The scavenging of the Streets of the Town was carried out as usual. It will be necessary to have a water meter provided for the use of the Camping season on Murrigh.

I would suggest that all the Meters that are out of order otherwise not registering be removed from the premises that they are now on. I would ask your Council to supply me with some disinfectants the last supply being used up.
