I. I hereby report to you that a Daughter of Simon Rutledge, New St.,  
 is suffering from Typhoid Fever, as this man keeps a Dairy.  
 I recommend that this case be sent to Hospital, otherwise he  
 must not be allowed to dispose of Milk under any conditions, &  
 cannot sanction Cows being milked in the field and milk then  
 sold nor any person living in the house having anything to do with  
 a Public Milk Supply. I also recommend that the yard which  
 is in a filthy state be thoroughly cleansed, that the surface of  
 Sewer be covered with Chloride of Lime or some other disinfectant  
 and the premises limewashed. This yard should not contain  
 pigs - Please instruct Sub Sanitary Officer Doyle to take  
 immediate action:

Submit report for the month of July and beg to state that I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 200 premises and served 10 notices under the Public Health Act for different sanitary requirements and disinfected three premises during the month. Had five cases before the Justices at Petty Sessions. Received orders in four cases, the fifth case was adjourned until the Petty Sessions to be held on 11<sup>th</sup> August. As the professional gentlemen attending Petty Sessions object to me appearing for your Council I will feel obliged by you giving the matter your earliest attention. The disinfecting and flushing of the drainage system of the Town was carried out as usual. The Scareyng of the Town was fairly well carried out. There appears to be three additions to the domestic scareyng that makes the number 11. Now gentlemen relative to a complaint about the Doctors Steps passage-way, I made inquiries from the Road Overseers and Scareyers and I am informed that there was nothing to complain of but a few papers blown into it, but arrangements has been made for one of your Labourers to visit it each Sunday Morning.

The Medical Officers attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects.

Dairy Inspector's Report  
10<sup>th</sup> August 1908

I beg to report that during the month I constantly visited the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milk Shops, and found in some cases the Dairymen were carrying out the regulations satisfactory and others were acting contrary to my directions although I have repeatedly warned them that they cannot hope to obtain a license unless they have their premises in a clean and proper manner.

I cannot recommend the Council being kept within 50 feet of

Cowshed or Dairy and none of the premises will admit of this.

There are some premises who have no means of drainage, there being no main sewer to connect with, however, I doubt even if they had drainage that their premises are suitable under existing conditions. I would recommend that Public Notice be given that all the Dairymen, Cowkeepers and Proprietors of Milk will require to have a license on or before 1<sup>st</sup> October next failing which the Council have no option but to enforce the Local Government Board Regulations.

Auditors Report  
29<sup>th</sup> July 1908

I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of Workmen Urban District for the financial year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 1908, and I beg to transmit herewith, two copies of the Abstracts duly certified.

The rates levied for the period amounted to £11 in the £ of which £8 was raised in respect of Poor Rate.

The collection of the Poor Rate was completed within the financial year and of the Urban Rate a small amount of arrears was carried forward to the following period for collection.

The Audit of the Corporate Estate Rental occupied more time than should have been necessary for the purpose, the difficulties which arose might have been averted and the Accounts presented in better form had they been regularly submitted to the Town Clerk for the purpose of checking, but it would appear that the Collector, who was recently appointed, did not consider it necessary to do so and, consequently the rental remained in his hands throughout the entire period, the Clerk having no knowledge of the state of this Account until it was submitted for Audit; this practice is a serious breach of Article 64 of the Public Bodies Order.

Much confusion was caused by the Collector not keeping the payments for Corporate Estate and Artisans Dwellings rents clearly apart, with the result that the Financial Receipt Book showed only £22. 14. 11 lodged for Artisans Dwellings, whereas, from the rental it would appear that £92. 18. 0 had been collected, similarly in the case of Bond Street houses the amounts did not agree.

In checking these Accounts it came to my notice that the Collector employs the Town Sergeant as Deputy to collect the weekly rents. I was unable in many instances to reconcile the Arrears shown in the Deputy Collector's Book with the Collector's rental.

This arrangement does not appear to be a satisfactory one and if the Collector is unable to undertake all his duties, it would be better that this portion of the work should be given to some one who would personally collect the rents and be directly responsible for the state of the collection.

In many cases I found the new Tenants Agreements were invalid and the amount of Arrears exceptionally high.

I have been obliged to surcharge the Collector with three items which he admits are irreconcileable and I would point out the danger

of allowing these small weekly Tenanties to run into arrears for two or three months before any steps are taken to enforce payment.

The receipts from grazing lands have fallen off considerably and owing to the fact that cattle are constantly going on and off, there is no means of adequately checking this Account.

I was also unable to certify that the allowances of rates and taxes on the Corporate Rents are in all cases correct, as no vouchers were forthcoming in many cases; I must, however, commend the Collector for drawing my attention to several instances in which he allowed excessive amounts and these he lodged before the close of the Audit.

It is, therefore, most essential that all these matters should be regularly checked and certified by the Town Clerk who has the custody of the various leases, and is, therefore, conversant with the nature of the several holdings.

