property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING.

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least cubic yards a sufficient quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be re-sodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ¾-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1¼ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

COUNTY ANALYST.

Conditions under which the County Analyst performs Analyses.

1.—All articles sent to him by the Grand Jury, Boards of Guardians, Towns Commissioners, County Infirmery, County Coroner, and Magistrates sitting at Petty Sessions, to be analysed without any fee.

2.—Persons residing within the county to pay 10s. 6d. for the analysis of any article which it is suspected to be adulterated, the fee to be paid to the County Treasurer.

3.—Persons residing within the county to be entitled to have analysis made at the following reduced scale—about one-fourth of the usual fees—payable to County Analyst:—Analysis of water, oil cakes, and artificial manures, 10s.; analysis of the viscera of sheep, cows, and horses, for the detection of poison, 30s.; dogs' do., £1; analysis of soils, limestones, and ores, from 10s. to £3, according to nature of investigation.

Quantities required for analysis:—8 oz. of bread, flour, butter, whiskey, wine, beer, porter; 4 oz. of buttermilk, confections, cocoa, pepper; 2 oz. of new milk, tea, coffee, pepper, mustard; ½ gallon of water, in clean and, if possible, stopper bottles; ½ lb. of oil cakes and manures. In case of soil and ores analysis, quantities to be sent depend on nature of the investigation and may be ascertained on reference to the Analyst. The bodies of animals suspected to have been poisoned should not be sent; only their viscera.

RESOLUTIONS

OF THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

Resolved—That all certificates for repairing sudden damages be henceforth lodged in the Secretary's Office, at least three clear days before the Assizes, great confusion having arisen from the contrary practice being pursued.

Resolved—That no Presentment will, in future, be made in aid of any Infirmary or Fever Hospital, unless the same shall be accompanied by the account and accurate list of subscribers' names, and the amount severally subscribed by them.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That the space within the Bar in the Grand Jury Room be strictly reserved for the use of the Grand Jury and the Officers of the County connected with the duties of the Grand Jury, and that all others be kept beyond the Bar, unless specially introduced.

Resolved—That in future, if any subject of complaint should exist, or if any charge is preferred against the County Surveyor, or other County Officer, such complaint or charge shall be made specially in writing on the first day of the Assizes, evidence of the facts shall be afforded in the consideration of the same, and that Notice of the intention to prefer such complaint shall be previously given to the party complained of.

Resolved—That we recommend the Coroners to employ the Dispensary Physicians, whenever it may be necessary to call in a medical man, and to pay them a fee of £1 1s. for each attendance.

Resolved—That in future, all tenders postponed to the assizes, if not lodged with the Secretary the day before the commencement of the Fiscal Business, will not be entertained by the Grand Jury.

Spring, 1861. GEORGE HODSON, Bart., Foreman.

Resolved—That in future the several High-Constables shall be required to furnish the amounts of their respective insolvencies every two years, pursuant to 6 & 7 Wm. iv., cap. 116, sec. 149.

Summer, 1863. W. W. F. HUME, Foreman.

Resolved—That the County Printer shall be required to have the "Schedule of Applications," previous to each Assizes, printed and ready for distribution, within fourteen days from the day on which the copy of same is given to him by the Secretary; and that he shall have the "Abstract of Presentments," after each Assizes, printed within twenty-one days after he receives the materials for same from the County Treasurer.

RESOLVED,—That, it having been represented by the County Surveyor that considerable damage has recently been caused to some of the County Roads by Traction Engines, it be referred to the solicitor of the Grand Jury to examine the Acts relating to the use of such Engines, and, in conjunction with the County Surveyor, to take such steps as may be necessary for the protection of the public roads.

RESOLVED—That the attention of Magistrates and Cesspayers at Adjourned Sessions should be again called to the great importance of enquiring most particularly into the solvency of sureties, and also to ascertain that their property be such that the amount of their bonds can be recovered without difficulty, in the event of the contractor failing to fulfil his obligations. And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

Resolved—That the Grand Jury being aware that they are compelled to pass the presentment of £396 14s 9d sent in by the Constabulary authorities for the extra police drafted into Arklow upon Sundays, have done so; but in passing it they beg to protest in the strongest and most emphatic manner against this charge being made upon the County at Large. And they wish to point out that in consequence of the extra police required at Arklow being in a large measure drafted from other parts of the county, thereby denuding those county stations on Sundays of their police protection, that such districts should be exempted from any payment of this charge; and that in future, should extra police be required in Arklow on Sundays, that they should be drafted from the reserve, so that the expense of repressing the disturbances in Arklow might be at the option of the Grand Jury, charged on the disturbed locality itself.

Resolved—That the Grand Jury, having considered the report of Major-General Hutchinson, C.B., R.E., as to the proposed screen to be erected at Baltinglass, dated 11th July, 1891, are of opinion that the screen suggested by him would be insufficient; a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Board of Trade.

