The only work of urgency I would recommend you to have done at present is the repairs to the wall along Fitzwilliam Road which is much more dangerous now than when I last reported on it.

The Council should consider at this meeting whether the present contract system of Scavenging is satisfactory. This of course belongs more to your Sanitary Officer department than mine, and I could not refer to it only I was obliged occasionally to have a lot of this cleansing done by the road labourers who have quite enough maintenance work on hands at present.

I inspected the Reservoir on the 31st Ultimo, the water was 8ft 1in under the overflow sill. There was a fair supply at the intake owing to the thaw; and the waste at the outfall pipe was very small.

The aviary and its occupants should be kept below the embankment, the gravel walks should be restored, all weeds removed and the whole place neatly trimmed up, approaching and surrounding the Reservoir.

I have no record of waste in the Town since the 22nd Ultimo, which was then 13 gallons per head per diem, while only 6 $\frac{2}{3}$ gallons were consumed. Probably Mr. O'Connor will report if any leakages were stopped since:

With reference to my Reports of the 17th Inst relative to the dirty state of the Streets, I cannot see any improvement, on Sunday 23rd instant Main St was covered with waste paper and dirtier than usual. On Christmas Day the Doctor's steps were in a filthy state with waste paper, sweeping of Shops and human faeces, there was also human faeces on footpath at bottom of Church Hill, Upper Monkton Row and Summer Hill was covered with some smelling mud and vegetable debris, apparently it had not been swept for some weeks. I am informed your Board directed Sir Sanitary Officer Day to employ men and have the Streets cleared.

3rd January 1907*

I submit report for month of December and beg to state the public lighting of the Town but for a few exceptions was well maintained. I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 100 premises and served 5 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary requirements. There was one Patient-carried to Hospital in the Ambulance Car and one article disinfected. The flushing and disinfecting of the drainage system was carried out according to your Council's instructions:

The sanitary condition of those drains are the same as I last reported them. I employed an extra street Scavenger as directed but gentlemen owing to the severe weather I was unable to get as much work done as I would have wished there is yet room enough for improvement in the Scavenging of the Streets of the Town.

I have handed your Surveyor a record of the Meters now charged for with a view of letting your Council see the consumption of water in this direction.

Town Surveyor Report
5 Feb 1907

The roads and public works are in good condition, all the road metal
spread and the paths granulated.

The last Meter diagram shows a waste of over 2000 gallons of
water per hour. The storage in the Reservoir is down 7ft 8 inches,
and is still falling.

In addition to my recommendations to the Waterworks
Committee dated 26th January 1907, I now suggest that
the water be turned off each night from 10.30 pm to 6 am;
and that the weekly scouring of mains be discontinued for the present.

Inspected No^o 2 Filter on the 4th Inst, and found that twelve inches in depth of sand must be washed. I sent two men up there yesterday as it is absolutely necessary to have the filters ready for work at all times.

The streams from the sources to the basin on the 2nd instant were very small, and the consumption and waste is now so large that I must respectfully ask the Council to make such an order today on both my Reports, as will have the effect of saving the very limited quantity at present stored in the Reservoir, at all events until such time as the supply from the catchment-area increases.

The piece of ground between the eastern end of Bond St and the West Pier, is in a shocking condition, owing to manure, filth, and rubbish of every description being deposited there. This is hardly fair to the people in the locality or to those who have to use the public road to the Harbour.

Town Surveyor's Report
26th January 1907

At the Council Meeting on 5th Inst, the water in the Reservoir was reported at such a low level and the daily supply so large that I recommend prompt measures to be taken to prevent waste.

The water in the Reservoir is now 7 ft 6 in below overflow and its level is getting lower every day, and as I explained to the Council, there is only about one third the storage capacity of the basin available.

To fill the Reservoir by the 1st of June next, the water should rise on an average at the rate of $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch per day. At present I see no prospect of this, and consequently I asked your Town Clerk to summon a special meeting of the Committee to consider the matter and I feel I would not be discharging my duty, as Town Engineer, if I did not urge in the strongest-possible manner the necessity for taking the following measures to avert a water famine in the Town.

1 - All parties found wasting or misusing water to be forthwith prosecuted.

2. All the Meters to be put in working order, and the water used by the owners of premises to which they apply to be charged for at the usual rate.
3. All the supplies to be cut off from the Harbour and Foreshore Works.
4. Arrangements to be at once made to borrow £500 to erect an oil engine and pumps to augment the present storage.

Sub Sanitary Officers Report-

5th Feb 1907

I submit report for the month of January and beg to state that I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 150 premises and served 14 notices under the Public Health Act for different sanitary purposes. I had drainage repaired on four occasions. The disinfecting and flushing of drainage system was carried out according to your Council's directions, those drains are in good order. I had samples of water taken from different places in the Town and forwarded to Sir Charles Cameron for analysis. The cleaning of the streets of the Town with the assistance of the road overseers Cart was fairly well carried out but gentlemen it is my opinion that one horse and Cart is perfectly inadequate to do the work of keeping the streets of the Town. The public lighting of the Town was well attended. Some time ago I called your attention to the storage of your labourers articles in the Market Hall. I hope you will now give it consideration as it is unsuitable in every way for the purpose.

I would ask your Council to

have a notice board placed at large entrance gate to Murrough as a warning to trespassers.
