Surveyor's Report
6th Feb 1906

Gentlemen:- The roads in the Urban District are all now thoroughly repaired with suitable metalling and it will not be necessary to put any more sheeting on their surfaces this season. Some stones are placed in depot to provide for any small repairs which may be found necessary later on.

I must ask for your instructions as regards the maintenance of the Sea Road leading to the Chemical Works. Since your last meeting I kept a man constantly repairing portion of it, and some

25 tons of Ballistic metalling were spread recently, otherwise the traffic should cease. There is practically no traffic on this road except what occurs in connection with the Manure Works, and now that a good deal of the macadamised part of the road is carried away it is hardly fair that the Council should be asked to repair, or rather re-construct, what remains.

From time to time quantities of cinders, ashes, bricks, stone, rubbish, dust and filth have been thrown into the river above and below the Wooden and Stone Bridges, contrary to the provisions of the Act of Parliament, and as well as being a nuisance, are accumulating to such an extent as to divert the course of the stream and curtail the waterway through the Stone Bridge. The offender should be prosecuted The remains of an Old Steam Launch below the Stone Bridge should also be removed.

The new sewers and gully connections in Summer Hill and Castle Street are completed, and the pipe drain from the Wellfield, in Monkton Row, is in progress, and will be finished in a day or two, after which the Abbey Street Sewer will be commenced.
