We also visited the houses in Summer Hill and recommend that Advertisements be issued by posters and a notice in a local paper calling for tenders for the construction of 150 yards of a nine inch pipe sewer down the east side of the Boundary wall of the back premises of Summer Hill to join the 12 inch pipe sewer in Castle Street opposite the gate way at O'Carroll's houses leaving six inch junction sockets opposite each house in Summer Hill and a nine inch skew junction socket opposite the space between Messrs Connor and Plants houses.

I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, relative to the proposal of the Wicklow Town Commissioners, the Urban Sanitary Authority, for the issue of Stock; and in reference thereto I am to state that the Local Government Board have prepared no preliminary forms, but if the Sanitary Authority desire to consolidate their existing debt and convert it into Stock, the Board will require a statement showing in respect of each loan

- A. The Act, Provisional Order, or Sanction (with date) authorising the borrowing
- B. The date of issue of each instalment of such loan.
- C. The amount of the instalment
- D. The rate of interest payable thereon
- E. The period within which the loan was to be repaid.
- F. The amount of each instalment now outstanding
- G. The compensation (if any) to be paid to lender for giving up existing security.
- H. The term of repayment unexpired.

The Local Government Board should also be informed of the method of repayment of the loans, whether on the annuity system or by equal

instalments of principal.

It would be well if the Sanitary Authority stated, (1) the amount of stock proposed to be created, (2) the rate of interest at which the stock is to be raised, (3) the period within which they desire that the stock should be redeemed or purchased and extinguished, (4) the period on the expiration of which the stock should become redeemable at par, and (5) whether they intend to compound for stamp duty on transfers of stock.

With regard to the question of receiving a deputation of the Sanitary Authority on the subject, the Board would be glad to be furnished, in the first instance, with particulars of the matters which the Sanitary Authority desire to place before them.

I am to add that full information respecting the creation of Stock under the Boards regulations was afforded by a representation (as the Board understand of the firm of Messrs Gray, Jardner & Co, who attended at this Office on behalf of the Wicklow Town Commissioners)

I respectfully beg to report that there are two cases of Typhoid Fever at present in your district, one is under treatment in Hospital and which does not belong to this Town, the outside case appears to be progressing favourably, but for this case your Town and District appears to be in fairly good health. —

The main drain from the catch pit that the County Authorities are after constructing in Main St Market-Square end, appears to be partly choked up, I would suggest to your Board that it be opened up and cleared. Gentlemen as the season of the year has approached for the lighting of the Town it will require your consideration.

I have been requested to draw your attention to the want of water for Sanitary purposes and to ask if you could allow the water

to be turned on between nine and ten o'clock pm for such use