Resolved—That this Grand Jury consider it advisable that in future the close season for hares in the County of Wicklow extend from March 12th to August 12th in each year, both days exclusive; and that our Secretary be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

29,217—'91—Grand Jury.

7 ELTON PARK, SANDYCOVE, 1st July, 1891.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have audited the Accounts of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following last Spring Assizes, and to transmit the Secretary's account duly declared and certified.

The sum of £29 16s 8d paid to the Sub-sheriff as his expenses in connexion with the summoning of juries, &c., includes £14 9s 8d expenses incurred under the Criminal Law and Procedure Act, 1887. As, however, sec. 14 that Act directs that such expenses shall be paid out of moneys provided by Parliament, the County would appear to be entitled to be recouped those expenses by her Majesty's Government, or by the Sub-sheriff, in case he has received the amount from Government.

As regards the remaining portion—£15 7s, representing ordinary expenses, there have been conflicting decisions given by the Judges on the question as to whether section 16 of the Act 34 & 35 Vic, cap 65, included the expenses of sheriffs; but Lord Justice Fitzgibbon, after reviewing those decisions, held at the last Antrim Assizes that it was legal to allow "the actual outlay incurred by the sheriffs in the execution of the new duties imposed upon them by the Act."

The Sub-sheriff submitted to the Grand Jury proper receipts for the payments made by him, and it is to be presumed that the Grand Jury, in considering the claim of the Sub-sheriff, were satisfied that it was in accordance with section 16, relied on by the Lord Justice, and that the expenses of printing and other expenses charged were incurred in execution of those *new duties imposed by the Act.*

The accounts were prepared and presented for audit in a highly satisfactory manner.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analysis during the half-year ended on the 31st Dec., 1891:—

January 3rd—A specimen of tea was received from Sergeant Joyce, R.I.C., Dunlavin. It was found to be unadulterated. As tea is now examined in the bonded warehouses, by the Revenue chemists, it is rarely met with in an adulterated state.

20th January—A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union. It was rather unfavourably reported upon.

31st January—Dr Brady, Medical Officer of Health, Carnew, sent a specimen of water for analysis. It was found to be of good quality.

June 1st—Sergeant Hughes, R.I.C., of Bray, sent a specimen of butter for analysis; it was proved to be composed almost wholly of fats foreign to butter, prepared in imitation of the latter.

For Naas Union, which is in part situated in the County of Wicklow, two specimens of water were analysed. One was a second-class water, the other was largely polluted with sewage, and was utterly unfit for use.

The total number of analysis made was only six, whilst in the preceding half-year the number was 27.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,
Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1891.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications approved of at the recent Baronial Sessions, as set forth in the schedule before you, consist of—

- 42 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
- 3 bridge repairs.
- 2 new footpaths.
- 4 new gulleys.
- 3 new bridges.
- 1 widening and improving road.
- 5 walls and miscellaneous works.
- 11 permissive presentments for moving fences, &c.

Total 71

The road renewals represent in the aggregate a length of upwards of 80 miles.

A comparison of the new with the expiring contracts shows that—

In Arklow barony the average price of the four contracts taken up at Adjourned Sessions, a total length of $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles, is increased from 1s 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 1s 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d per perch per annum, or an increase of £36 8s per annum on these four contracts; but out of seven contracts to be tendered for at Adjourned Sessions three were not taken up, so that a proper comparison of the new and old average prices cannot yet be made. If, however, these three roads be now contracted for, even at the maximum prices allowed, the average price of the seven contracts, a total length of $12\frac{3}{4}$ miles, will be reduced from 2s 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 1s 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ d per perch per annum, representing a decrease £153 16s 10d per annum.

In North Ballinacor the price of $5\frac{1}{4}$ miles is reduced from 1s 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 1s, representing a decrease of £19 12s 8d per annum on two contracts.

In South Ballinacor only one road contract now expires. It was not contracted for at Adjourned Sessions.

In Newcastle the price of $20\frac{1}{4}$ miles is increased from about 1s 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 1s 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d, representing an increase of £9 2s 10d per annum on ten contracts.

In Rathdown the price of $4\frac{1}{4}$ miles is reduced from 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ d, representing a decrease of £6 8s 8d per annum on two contracts.

In Shillelagh barony no road maintenance contract now expires.

In Upper Talbotstown the price of $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles is increased from 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d to 11d, representing an increase of £24 17s 6d per annum on four contracts.

In Lower Talbotstown the price of $29\frac{1}{2}$ miles is increased from 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ d to 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d, representing an increase of £77 4s per annum on thirteen contracts.

The following are the only applications to which your particular attention need be called in this report:—

Arklow, No. 7—Since the Arklow quarry was opened the entire traffic from it, which is very heavy, has passed over this road; but as the price was reduced at last sessions, from 7s to 1s per perch, it was not con-

tracted for at Adjourned Sessions, and the only person now likely to tender for it would be a representative of the quarry owner.

