There is now 16ft. 4ins., of water in the Reservoir, and I would ask permission to have a lot of dirty sand washed.

I had one of the Council's men at the Waterworks for a fortnight cleaning waterways and cutting hedges.

During the recent storm a number of slates were blown off the cottage roof, I put them on temporary myself, the chimney is now cracked all over and in imminent danger of falling down, (I reported this before).

The store used by men cleaning sand, etc., is broken past repair, could Council see their way to get some sort of a new one?

& Sutherland Holdings and hereunder I give you extracts from

Minutes and correspondence in the matter:-

6/11/25. Corporate Agent reported as follows:- I wish to ask you

the to let me have assistance of your Solicitor in the collection of

overdue rents, as the arrears are accumulating from year to year

and appears against me in my collection. I attended Special

Meeting called for Saturday last for the purpose of examining my

books but as you are aware the meeting fell through from insufficient attendance.

RESOLUTION:- That Mr J.H. McCarroll, Solicitor, be instructed to make application to Petty Sessions for possession of the following holdings viz:- Doolittle's South Quay, Sutherland Colley Street, and Hanlon's Upper Monkton Row.

Town Clerk wrote Mr McCarroll instructing him to obtain possession on behalf of the Council at next Petty Sessions of Hanlon and Sutherland Holdings.

11/3/25. Mr McCarroll, wrote acknowledging receipt of instructions and requesting to be supplied with particulars.

26/8/25. Letter from Mr. McCarroll, stating that he had obtained the two Decrees in ejectment for non payment of rent made by the Circuit Court Judge and requesting the Council's instructions.

The Sheriff's fees in executing these Decrees will amount to about \$11.

1/9/25 Read letter from Mr McCarroll, Solicitor, re taking over possession of Hanlon and Sutherland Holdings.

RESOLUTION:- That Messrs Lalor, Nichols, & Everett interview the tenants with a view of handing over possession to the Council and report to the Council as to the advisability of granting a new lease

to the Tenants.

This Committee never met to interview the tenants.

14/12/26 Mr McCarroll wrote to the Chairman stating referring to our ~~last~~ interview today I herewith enclose you copy of my letter to Messrs R. McNamara & Co, Solicitors, for the representatives of John Hanlon of the 14th December last, copy of their replies of the 15th and 20th December and copy of my letter to them of the 17th December.

14/12/26 Mr McCarroll wrote Messrs McNamara & Co., stating he had an interview with the Chairman of the Urban District Council and provided that the sum of £27 : 15 : 6 is paid to him forthwith he would be prepared to advise the Council to consent to the redemption of these premises and restore the representatives of John Hanlon back in the original possession.

15/12/26 Letter from Messrs McNamara to Mr McCarroll, stating we thank the Urban Council for nothing. The terms they offer are compulsory under the Act of Parliament. We have offered to pay the rent we are not instructed to recognise their Decrees.

Our Client was not served with them and we are advised that the Council's proceedings are irregular they had full knowledge to whom the Landlord was and we have had several letters from them.

17/12/26 Letter from Mr McCarroll to Messrs McNamara & Co., stating the proceedings were perfectly regular.

20/12/26 Letter from Messrs McNamara & Co., to Mr McCarroll stating that they were prepared to pay the amount of rent but not the costs.

On 4th March and 26th April, 1927, Town Clerk made application to Messrs McNamara, for payment of rent and costs but received no reply to any of his communications.

22/9/27. Letter from Mr McCarroll, stating that Mrs Sutherland, the Lessee died and the name and address of her next-of-kin has not been ascertained. I made several inquiries, but without result, and if the name and address of the person entitled to the Lessee's interest is supplied to me Ejectment proceedings can be instituted.

27/9/27 Letter from Mr McCarroll, stating that he had been altogether unable to trace the Representatives of Mrs Sutherland.

3/10/27 Letter from Mr McCarroll, stating he had an official communication from the Superintendent Civic Guards, Bray, to the effect that a Miss Sutherland, resides at Sandcourt Lodge, Bray, whose mother died recently, but she did not own any house property. There was another Miss Sutherland, who formerly resided at 2, Brennan's Terrace, Bray, but who does not reside there now and her present address cannot be ascertained or when she is likely to return.

4/11/27 Letter from Mr McCarroll, stating he had a letter from Superintendent Casserley, Bray, to the effect that Miss Sutherland returned yesterday to No. 2, Brennan's Terrace, Bray, and on

being interviewed by one of the Guards she stated that her mother died three years ago and that she never had any house property in Wicklow.


ELECTRICAL ENGINEER'S REPORT.
