

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report:- Inspected 100 premises and served two notices under the P. H. Act which were complied with, and had 3 premises lime-washed. Disinfected premises at Fitzwilliam Road and destroyed the bedding etc by order of M. O. Health. Urinals and Main Drainage have been flushed twice weekly. Had sewer at Bond St Cottages cleared. Recommend that water supply be put in the Yards of these Cottages.

The Council's men have been engaged during the month at the removal of the road material off the various roads. During the past week 20 extra men have been engaged at the Mill breaking stones, and on Dunbar Road trimming and widening water tables.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

1st August, 1922

Inspected over 100 premises and served 4 notices under P. H. Act. Three notices have been complied with one has not. By instructions of M. O. Health disinfected a cottage on Convent Road and had bedding destroyed. This cottages requires to be lime-washed before being occupied. The usual flushing of the main drainage and disinfecting of the Gully Traps and Urinals on the north and South Quays has been carried out weekly during the month. I have had the repairs done to Convent Road Cottages, Woodenbridge and Urinals on North Quay and South Quay and Street widened at the Mall turn. The Fire Hose was engaged at two fires which broke out on the mornings of 15th & 23rd July. The Council's men were engaged during the month cleaning up water tables and removing grass from same at Fair Green & Melancholy Lane, Ball Alley, Church St, Marlton Road; St Patrick's Road, and have had about 60 loads materials removed from Rocky Road to Inner Murrough. There is a large amount of road material on the Bunbur Road which requires to be removed and is dangerous to road traffic. The chain railing on the Sea Murrough is broken in several places and requires 6 stakes to replace old stakes along same. Two of the public Seats have been broken I had them removed to the Store.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

5th September, 1922.

Inspected 150 premises and served 3 notices under F. H. Act for various sanitary purposes which were complied with. The flushing of main drainage and disinfecting of Gully Traps and Urinals have been carried out. Lime was supplied to 15 premises for lime-washing. Repairs have been carried out to water-tables at Kilmartin Hill & Church Road.

Concrete floor has been constructed on Woodebridge. Gully Trap at Fitzwilliam Square has been connected with main drainage. During the month the men were engaged at the following work:- cleaning water tables on St. Patrick's Road; Station Road; Rathnew Road; Green Hill Road; and Brickfield Lane and had two stone posts erected at the end of the Brickfield Lane to stop car traffic along same. The roof of the old Boat House is in bad state owing to the slates having been gone. I wish the Council permission to have the public seats removed to the Store should the weather become bad.

Order:- Boat House to be repaired and floors painted. Public Seats to be removed if weather becomes bad.

Waterworks Overseer's Report:- Repaired leaks on Church Road & Murrough. Stand Pipes had to be removed from Filtering Beds as there was not sufficient water coming into the Beds to keep up supply to the Town.

No.1. Beds are now choked up with mud as a result of recent heavy rain stirring up mud in Reservoir it will be necessary to have dirty sand removed from these beds.

The trespass on Grazing Lands continues. I am keeping a record of the names of the offending parties with the view of prosecution later on. Two tenants have removed their sows. There is now only one sow consequently I am open to receive applications for the several vacancies. I have to complain that one Tenant is much in arrear and I can get no satisfaction from him with regard to payment. The same Tenant is also in arrear on Yard Space on Mirrough. He stated today he does not require it further. I request your direction to get legal assistance to take possession of Yard and to proceed for Rent due. Mr. Wunne, occupying cottage on Cross Roads complains of flooding after rain due to stoppage of shore at his back door. The matter requires immediate attention.

Mr. Fred Allen, gave great praise as to the manner in which the Scheme had been prepared and promised to do everything in his power to assist the Council in the project.

He pointed out that a great deal of procedure had to be gone through before the Ministry could give their sanction to the Order.

Messrs Tierney & Co, are preparing plans and specifications which will be ready in a fortnight. Your Solicitor is preparing the Order; and the Town Clerk is carrying out the necessary statutory rules and orders in connection with Electricity (Supply) Act 1919, so that in about a month's time we will be in a position to consider the tenders for the work.

We have learned that the price of Gas in Wicklow is higher than any other Town in Ireland and that there are only two other Towns which come near Wicklow that is to say 9/- & 10/- per 1,000, but there are reasons why these prices are charged.

We also understand that Messrs Anderson, has another works and the price they charge is 8/- per 1,000 and are able to pay a very good Dividend at this figure.

I wish to thank the Town Clerk, for his very able and clear statement to the Minister and for all the extra trouble which he has

taken in connection with the scheme, the success so far is attributed to his untiring energy which I trust he will have the reward by the installation of Electric Light in Wicklow by the end of the year.

Inspected 200 premises and served 4 notices under the P. H. Act for various sanitary purposes. 3 Notices have been complied with.

Supplied lime to 10 persons for lime washing. The flushing of the main drainage and the Urinals on North & South Quays have been carried out weekly. The Council's men were engaged at the following work:- Removing Rock and levelling Road at Fitzwilliam Rd; cleaning water tables and side-edging Marlton Road, Ballyarrin, Fair Green; Church Hill; Castle St and South Quay scraped. The footpath along Church Road requires about 5 loads of Gravel spread along same.

Two waggons of Fines & 3 waggons $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch Macadam is required. I wish the Council's permission to have the Stones spread on the Roads if the weather suits. Had the public seats removed from Piers and Murrough to storage. Had fountain in Main St repaired.

Order:- 3 Waggons of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Macadam and 2 Waggons of Footpath Fines be order when required.

Waterworks Overseer's Report

3rd October, 1922

Repaired leaks on Murrough; Kilmantin Hill & Church Hill. On Saturday 23rd Sept, the water almost stopped coming to the Town as there was not sufficient height of water in Reservoir to distribute over all compartments in Filtering Beds, with the result that the Filtering of the Town Supply was confined to one section of Beds. This

section got choked with mud, therefore water was unable to pass through sand quick enough to keep up supply to Town.

On Monday 25th I conveyed water from one bed to another by means of a Syphon thus ensuring supply of water to the Town again.

The recent rains increased streams supplying Reservoir very much.

Since curtailing of supply to Town as directed we gain about $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches of water almost every day. There is now about 2ft 9 ins of water in Reservoir. I asked permission from Mr Symes as ordered by Visiting Committee to have trees cut down that are obstructing. He will be pleased to give permission if necessary.

The frame of Boor on Valve House is in a bad way and wants repairing.

Order:- Boor Frame of Valve House to be repaired, and Trees removed.

Corporate Agent's Report

3rd October, 1922

I beg to report that I have taken up possession of two fields lately held by Mr Nolan. I found the fields fairly well fenced as Mr. Nolan was under agreement to keep them. The lower portion at back of Convent Road cottages is fenced with barbed wire and posts and requires supervision as they would be easily removed thus making a considerable opening to trespass. I have also

taken up possession of commons Field lately held by Mr. Geo Byrne, his period of letting (11 months) having expired on 30th Sept. Mr Byrne, wishes to renew his letting for another term. With regard to trespass on corporation Lands I can give you an assurance that it will shortly cease. There are repairs required to Window at John McGrainor's Strand Street and also to Grate at Patrick Bonnelly; Grate at B. Brien, Convent Road requires re-setting. I have to state there are arrears of Rent on some cottages and I would ask your direction with a view to recovery. The same applies to the Main Rental. I find in one case where an application for renewal of lease was granted the applicant has not proceeded with execution. I have had no application for weekly Grazing since last report.
