SUB SANITARY OFFICER'S REPORT

4th MARCH, 1924

Inspected 100 premises and served 3 notices which were complied with, and supplied lime to six premises for lime-washing. Disinfected one room and bedding in premises at Quarantine Hill by order of M. O. Health. The Main Drainage & Urinals were flushed weekly during the month. I beg to draw the Council's attention to the dangerous condition of Roof of Houses at Corner of Strand Street as several of the Slates are loose and require to be made secure, also the Roof of Premises at Main Street the Gable Gutters are falling down.

The Council's Men were engaged on the roads throughout the District side-dressing, trimming up hedges and water cuts. 150 feet Paling has been replaced in Brickfield Lane. Railing at Sea Murreugh has been

repaired. All material on the Inner Murreugh has been levelled off and rubbish carted away. Recommend that Grass seed be sown on Plot, and notices put up against dumping rubbish on the Murreugh.

Inspected over 100 premises, and served two notices which were complied with. Supplied lime to 12 Persons for limewashing which was carried out. The Main Drainage and Urinals were flushed weekly during the month. Had Main Drain in O'Brien's Lane properly flushed and cleared. Had loose stones taken off all roads and carted to Depot by the Council's men, and had water tables cleaned and all hanging briars cut on Ballyguile Road; Ballynerrin and Brickfield Lane. The men are at present side dressing Bunbur Road. If the water cart is required this Season some repairs must be carried out before it can be used. I wish permission to have Public Seats painted one coat.

I have to report that the Pound House which was let to Mr. Thomas Kelly at last Meeting is again vacant. On looking over the premises Mr. Kelly found it would not be suitable. As the Pound attached cannot be used it will be necessary to let it and house as soon as possible.

Mr. Bunn does not wish to certain Tenancy of Corporation Fields

You will require to renew the Lock on Gate to prevent trespass.

There are only two Grazing Tenants on Lands at present.

I have repeatedly drawn your attention to the accumulating Rent due on some holdings on the Estate. I think the matter should be put into the hands of your Solicitor without delay.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

6th May, 1924

Inspected 150 premises and served three notices two of which  
 has been complied with. Two Donkeys ~~had~~ died in the Pound and  
 had same buried. The Main Drainage and Urinals were flushed weekly  
 during the month. The sewer at the North Side of Woodenbridge  
 requires 4 lengths of new Pipes and a cement casing round the outer  
 end of same as the cement casing has been washed away by the tide.

The public seats have been painted and put out on both Piers and  
 Sea Murreugh for the Summer Season. The Tree on the footpath at  
 Fitzwilliam Square has been cut down leaving the butt of tree 4 inches  
 over footpath and is now dangerous to the public. I wish the Council's  
 instructions regarding same. The Council Men were engaged on the  
 different roads throughout the district trimming and siding dressing  
 roads. Had 12yds drainage laid at Upper Colley St. The Men are  
 engaged at present on Murreugh making new path to Cottages. Owing to  
 the heavy traffic on the Rathnew Road I require Waggon of 1/2" fines

to fill up holes along Road. I wish permission to lime wash the  
 Mall Wall for the Summer.

Medical Officer of Health's Report

6th May, 1924

I beg to submit my report for the 12 months ending 31st March  
 1924. The Sub Sanitary Officer performed his duties in a very  
 thorough and satisfactory manner.

The Water Supply & Sewerage are very good. Bairies,  
 Cowsheds & Milksheds are kept in good order. Domestic Scavenging  
 is very well done and the Town is kept remarkably clean.

I would point out the urgent need of proper housing accommo-  
 dation for the working classes. There are not sufficient houses  
 for their needs. Many of the existing houses being unfit for  
 human habitation.

There were 3 cases of infectious disease during the 12 months  
 otherwise the district has been very free from any infectious disease  
 a very satisfactory state of affairs. The births registered  
 during the 12 months were 66. The deaths registered during the  
 same period were 43.

Total number of Deaths 1 year and under 2; 5 years & upwards 4;  
 10 years 1; 20 years 4; 30 years 6; 40 years 5; 50 years 7; 60 years  
 7; 70 years 3; 80 years 3; 90 years 1.

From the table one can see that the infant mortality is very  
 small. The largest number of deaths occurred at the age of 70 year  
 the death being recorded at 90. I consider that this table in

itself shows the healthy condition of the Town during the last 12 months.
