Sanitary Sub Officer's Report
 5th July 1921

I inspected 150 premises & served 3 notices under the Public Health Act for Sanitary purposes which were complied with, and had six premises lime-washed and supplied lime in each case. The usual flushing and disinfecting of the main drainage and drains on the South Quay has been carried out satisfactorily. During the month the main drainage in O'Brien's Lane got blocked and had to be opened up in a couple of lengths, and with the assistance of the Waterworks Overseer we got the obstruction removed.

Some persons are removing the stakes off the Sea Murrage. I had nine of the stakes replaced during the month. The railing along Bachelor's Walk is broken in several places as they are a danger to the public. I had the men engaged on the various roads as reported to the weekly Committee, and owing to the dry weather the roads have broken up in several places. The notices served on owners of land to trim their hedges have been complied with less in a couple of cases where the hedges are not bad. The fencing of the Commons field is completed with the exception of the second gate which is getting repaired.

6th Sept 1921

During the month I inspected 200 premises and served 3 notices under the Public Health Act for sanitary purposes which were complied with, and supplied lime to 10 persons for lime-washing. The flushing of the main drainage and disinfecting of the Jolly Taps and Urinals on the South Quay has been carried out during the month. Since the M. O. Health's Report on the Public Houses, one of the premises have complied with the Order and another premises is under completion. The following works require to be carried out:- (1) 2 Jolly Taps to be laid in water table at 8 Monkton Row, and 1 Jolly Trap to be laid in water table at 8 Strand Street. (2) That a new main drainage be laid at Bond Street to let the premises at Bond Street be put in Sanitary repair (3) That the Bridge at the top of the Brickfield Lane be made safe for loading Cars to cross to the dumping ground and remove the heavy car traffic off the lane to the Station Road. (4) That the wooden-balings along Bachelor's Walk be repaired as several of the standards and

Rails have broken down during the month.
 (5.) That the Iron railing along Leitrim Place be repaired and painted as the railing is in a bad state with rust (6) That a concrete Kerbing be laid at Gregory's Row, to remove the insanitary condition caused by water (7) That the rare gutters at the back of the Town Hall be repaired and the lead flashed around the pargett-pit Wall be cleaned as the rain water is coming through the Market Hall Ceiling (8) That a grating be replaced at Hill Side as the existing grate is worn out & dangerous.

During the month the Jolly Covers at the corners of New Street has been broken, and a Manhole Cover at Bachelors Walk thrown into the River. This is very dangerous to the public as they might fall into the holes when the covers are removed.
