Promoters one-half of the gross receipts of the said undertaking.
- Sixth.—Provided further that this guarantee shall not have effect or be binding unless within twelve months of the date of confirmation of this presentment by the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council, the articles of association of the Promoters' company shall have been duly altered, so as to require that the qualification for Directors of the said Company shall be the holding of not less than £400 in Shares or Stocks of the Company, and that such qualification shall continue during the same period of 35 years.