North Ballinacor, No. 4—To build a protecting wall in Rathdrum, £60. This is to rebuild at the side of the public road an existing wall, which is in a somewhat dilapidated state, and to raise it to a height of 6ft over road level, so as to form a screen to the adjoining garden. It is for this reason that one-third of the sum is offered in aid by the owner of the adjoining property.

North Ballinacor, No. 5—To build a gullet in Rathdrum, £35. This will be a useful work, as it will enable the space now occupied by an open channel to be added to the present width of the road.

Shillelagh, No. 2—To widen and improve an old road, £162 16s 6d. This is a useful work, as it will afford accommodation to several residents along the road.

Shillelagh, No. 3—£140. This would also be a very useful work.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 6—To build a bridge over the stream in the townland of Cranareen, £140. This is to bridge over a small ford and should be carefully considered as the road is an unimportant one. It was certified at last assizes and now comes before you for final consideration.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 9—Wall at Balinglass, £100. The total length of wall to be repaired and raised is 710 yards. This work was before you at last Assizes, but was disallowed. It is now proposed to repair and raise 410 yards and leave the remaining 300 yards to be presented for at next Assizes. It is, in my opinion, a necessary work.

I may mention, in reference to this work, that I brought under the notice of the Great Southern and Western Railway Company the necessity of raising their boundary wall between the railway and road at the same place. As they refused to do so I referred the matter to the Board of Trade, who directed their inspecting officer, Major-General Hutchinson, to visit the place. This he did on 26th June last, when I met him on the ground and pointed out where accidents, one of which was fatal, have occurred. I have not yet seen his report.

Lower Talbotstown, Nos. 17 and 18—To repair Knockalt and Baltyboys bridges. These are necessary works.

Besides the above, there is an application for £200 to build a bridge, on the road from Rathdangan to Ballinguile, over the ford between the townlands of Drim and Toorboy, at the bounds of the baronies of Upper Talbotstown and South Ballinacor, £100 on each barony. This has now merely to be certified, as it must come up again at next Sessions and Assizes before being finally disposed of.

The works at Tinnehinch bridge, Rathdown barony, referred to in my last report, have now been modified so as not to injuriously affect the water way.

The work of constructing the Bray and Enniskerry Railway has been in progress for some time. As the line will run close to the county road between the Dargle bridge and Enniskerry, it will, probably, be necessary to construct screens for considerable lengths so as to obviate or lessen the danger arising from horses being frightened by the sight of passing trains. The Board of Trade in such cases certify what works they consider necessary in accordance with section 63 of the Railways' Clauses Act, 8 Vic., cap. 20.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1891.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

In compliance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I inspected the line, sidings and other works, and the engines, rolling stock and plant of this undertaking on the 8th and 9th inst., and found as follows:—

The only additional work done during the past year in this county is the lengthening of the siding at the Lamb to 52 yards and the providing of a small loading bank.

I consider that the line has not been sufficiently maintained during the past year. The rails, sleepers and fastenings are in good order; but the renewal of the ballast has not been properly attended to. Some ballast has been spread during the past year; but, in my opinion, only about two miles out of the five in this county are in sufficiently good order.

Proper attention is not paid to the cleaning, drainage and renewal of the ballast or the proper lifting and packing of the sleepers, all of which are essential to obtaining a good road and a fair average life from the permanent way materials.

This state of things appears to be borne out by the fact that the expenditure on maintenance of way and works for the year ended 30th June, 1891, was £126 17s 2d less than that for the previous year.

It would be far better to properly maintain the line than to show a small balance to the credit of the baronies if both these desirable ends cannot be attained.

The engines have been fairly looked after and all but one have had a general overhauling.

One of the four 3rd class carriages has been converted into a composite carriage (1st and 3rd class).

Two additional wagons have been hired with a view to ultimate purchase, and I understand that an engine more suitable for the goods traffic than those now in use is shortly to be delivered under a similar arrangement.

The rolling stock, including the two hired wagons, now consists of six engines, six composite carriages (1st and 3rd class), three 3rd class carriages, one 1st class carriage, eight cattle wagons, two covered wagons, two open wagons, and two break vans.

1, County Surveyor's Report.—Referring to the report of the Committee appointed at last Spring Assizes to consider the County Surveyor's report, it was therein stated that the increase of price in contracts was due to want of sufficient competition. In order to remedy this evil, which appears on the increase, and also to create a healthy competition, the Committee recommend that fresh contracts should be of smaller dimensions, the effect of which would be to allow of smaller tenant farmers tendering for them.

As to No. 3 Shillelagh, the Committee understand that the landlord will not grant permission to remove the trees in question, and therefore, the presentment cannot be made.

No. 9 Upper Talbotstown, this work would appear to be necessary. Nos. 17 and 18 Lower Talbotstown, the same remark applies.

With regard to the County Surveyor's report on the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway, the Committee consider that it would be well to call the attention of the directors to the points mentioned in the report.
