I. That the water for supplying the town be taken direct from the Reservoir without passing through the filters until the latter are cleaned and purified.

II. That the filtering and clean water chambers be thoroughly cleaned out, washed with water and twice white-washed with hot lime. The filtering material to be removed, and a fresh supply of sand and gravel well washed to be laid down to the depth of two feet, which is the greatest depth available owing to the construction of the chambers. The water supplying the town to be then passed through the filters downwards instead of upwards as at present.

III. That the weeds and other vegetable matter be removed from the Reservoir and the two small streams leading thereto, and that a spit of earth along the sloping banks be removed between low water and one yard beyond high water line. It would be advisable to increase the area of the Reservoir at the same time. The vegetable organic matter is lessened by exposure to atmospheric oxidation in lakes

And that a scour valve be placed on the main at Bachelors' walk, and another at the North end of the Militia Barracks.

V. That the leak in the embankment at the South end of the retaining wall be stopped.

VI. And I beg further to recommend in order to prevent as far as possible any such breakdown again occurring that new filter beds be constructed between the foot of the embankment and the caretaker's cottage. The site named will give the additional advantage of securing the greater part of

the water from the springs near the foot of the slope, which at present runs to waste down the glen. In order to do this it will be necessary to lay down about 834 yards of 4-inch cast iron main along the Marlton Glen to join the existing main near the bridge on the Marlton Road, as the present main which goes round by Potash lane is at too high a level to suit the site of the new filter beds. About 1,800 yards of the present cast iron 8-inch main would be made void, and it might be taken up and disposed of towards defraying the cost of the works.

With reference to your letter of the 26<sup>th</sup> Inst and enclosure on the subject of non-acceptance of office by a Member of the Wicklow Urban District Council within the prescribed time, I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to state that, as provided by article 9 (2) of the Schedule to the Local Government (Application of Enactments) Order 1898, that if there is no Bye Law determining fines, the fine for non-acceptance of office within the prescribed time in the case of an Urban District Councillor shall be £ 25, and article 9 (4) provides that a fine payable under this Article shall be recoverable on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction. Nothing in the Article however, renders a person elected or chosen without his consent to his nomination being previously obtained liable to pay a fine on non-acceptance of office. The persons exempt under this section are:—(a) any person disabled by lunacy or imbecility of mind, or by deafness, blindness, or other permanent infirmity of body, and (B) any person who being above the age of 65 years, or having within five years before the day of his election either served the Office or paid the fine for non-acceptance thereof, claims exemption within five days after notice of his election: =
