House, I could not see any discharge of putrid matter, blood or anything
dangerous to the Public Health.

made by this Officer, I visited the Slaughter House and yard belonging
to Mr Mary Carr Abbey St and found the Slaughter House and yard
in a filthy state and dangerous to the Public Health there were also
several pigs running about the yard, I recommend that immediate
and stringent action be taken.

nuisance, discontinue the keeping of swine and have the
premises cleaned and put in a proper sanitary condition

Sanitary Sub Officers Report
29th May 1908

I submit report for the month of May and beg to state that I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 150 premises and served 16 Notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary business. I distributed lime and lime wash brushes to a number of poor Cabin Keepers to clean their premises. I had one case before the Borough Court on the 5th May for causing a nuisance in the public street; the party was fined 2/- and costs.

The drainage system of the Town was disinfected and flushed with water as usual. The Scavenging of the Town was fairly well carried out, I have nothing to add to my last Report on domestic scavenging but one addition. By your Council's directions I attended the lower portion of the Town on Market mornings and am glad to say succeeded up to the present in preventing buying and selling in that portion of the Town. Now Gentlemen I hope your Council will remunerate me for this service.

Your Secretary has handed me the sum of Five pounds for the use of water to Harbour Works which I have lodged to your credit in the Bank. Now gentlemen I must ask your Council to make some arrangement for the watering of the streets as at present I cannot take the horse from the scavenging work in the morning when the streets should be watered. I have received the sum of Three Shillings for trespass on the Murragh and with your permission I will give this to your labourer Cronlock who found the trespasser. The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects.

Dairy Inspector Report
2nd June 1908

Prespectfully beg to report that by directions of your Council I have examined the premises of 24 persons who have applied to register to carry on the trade of Cow Keeper, Dairyma - man or Purveyor of Milk. During my inspections I was granted every facility and in most cases the applicants were desirous to carry out the Regulations. I noted each case separately and pointed out the improvements and alterations in the Dairies and Cow Sheds which were necessary, at the same time informing them that it was mandatory on the Council to enforce the compliance of the Local Government Order of the 1st May 1908. There are some premises which are totally unfit in their present state as Dairies and Cow Sheds, I pointed out to the owners the necessary requirements to make them suitable, and if same are not complied with I cannot recommend the Council to allow them to continue in the Trade. The present is a most opportune time to have the

improvements referred to carried out, inasmuch as all the cattle are out at grass during the summer and if the Applicants do not take advantage of the summer they will scarcely be able to have the work done in winter. I have strongly urged this on them all. I find in many of the premises piggories quite close to the Cow Sheds and Dairies, and in each case I told the people that it would not be allowed under existing arrangements. Each person has been supplied with a copy of the Urban Council's "Bye Laws," however I would ask the Council to procure a sufficient number of the Local Government Board's Orders of the 1st May 1908 for distribution amongst the applicants.

Off. Doyle be directed to ascertain names of parties doing this and report to Town Board.
3. I hereby report to you a nuisance caused by pigs in Mr. Fins, yard, Strand St this yard is not suitable for pigs, I have reported this yard on previous occasions and I would like to know what order was made and why it is not enforced I think there was a prosecution in this case =

I respectfully beg to report that since your last meeting I distributed to each Dairymen, Cowkeeper and Purveyor of Milk a copy of Local Government Board General Order of 1st May 1908, at the same time informing them that the Council as the Local Authority were compelled to enforce same.

At present there is not one premises in the District in a proper state for the owners to receive a license, however some of the Cow Keepers are making improvements which I pointed out, and in those cases I hope to be able to report favourably, however there are some who have not as yet made any effort to comply with the Regulations and in those cases Licenses cannot be granted.

On last Thursday, Dr. Edgar Flinn, Local Government Board Inspector, Dr. Halpin and myself visited 14 premises and found in some cases overcrowding and others unsuitable, in remaining cases Dr. Flinn told the Cow Keepers what was necessary in order to obtain a license.