It is also necessary that the prescribed form of Artisans Dwelling Rental should be obtained and it is imperative that the requirements of Article 64 of the Public Bodies Order should be complied with, though this will doubtless impose a considerable amount of work upon the Town Clerk which was hitherto done by the Estate Agent.

In connection with Bond Street houses, which were recently taken over by the Council and are let to weekly Tenants, it was necessary to raise a Loan of £500. A Mortgage was given to the Treasurer and a separate Bank Account was opened through which the Council were allowed to overdraw to the extent of £500 by way of Loan.

In this Account the rents were, or should have been, lodged to meet repayment of over draft and interest.

The nature of this Account being unauthorised I found it necessary to arrange with the Treasurer to place the Loan of £500 to the credit of the Council's Account to clear off this overdraft in the Bond Street houses Account; a separate account for this undertaking will then be unnecessary as the rents should be lodged to the general revenue account from which the repayment of Loan should be made.

In order that the statement of balances of the several accounts should reconcile with each other, it will be necessary to transfer the sum of £27. 10. 6 from the General Account to the Poor Rate Account and when the Loan of £500 is applied to clear off the overdraft in Bond Street Houses Account the balance in that Account might be transferred to the General Account.

From Surveyor's Report

The roads and streets are in fair condition. The construction of the new path on Summer Hill is in progress. The river wall at Leixton Place is bulging out. I would recommend that a few strong anchor bolts be inserted in it. Dr. Halpin called the Council's attention at the last meeting to the present filtration system, this matter should be dealt with soon, as the filters in the embankment are very little use as a filtering medium, and are very costly to maintain, Dr. Halpin, Dr. Elinus McComber F.S.I, and I condemned them long ago.

I again would ask the Council to provide a yard and store for their plant and material.

### Wicklow Foreshore Protection Works

As some further extra work are now in contemplation, I would strongly impress on the Urban Council the necessity of enacting

the Harbour Board to retain sufficient funds to enable them, from time to time, to keep filling up the lagoon at the root of the New Pier. If this corner be not thoroughly protected and maintained the Council's property adjoining it will certainly collapse.

No 1 With reference to my Report of the 19<sup>th</sup> Ultimo relative to the disgraceful state of the Doctor's Steps on that date, I repeat that this report is true. Notice in Sub Sanitary Officer Doyle's Report for August in reply he states there was no misname only a few loose papers. Please ask this Officer if he would kindly give a written explanation as to why he contradicts a statement of mine of a matter of fact.

The Chairman stated that he could substantiate the Medical Officer of Health's statement as he passed up the passage on the date in question and saw the misname referred to by Dr. Halpin.

No 2 As Medical Officer of Health for the Urban District of Wicklow, please direct Sub Sanitary Officer Doyle to disinfect Mr Rattigan's house in High Street, to see the contents of ashpit are treated with disinfectants and buried, also house and yard to be lime washed, and examine and report on sewerage, if the sewer goes beneath the house it should be pipped, a Buchan trap cutting it off from main sewer and a ventilating shaft behind also. earthenware water gully traps in yard

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report  
29<sup>th</sup> August 1908

I submit Report for the month of August, and beg to state that I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 100 premises and served 11 notices as required by statute for various sanitary requirements and disinfected 2 premises. There was one patient conveyed to Hospital in the Ambulance car. At the Petty Sessions held on 11<sup>th</sup> August, I had one case before the Justices for disobedience of a sanitary officer order of your Council, I received an order with costs against the party. With regard to the case that I was directed by your Council to withdraw I regret to say nothing has been done to remedy the defects complained of. The drainage system of the Town was disinfected and flushed with water as your Council directed. The Scavenging of the Streets of the Town was fairly well carried out. The domestic scavenging remains in the same condition as I reported last month. I distributed lime and lime wash brushes to a number of poor Cabin Keepers to clean their premises. Now gentlemen as the time is approaching for some of the articles of your Board to be stored for the winter Period, ask you to provide some other place besides the Old Life Boat House as at present I have no room for storage of any description.

The public lighting of the Town during the month appears to have been well carried out and all the lanterns are fitted with incandescent burners with a few exceptions. The doors of the Old Life Boat house requires repairs and painting. The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects.

Since your last meeting I have constantly visited the Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk Shops, and I beg to report that there are some of the premises in a proper state for the owners to receive licenses, others are progressing with the work which I expect will be finished during this month.

Served five notices on Owners of Dairies to abate existing nuisances and to provide proper sanitary accommodation within 21 days. In some cases, swine are kept quite close to the Dairies and Cow-sheds and I will be compelled to serve notice on the parties to discontinue the keeping of Swine same being most injurious to the milk - the premises to which I refer are not in a sanitary state and under present circumstances I cannot allow swine being kept - I will be obliged to ask your Council at your next meeting for authority to prosecute parties who have neglected or failed to comply with the Sanitary Notices.
