Parts of some of the Contract Roads are in a rather worn and lumpy condition and in some cases have not had proper attention paid to them during the past quarter

As you have arranged to take over all the roads and Streets from the Contractors to day, it will be

necessary to at once make provision as regard, labour, cartage and materials for the maintenance of these public works - There are altogether about nine miles of road in the District, which at this season must be properly kept, cleaned up, grass and weeds cut and rolling stones constantly removed. Recently one man has been doing this work on the roads already, in hands, at 5/- per day including labour and cartage. It will now be necessary to employ a labourer also. A supply of pit or river gravel should also be obtained to keep any nets filled which may occur in the dry weather - The parapets of the Stone Bridge should be repaired without further delay, and there are some more rotten planks in the Wooden Bridge requiring renewal.

As the Contractor for the new sewers had some delay in obtaining the remainder of the iron work and the tides not having fallen sufficiently low to enable him to complete the low water outfall, I cannot certify for the full completion of the works at this meeting, consequently the period of maintenance does not yet commence.

I furnished your Agent with a ground plan, showing areas and measurements of the building plot on which it is proposed to erect the Technical Schools. The persons intending to build this School must give 14 days notice in writing to the Council, accompanied by a plan and description of its construction.

Gentlemen // Respectfully beg to report that during the month ending this day I made usual Sanitary visitations inspecting over ninety premises and served nine notices under the Sanitary Acts for different purposes. I had drains repaired on four occasions. The drainage from a well in what is known as the Well Field Monkton Row has got partly blocked thereby causing the water to break into a premises in Castle St, I would suggest that it be piped into the main drain in Castle St - By directions of your Chairman I had four concrete basins provided for the drainage of four water fountains, Strand St, Bath Street Quarantine Hill and Castle St. As directed I forwarded samples of water to Sir Charles Cameron for analysis.

The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. I have received during the month two shillings and six pence for trespass on Murrough, with your permission I will hand this to your Labourer. The Street-Cleaner was attentive to his business: -

Tramway Scheme

Your Committee appointed to consider the Tramway Scheme met this morning on the North Quay, and with the assistance of the Town Surgeon examined the Quays and the proposed route projected for tramways, and decided that as proposed it would interfere considerably with vessels being loaded or discharged direct

from or into carts, of which there is a very large amount of traffic done and which the tramway would not serve. We recommend an alteration from the Promoter's Scheme as shown blue on map viz: No. 1. Tramway to be brought up to a point 25 feet from Steam Packet Pier, South west angle, and run westward within 25 feet of quay wall and joining the present No. 3 by Promoter's Stores, (and which replaces the East end of No. 3) and to end at a point on the Quay in front of Gardner's Yard, and we suggest that the Promoter might connect No. 3 to No. 1 by a loop through Gardner's Yard to end of Strand Street; this would give access to 200 feet of quay frontage for loading and discharging on tramway and this traffic could be worked from end of both loops giving a circulation for both empty and full wagons past the point of discharge. This plan would leave a space by Harbour Commissioners' Stores and a part of quay westward from Gardner's Yard free from obstruction for loading or discharging vessels directly carts and giving proper facilities for all users.

Or as an alternative the Committee recommend the Promoters of the Tramway Scheme if they desire that they be given liberty to run their line along the North Quay westward from Kennedy's Lane to the dead end of their plan, and liberty to make a loop with No. 1.

Tramway or Railways in the Urban District of Wicklow

To the Chairman,  
and Urban Council of Wicklow.  
Assembled at their Quarterly Meeting  
4<sup>th</sup> July 1904

Gentlemen

As already notified an application will be made by the Promoter to the Lord Lieutenant in Council through the Wicklow Urban District Council for authority to make and maintain certain Tramways or Railways in the Town of Wicklow and in accordance with the provisions of the Statute & by to report thereon as follows :-

The proposed Tramways or Railways consist of separate lines numbered 1, 2 and 3 respectively connecting the W.W & W Railway with the quay of Wicklow. All these have been so fully and clearly described in the notices, Maps, Plans etc, which were duly lodged for public inspection with the proper officers, that the Council will have very little difficulty in understanding the Scheme.

No 1 Tramway commences at the end of the line of rails east of the Goods Shed in the W.W & W Railway Goods Yard and crosses the grass plot west of the Old Life Boat House, thence through the centre of Upper and Lower Strand St and along the gravel bank, immediately to the east of Mr. Mayes's houses and of Earl Fitzwilliam's Coal Store and terminating at the Steam Packet Pier within about 15 feet of the Harbour face of same - 3 furlongs or thereabouts in length. The sharpest curve is 4½ chains and the steepest gradient 1 in 800. -

No 2 Tramway commences at the end of the line of rails west of Goods Shed above described, crosses through the same grass plot west of No 1 Tramway and joins the latter at the North End of Upper Strand Street, 4½ chains or thereabouts in length. The sharpest curve is 16 chains and the steepest gradient 1 in 13.530.

