Our Waterworks Committee met this Evening and after
 consulting with Mr. Pansing and Mr. O'Connor have directed
 that no more fresh water be used on the streets for the present
 and that salt-water be used = We have directed your
 Town Clerk to prepare a circular cautioning persons against
 wasting water by using a hose on the streets, washing vehicles,
 defective taps, closets, fountains, and watering gardens.

We have given directions to John Herseer to make his
 annual inspection at once and any person neglecting
 or refusing to have their taps, closets &c, put in order
 after due notice that they be summoned = We have
 given directions to Mr. O'Connor to have a close watch on
 the filters and if they show any indication of not working
 properly, that the clean filters be started and a few inches
 of sand taken from the one at present in work and replaced
 by clean sand, this will obviate the necessity of washing
 the sand during the dry season = We have directed
 your Town Clerk to order the fittings required by Mr.
 O'Connor for fountains = With regard to source
 of supply at Ashton Side we have directed that as
 soon as the water goes down the work to be carried out.

Gentlemen //

In accordance with your instructions I have the Plans specifications and Estimate, in course of preparation, for the Strand St and Ball Alley Sewers, also, the revised plans of the Main St. Sewer. I hope to have all ready in a few days when the application for the Loan can be made: = With reference to the state of the Sewer in Wentworth Place, reported on by your Medical Officer of Health, I had it opened, and examined it, accompanied by your Sub-Sanitary Officer: It is an old gullet of the usual description with the walls undermined. It does not seem to be doing its work as a Sanitary Sewer, for which it is quite unfit; and I would recommend that a new pipe Sewer be constructed, the cost of which should also be included in the application for the Loan: = With reference to the additional Cowl valves for the water supply, it might be as well to defer them for the present, as the water is now perfectly clear: =

The work of erecting the railing on the Murrough is now proceeding satisfactorily, and is nearly completed =

I have been asked to have the open grates at the Grand Hotel trapped, or its position changed. This is a necessary work, as the opening at present acts as a ventilator for a number of sewers, and its close proximity to the Hotel is very objectionable = Doyle's contract for levelling the Murrough is completed, and the other works ordered at your last Meeting have also been carried out = As regards the depot for Town refuse, I don't think you could have a more suitable place than the pits recently made on the Murrough by the removal of the gravel: = As the machinery for putting the law in motion to compel the owners of the poor Lane to repair it is of a complicated nature, and would entail some expense, it might be as well if the Council spent a small sum in levelling it up, and afterwards get the householders to keep it clean =

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made usual sanitary inspections visiting over two hundred premises and served fifty notices for limewashing and other sanitary matters: = I had repairs and examinations done to drainage on ten occasions: = I had two patients charged to Fever Hospital in the Ambulance Van and disinfected one house: = Last month attention was directed to the Scavenging of the Streets, I find it my duty to do so again as the streets, catch pits and gratings of the Town were very indifferently attended, in fact the question of having those catch pits and gratings kept clear is a serious matter: = It is my opinion that one Scavenger is not sufficient to clean the streets and lanes ways of the Town. Dr. Elwin Local Government Board Inspector visited here on the 14th May and he suggested to me to apply to your Council for an extra Scavenger: = On Saturday evening last a portion of a drain in Abbey St broke down which will require your consideration = Now as to the refuse depots I am unable at present to suggest a suitable place = The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary matters =

Gentlemen

The Contract-roads in the District, with a few exceptions have been fairly maintained; but the gravel on the footways has become loosened to such an extent that they are scarcely fit to walk on, I would suggest that they be watered occasionally during the dry weather, as the Council cannot see its way to carry out my previous recommendation to concrete them. In no other town with any pretensions towards improvement would such antiquated footpaths be allowed to exist. -

The wooden footbridge is gradually rotting away for want of repairs and painting. This I also suggested before:

A considerable time ago hoardings were erected, in accordance with the Statute, during the progress of some buildings in High Street, and on St. Patrick's Road. As the work at these buildings has been stopped for several weeks, and is not at present going on. I would ask the Council to have the boards removed as required by the 34th Section of 53 and 54 Vic caps 59 as they are an obstruction to the thoroughfares: - In a previous report I called attention to the necessity of having two carriages on the Town, but without success. They are very much required at the present time, as most of the streets are coated with something like dried pulverized stable manure -

Mr. Sheane has now completed his Contract for the revoicing on the Murrough in a satisfactory manner: - Mr. Cowan M. Inst. C. E., Chief Engineering Inspector to the Local Government Board visited and inspected the Murrough Improvement works on 25th Inst. He complained of the bad quality of the soil spread thereon. Otherwise he seemed to think the works were fairly well carried out, but strongly expressed his disapproval of the Council making large deviations from the lodged plans for this and other works in the Township, as the loans are given for the specific purpose for which the plans are originally lodged with the Local Government Board -

At the risk of my opinion being again questioned by some members of the Council, I would not be discharging my duty as your Engineer if I did not impress on the Board the absolute necessity of putting a stop to the removal of gravel from the Murrough before it is too late, and having the holes

already made filled up, otherwise the outer bank will be swept away with the first heavy seas, and the vacancy filled up with portion of your property north of the excavations.

If the Council have any doubt about this they should at once get expert advice: = I append certificates for the road contracts amounting to £ 91. 16. 11 deferring payment on two contracts and striking out a quarters pay on one =

The term of the Contract for the repairs and maintenance of 224 perches of the main road from Wicklow to Rathnew, between the culvert-at-Marlton turn and the bounds of the Urban District-at-Ballymeny, will expire on 23rd instant. So that it will be necessary at this meeting to make provision for its renewal, and to advertise for tenders to be considered at an adjourned meeting of the Council which must be held for that purpose inside of 14 days. I would recommend that a five years contract be now passed at 6/- per perch per annum.

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made usual Sanitary inspections visiting over one hundred and fifty premises and served less notices under the Sanitary Acts for Sanitary requirements. —

According to instructions I had on different occasions the main drains of the Town disinfested. I had examinations and repairs done to drains and water channels on eight occasions = On the 2nd October 1899 I called attention to the flushing chamber of drainage Strand St, I would now ask the Council to have the order that was then made carried out, as the old supply pipe appears to have got broken or damaged in the bed of the river. — Your Gentlemen as to the Scavenging of the Streets I have nothing further to add to my report of last month = During the connecting of a house drain into the main sewer in Bridge St I found it in a filthy and apparently unworkable condition and about ten inches of accumulation in it, it is a two foot square drain = On Sunday morning the 23rd June it was reported to me that a house was on fire in Main St, I had the fire apparatus conveyed to the place with as little delay as possible and am glad to say succeeded in putting out the fire =

Your Gentlemen it is a considerable time since the Town

Hall was cleaned, besides there are some window frames and sashes that are rotten and will require to be renewed

The Notice Board on the Murragh relative to trespassers is worn out, I would suggest that one be provided =

The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some Sanitary Subjects =
