Sgentlemen

Accompanied by Mr. Doyle S. S. O. I examined the drain into which the sewage of "Verington" Friars Hill House and the Parsonage discharges causing the nuisance reported to the Council by the Medical Officer of Health, and the only way to remedy the matter permanently, is to lay about 370 yards of pipe sewer to a small septic tank which could be constructed in one of the fields near the Railway gates at the foot of Church Hill, discharging the liquified sewage into the open drain where the tide flows and ebbs, along the Eastern side of the Railway Road. This of course would be a costly work, but I see no other way of abating the nuisance, except to compel the owners of the above premises to construct proper cesspools. = The Contractor for the new sewer is making satisfactory progress with his work. The Market Square and Quarantine still sewers are now practically completed, and the excavation for the Maragh sewer commenced. All the house drains should now be properly connected with the new sewer by the Owners = Mr. Pausing =

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made my usual Sanitary inspections inspecting over 140 premises and served 10 notices under the Public Health Act for different Sanitary purposes: —

I had drains and water ways repaired and cleaned in four occasions. By directions of your present and late Chairman I had some repairs done to the Street-Monkton Row, Castle St, I got the rocks hacked away and the surface filled over with hard quarry waste and then broken, for a distance of about forty five yards by eleven, the work was very necessary. — The street-cleaner was attending to his business

An application has been made to me by a householder on Church Stile for to construct drainage from the premises and as there is no system of drainage in that neighbourhood I could not see my way to grant what was requested. The public lighting of the Town but for a few exceptions was well maintained. — The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects: —

At a meeting of the Urban District Council and Town Commissioners of Wicklow, being the Sanitary Authority of the Urban Sanitary District of Wicklow, specially convened for the purpose, to be held on the 16th day of February, 1904, the following resolution will be proposed:

Resolved—That we, the Urban District Council and Town Commissioners of Wicklow, being the Sanitary Authority of the Urban Sanitary District of the Town of Wicklow, at a meeting of our body convened for the purpose, and holden in the Town Hall, Wicklow, on Tuesday, 16th day of February, 1904, at the hour of 12 o'clock, noon, resolved first:—

"That with the consent of the Local Government Board for Ireland, and subject to the regulations of that Board prescribed under the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, and pursuant to Consent Order Number 36,899 (dated 15th October, 1903), we, the said Urban District Council and Town Commissioners of Wicklow, do hereby in exercise of our powers create Stock to be called the Wicklow Town 3<sup>4</sup>/4 per Cent. Redeemable Debenture Stock, and to be issued to an amount which shall be sufficient for the following purposes:—

(a) For raising the following sums (amounting in the aggregate to the sum of £2,044, which has not been raised), viz.:—

(1) For construction of sewers in Main street, Bridge Street, Mall, Strand street, and South quay, including ventilating shaft and stench traps	£1,100 0 0
(2) Construction of sewers in Ball Alley, Wentworth place, and Colley street	944 0 0
	Say £2,150 Stock.

(b) And that the Wicklow Town Redeemable Debenture Stock be from time to time or forthwith issued to realise the amount of £2,044, together with the expenses of the issuing of aforesaid Stock, which shall:—

(a) Bear interest at the rate of £3 5s. per cent. per annum on the nominal amount of such Stock, payable by equal half-yearly dividends on the 1st July and on 1st day of January in each year, the 1st of such dividends (for such amount as may have been previously allotted and paid for) to be paid on the 1st day of July, 1904.

(b) Be issued at not less than £96 per cent., that is to say—£96 for every nominal amount of £100 Stock.

(c) Be redeemable at par; that is to say: at the rate of £100 for every nominal amount of £100 Stock on the 15th day of December, 1957, or at the option of the Urban District Council and Town Commissioners of Wicklow on or after the 15th day of December, 1922.