No 3 Tramway commences 36 yards back on No 1 line forming a junction therewith near S.P. Pier and running back along the North Quay as far as Messrs Haskins Stores, one furlong and 4 chains in length. The sharpest curve is 6 chains and the steepest gradient 1 in 192. There are no engineering difficulties in the construction of any of the lines; and as shown on plan and Sections they appear to have been carefully and skilfully laid out by the Promoters Engineer. I would recommend the following slight modifications in some of the levels - (1) In Nos 1 and 2 lines about 9 inches of cutting are shown on section where the lines cross the footpath through the grass plot above mentioned, and where they cross the Sea road West of the Old Life Boat House. Both lines should be raised to surface of ground at these points.

(2) In No 3 line the present level of the North Quay roadway should be adhered to as far west as the Lane, (the section shows about 15 inches of filling here) and the Tramways thence laid with a uniform gradient to the surface of the New Quay at Messrs Haskins Stores. My reasons for the two alterations are obvious, i.e. to maintain the present level of the path and road and not

to raise the Quay road alone the level of the adjoining yards - These are mere matters of detail which do not affect the general scheme.

The gauge of the Tramway will be 5 feet 3 inches and the top of the rails, which are to be of steel flanged pattern weighing 70 lbs per yard, will be level with the surface of the roads and ground. The roads are to be metalled with macadam between, and on each side of the rails, allowing the flange of the wagon wheel to form its own groove similar to where the Railway crosses the Glenalby Road at Rathnew Brickworks. -

Where the Tramways cross the road leading from Bond Street to the Pier East of Earl Fitzwilliams Stores, I would recommend that the level crossing be paved with sets, as the traffic on this road is sometimes very considerable. The draft order provides that level crossings as well as other matters of an engineering character be carried out to the satisfaction of your Surveyor.

It is proposed to form the permanent way by putting down longitudinal timber sleepers on a bed of concrete where the line passes through the streets and laying the rails on the usual cross sleepers in the open spaces.

As regards Sewer Drains, Water Mains and Service pipes, it would be well to have a clause inserted in the Tramway Order for their special protection and repairs when injured.

The estimated cost of the three lines is £1,383. 8. 0. This is rather a low estimate, but as I understand the W.W & W Railway Company would build the Tramway themselves, no doubt they could do it much cheaper than a Contractor.

I have very carefully perused all the documents lodged with me and so far as I can judge all the preliminaries in connection with this matter have been fully complied with.

The Report of the Board of Works Inquiry will be submitted to your Meeting so that the application comes proper before you for the Council's sanction. I have read over the Draft Order which will require some slight alterations and additions, examined carefully the plans and sections and surveyed the site of the proposed line and I have no hesitation in recommending the Urban Council to adopt this Scheme, safely prepared by Mr. Shannon the experienced Engineer for the Promoter and to give them sanction to the undertaking, subject of course to the interests of all parties being properly

### Tramway Inquiries The Proposed Wicklow Tramways.

In compliance with the instructions of the Board of Works contained in your letter of the 9<sup>th</sup> June, I have to Report that I held an Inquiry on Monday the 20<sup>th</sup> day of June 1904 at the Town Hall, Wicklow, at the hour of twelve o'clock noon, into the Engineering merits of the proposed Wicklow Tramways, having inspected the proposed lines on the same day, previous to the Inquiry, accompanied by W. S. T. Shannon, Chief Engineer of the Dublin Wicklow and Wexford Railway, who is the Engineer of the Scheme.

At the Inquiry the Promoter was represented by Mr. W. G. Gibson, B.C. instructed by Messrs. Somers & Co. Solicitors.

Mr. E. A. Collins, B.C. instructed by Messrs. Casey, Clay represented the Wicklow Manure Co. who are users of the North Quay.

Mr. J. H. McCarroll, Solicitor, appeared for the Urban District Council.

The Harbour Commissioners were represented by their Chairman Mr. Samuel E. Minn.

Mr. H. P. Newbold (Secretary) represented the Gas Company.

The Scheme consists of three Tramways of a total length of 4 furlongs 8. 1 chains, or thereabouts.

