The roads and public works are in good condition. The repairs to the wall on Fitzwilliam Road are nearly completed. New eaves gutters, rain water pipes, and weather boards, have been put on the Marough cottages. During the last ten days 43 men were temporarily employed on relief works at the Marough, Castle Street, Monkton Row, Colley Street and Waterworks.

I must respectfully request the Council to make some order at once with reference to the dangerous ruins in The Ball Alley. I have power as your Surveyor to put up a proper board or fence, but I prefer your special order in this case.

I should like to have the Council's instructions with reference

to the several matters set out in my last report. I have examined the application for footpath on Church Hill. The work can be satisfactorily carried out for the amount stated viz.: - £ 24. The present application extends only to the Church entrance. It is a very necessary work and should be continued to the end of Brickfield Lane, but I presume Councillor Collins will also make application for this portion at the next Quarterly Meeting.

I beg to recommend that the necessary steps be taken to apply to the Local Government Board for an Order to declare Parts 1, 2, 3, and such other parts or sections of the "Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907," as the Council think necessary to be in force in "The Urban District"

I submit report for the month of December and beg to state that I made my usual inspections visiting over 90 premises and served 11 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes there was 4 premises disinfected.

I distributed lime and lime wash bushes to a number of poor Cabin keepers to clear their premises which was well used. The disinfecting and flushing of the drainage system of the Town was carried out according to your Council's instructions. The scavenging of the Streets of the Town was fairly well attended. I have been requested by a number of householders to call attention to the removal of refuse from their premises this would mean domestic scavenging however I leave the case in your Council's hands.

The public lighting of the town was fairly well carried out but on different occasions the number of lamps found not lighting was 21.

The Medical Officer's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects.

Surveyors Report

4<sup>th</sup> February 1908.

The streets and roads are in a fair condition. The new curbing and channel on Church Hill are nearly completed. Tenders should now be invited for the 9 inch sewer at the Bridge Hotel or the work done by direct labour, now is the best time to get this sewer made. I have again to call your attention to the waste of water, i.e. 1950 gallons per hour. The maximum quantity of water passing through the filters per hour amounts to 3,800 gallons, while their present area admits of the proper filtration of only 1400 gallons per hour. Therefore owing to the enormous waste, the water is practically unfiltered and the cost of keeping the filters in order is outrageous. Nearly £70 has been spent on labour alone, at the Waterworks during the past year, at least three fourths of this was expended on the filters. Nine years ago Dr. Edgar Flynn

Mr. Comber, C.E. and I recommended the construction of proper filters but the Council were obdurate. In face of the foregoing figures perhaps this Council may re-consider the matter - I would respectfully suggest that the Engineers representing the several interests concerned in the Harbour and Foreshore Protection Works, should meet a Committee of the Harbour Board, with a view of having the Council's property near the Gas Works adequately protected from future sea erosion at the root of the New Pier.

I do not know what plan Mr. Barrow has arranged for this but I am of opinion that a considerable sum must be expended in order to protect that portion of the Murrough from the inroads of the Sea.
