Town Surveyor Report
 4th May 1915

The roads and streets are in comparatively fair condition
 and only require the removal of some loose stones and a
 little trimming up.

A meter was supplied the water laid on to the firestone
 works and the use of the old Life Boat House given to Messrs
 Lawson on the 19th ult -

The covering with earth of the insanitary refuse in
 Brickfield Lane is being carried out.

The diagrams furnished by the Water Inspector show
 a very large consumption of water, altogether in excess of

what it should be for a new manufacturing Town like Wicklow. During the past month the water in the storage reservoir has fallen 1' 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches amounting to 2400000 gallons or nearly 73000 gallons per day. The total daily supply should not exceed 50000 gallons. The latest diagram shows that this excessive use, or misuse, occurs during business hours. Now is the time to conserve the water not when it is running short.

The graduated timber gauge should be again affixed to the concrete wall so that accurate readings of the water levels might be taken daily. The filter beds should now be cleaned while the water is high. I recommend that the fire brigade be re-organised and the names of the Captain and men, at present available supplied to the Town Sergeant.

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting 260 premises and served 12 notices under the Public Health Acts for various sanitary purposes.

The Medical Officer's attention has been directed to the keeping of swine on unsuitable premises.

The usual disinfecting of main drains and washing down Doctor's Steps was carried out satisfactorily.

The Scavengers were attentive to their work and the public lighting of the town was well maintained.

By your directions I visited the Urban District bounds at Dunleer and found at the sea side of the road old building rubbish had been thrown down on the bank next the stream, otherwise there is nothing else to complain of, however I suspect the party who has committed the offence and will report further to you in the matter.

The water closets in the houses of Messrs McCarthy, Hayden, Murphy, Kavanagh & Walsh are out of order and require immediate attention. The concrete floor of the back kitchen of the house occupied by Patrick Hayden is completely broken up, I respectfully suggest to the Council that your Agent should see that these houses are not maliciously damaged.

Tom Surveyor's Report-
6th July 1915

I beg to report that the Streets and Public Works in the Urban district are in comparatively fair condition. The workmen are engaged at present scuffing off the grass from the edges of the roads and trimming up the sides, paths &c.

During the past month the following orders of the Council were carried out viz. flats at Dunbar Quarry secured, but the fastening again removed. Cleaning of water filters completed. Roof of Mrs Muller's house Bond St repaired, Estimates invited for hinged lids to scavengers carts.

I would recommend the Council to obtain an estimate from the Balloo Quarry to lay 400 tons of 1½ inch macadam for streets and 60 tons of fine screenings for paths.

The water draw is very satisfactory the water line being down to 800 gallons an hour. The Scouring of the mains does not appear to be carried out regularly, about a week ago the water from the taps was quite brown. The pipes should be flushed out at least once a week, there is quite sufficient water now in the Reservoir to allow for this.

Some person has raised the surface of the Flebo Lane with cinders covering up the fire hydrant boxes and sewer manholes, it will be necessary to bring up the cover boxes and grids to the new road level and have name plates placed adjacent fixing their position.

With the present arrangements the maintenance and trimming up of some of the outlying roads cannot be properly or regularly carried out and I recommend that the following be placed under contract viz - (1) Dunbar Road, (2) Greenhill Road, (3) Cottage Road, (4) Chapel Road and

(5) Rocky Road, each of these are over half a mile long and would probably be taken up by the adjoining County Contractor. Your present staff of men could then devote their whole time to the streets.

Talked to Contractor for the Foreshore Works to leave a foot-path between the plant and the material deposited on the Murrong and the little gardens facing the sea so that people can approach their houses from the Outer Murrong, he has failed to do so, it might be well if the Council wrote the Harbour Board on the matter.

I hereby report to you a case of Cerebo-Spinal Meningitis in Ullaw District - John Doyle, Strand St, Wicklow, and I recommend that the premises be thoroughly disinfected and house limewashed bed clothing etc to be burnt after being valued by Sanitary Officer Doyle. Doctor Browne M.D. Local Board also saw this man and confirmed diagnosis - Patient has been removed to Fever Hospital

Town Clerk stated that Sanitary Officer Doyle had reported to him (verbally) that the houses and premises had been thoroughly disinfected, the paper from the walls removed and burnt and house limewashed, the bedding was also burnt and Mr Doyle cautioned not to send her children to School -

Report No II. With reference to the burning of bedding and clothing belonging to John Doyle who was removed to Fever Hospital suffering from Cerebo Spinal Meningitis on the 13th Inst, I find that Sanitary Officer Doyle had it conveyed and burnt on the Inner Murnagh near the crossing at Railway Bridge in the middle of the afternoon when there were a large number of children and visitors there the cart going within a few yards of some of the children, this action on his part was very injudicious and unnecessary and it is quite inconceivable to me that the source of infection should be conveyed through one of the most populous parts of the Town and burnt in practically speaking a public park. The house occupied by Mr Doyle was at the end of Strand St near the Steam Packet Pier and the cart would have had to pass about nine houses till it came to a piece of ground which is not frequented by the Public and where they might have been burnt in comparative safety. I have had several complaints about this and I need hardly remark that the burning of the clothing in such a public place is not likely to add to the reputation of Wicklow as a Health Resort. I cannot imagine anything more likely to drive visitors out of the Town - S. S. O. Doyle should also recollect that neither the Pier or Outer Murnagh is a suitable place for the burning of horses or the depositing of ash-pits, broken bottles &c &c