Tramway No. 1 connects the end of the most eastern line of sidings of the Dublin Wicklow and Wexford Railway, in the Old Station Yard at Wicklow, with the North Quay of Wicklow Harbour, and in its route passes along the centre of Strand Street.

Tramway No. 2 is an extension of the line of siding passing along the western side of Goods Shed of Station yard, and forms a junction with No. 1 in Strand Street.

Tramway No. 3 forms a junction with No. 1 at the North Quay in a westerly direction to a point 126 yards measured in a southerly direction from the south west corner of the gas Works.

The Tramways are all to be single lines of 5 ft 3 inches gauge.

There are two street crossings, one near the junction of Tramways No. 1 and No. 2, the other in Bath Street.

I consider that all the lines have been well and skilfully laid out, as to direction and curves.

This is a true copy of the Report of Robert Haire referred to in the Report of the Commissioners of Public Works into the merits of the Wicklow Tramways from an Engineering point of view dated 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1904. (Seal) George Shanahan assist Sec

Street Crossings

Laying out of lines

Gradients.

The gradients are all very easy, the steepest being 1 in 100, which occurs on Tramway No 1 beyond its junction with Tramway No 2.

Curves.

The curves are all good, the sharpest being 4½ chains radius.

Permanent Way.

The rails will be of steel, weighing 70 lbs per lineal yard, secured by gauge bolts and hook head spikes, at intervals of 2 feet 6 inches to longitudinal timbers (creosoted wood) 12 inches by 5 inches.

The joints will be formed by fish plates, weighing 16 lbs per pair and having four  $\frac{1}{8}$ " diameter fish bolts, with patent locking nut to each joint.

The longitudinal timbers will be laid on a concrete bed 12 inches by nine inches.

The rails will be tied to gauge by wrought iron tie bars 2 inches by  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, placed 6 feet apart.

The level of the top of rails will conform to level of top of surface of street. When the permanent way is laid, the surface of the street to be made up with metalloip, as shown on cross section herewith.

Bridge, Culverts &amp;c.

There are no bridges or culverts along the route followed by tramways, but there is a sewer recently constructed in Strand St, of earthenware pipes, laid on concrete, top of pipe being 5 ft to 6 ft below level of street, over which Tramway No 1 is to run. This sewer, I consider, will be of sufficient strength to carry the wagons, which are to be drawn by horses; it is not proposed to use engine power.

Tidal Sands

Tidal lands are not interfered with, and therefore no plans or sections have been lodged with the Board of Trade.

Modifications

The only modification I consider necessary are to the street-crossings one near junction of Tramway No 1 & 2, the other in Bath Street.

Street Crossings

These should be properly paved with sets for a width of 20 feet between rails, and 18 inches outside the rails.

North Quay Wall

The North Quay wall may require strengthening in places, but I consider it is sufficiently strong to bear the weight of wagons, if the rail nearest the quay be kept 10 feet from surface of coping.

The Tramway Co asked to have the tramways Nos 1 and 2 at their junction on the North Quay altered, as shown on plan in place, and to leave out a portion of No 3 Tramway at the Western end, and make another tramway from No 3 to No 1. This I do not recommend.

(1) The Promoter may from time to time where and so far as it is necessary or may appear expedient for the purpose of preventing frequent interruption of traffic by repairs or works, in connection with the same, alter the position of any sewers, or drains or alter the position of any mains or pipes for the supply of water or gas or other purpose subject to the provisions of this Order and the restrictions herein after provided.

(2) The Promoter shall from time to time make good all damage present or future done by him to all streets, roads, mains, pipes, sewers, valve pipes, siphons, plugs, tubes or other works, and property belonging to or controlled by the Council or any Company, person or persons and shall from time to time make full compensation to all parties for any loss or damage which may be sustained by reason of any interference with the same. The foregoing provisions shall in addition to and not in derogation of any Public Act or Acts of Parliament or Orders or regulations of the Board of Trade or otherwise howsoever which may exist for the protection and benefit of such Council, Company or person as aforesaid their rights, privileges, powers or benefits.

# For The Protection Of The Wicklow Harbour.

The Tramway or Railway No. 3 (described in the Schedule hereto) shall be made or constructed, so that the rail nearest the quay wall, of the Wicklow Harbour shall not be less than ten feet distant from the said Quay Wall. The Promoter shall make good all damage to the said Quay wall or Quays, done or caused by the making or construction or working of the said Tramways or Railways.

In No 3 line the present level of North Quay road way shall be adhered to as far west as the Lane and the Tramways there laid with a uniform gradient to the surface of the New Quay at Messrs Haskins Stones, and to maintain the present level of the path and road and not to raise the Quay Road above the level of the adjoining yards.
