Gentlemen

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month the public lighting of the town was well maintained - the cleaning of the streets was fairly well attended but there is room for improvement.

An application has been made to me for the erection of water closets in the Wesleyan Congregation premises Bay View Terrace, the nearest drainage is in Dispensary Lane a distance of about 40 yards, it is a question for your Council's consideration this distance = I would draw attention to a lane or passage way between some houses in Strand Street and the gas company's premises, it is in a bad state and would require to be filled with quarry waste or some other muddings.

I will feel obliged for directions to have the Promenades, public seats and bathing boxes put in order between this and the 1st of May, so that I may have them ready for the approaching

season. I made usual sanitary inspections visiting over 170 premises and served 10 notices as required by statute for different sanitary requirements. I had drains repaired and cleaned on five occasions. The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects :-

Gentlemen

I have the honour to report that I have audited the accounts of the Wicklow Urban District for the financial year ended 31st March 1902, and I forward herewith two copies of the abstract duly certified:

The rates levied for the period were £ 110³ in respect of general town purposes and £ 12 3¹/₄ in the £ for Poor Rate. The sums lodged on account of the latter include £ 396 arrears which the former collector had failed to lodge before the close of the previous year:

The collection of Town Rate and Water Rents was carried out in a satisfactory manner. The Council's income from water rents, as I pointed out in previous year reports, has been greatly reduced in consequence of a resolution passed by the Council, that traders be exempt from these charges, notably

so that the meters which had been supplied a short time previously at considerable cost are now lying unused. - It is inequitable that Traders, who use large quantities of water for other than domestic purposes, should be supplied at the expense of private residents and the poorer class of Ratepayers. -

The Council would act prudently if they now reconsider the matter. I would point out that the Ratepayers have power to proceed under section 5 (1) of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1896 and demand that the Council charge for all water used for other than domestic purposes: - The collection of rents from Corporate Estate and artisans dwellings was carried out most efficiently. It is essential that a separate account should be kept for receipts and expenditure of Loans, on these transactions might pass through the capital account but should not in any case be merged with revenue. It affords me pleasure to state that the books and Accounts evince much care and accuracy in their preparation and reflect credit on Mr. Wth Mc Phail the Clerk of the Council.

Waterworks Committee's Report.

Your Waterworks Committee visited the Waterworks on May 20th and inspected one set of filters which had been working a shorter time than usual but had done their work most thoroughly. The sand for about 2½ inches on the upper surface was being taken off washed below, and put back again, on an examination of the solid matter retained by the sand in the filters we found that 75% was principally clayey material, and 25% organic matter principally of vegetable growth, and from its appearance and behaviour this is the class of impurity which passed into the water mains through defective filtration a few years ago, and gave trouble. The shorter period of working of the filters is the result of an exceptionally large amount of solids which had to be taken out and most likely resulting from the washings of the heavy rains previously. We have therefore pleasure in reporting that the stock of water was plentiful, well filtered and pure, and that the works are in good order =
