The Medical officers attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. The usual disinfecting of main drainage and washing down of Doctor's Steps was carried out satisfactory. The scavengers were attentive to their work.

During the month one of the trees on the Mall has been maliciously broken and carried away, same requires to be replaced. The Boat House doors require repairs which should be done at once.

I have examined all the main sewers and find all in good working order with the exception of two that have a slight lodgment of excrement which will require attention No 1 Strand St, No 2 Chain St.

I beg to apply for my usual uniform clothing.

During the month I had the enclosure of the Halpin Memorial cleaned, while some of the trees requires to be pruned.

Sir // I am now able to inform you that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have agreed in consequence of representations made to them to place a sum of £6000 in the July Supplementary Estimates for protection works at Wicklow Harbour subject to the following conditions:-

(1) That the Scheme is referred by the Harbour Commissioners to either Mr Barron or Sir John Griffiths (at the expense of the Harbour Commissioners) and that the referee reports that a self contained and satisfactory Scheme can be carried out for the sum of £6000, and

I beg to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Wicklow Urban District Council for the year ended the 31<sup>st</sup> of March, 1914. Only certified abstracts thereof are transmitted herewith.

It is with regret that I find myself once more compelled to call attention to the unsatisfactory discharge of duty by the Rent Collector. His books contain manifest inaccuracies, in that they do not agree with one another. The books of his receipt books contain numerous cancelled receipts, which seemingly, have been wrongly filled up, thus showing gross carelessness. The work of checking his Accounts is one of great difficulty for the Town Clerk and gives needless trouble to everyone concerned, although, if the Collector performed his duties properly, it should be a simple matter.

This is not the first occasion on which I have had to call the Council's attention to the rent collector's negligence or incompetence and they will incur serious responsibility, should they persist in allowing the present discreditable state of affairs to continue.

I certify as due from the <sup>Rept</sup> Collector, a sum of £ 4. 6. 5 on account of allowances, made by him

to tenants not legally entitled thereto.

The Town Clerk performed his duties, in connection with the Audit, in a most careful and efficient manner.

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting over 300 premises and served 28 Notices under the public health Act for various sanitary purposes. The Medical Officer's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. The usual disinfecting of main drains and washing down of Doctors Steps was carried out satisfactorily. During the month I had two Patients removed to the Fever Hospital in Ambulance Car, one of which was from the Rural District and the premises disinfected.

The Abbey river requires to be cleaned from the late Mr James Water's house to Mr James' forge same should be done at once. I beg to bring under your notice an open grating in the Dispensary Lane which carries away surface water, I recommend that a street-gully be placed in position to prevent rubbish going through to the Council's main sewer.

During the month the public seat which was placed on the river Murrrough has been maliciously broken, same being removed to Boat House and repaired and placed in position on the Upper Promenade.

I recommend that a list of all fire plugs in the Urban District be taken and a printed list of same be

placed in the Town Hall and also on the apparatus car to prevent delay in case of fire.
