Town Surveyor's Report
3rd August 1915.

Owing to wet weather and want of sufficient men the
streets and roads in the Urban District are not in a satisfactory
state - With the exception of Bolarney Road all the outgoing
roads and some of the back streets have the drains and water
courses choked up with grass and weeds, no work having
been done on them for several months -

Upper Strand St, Cottago Road, Harbour Road and Colley
St are in an unsanitary state, the former being converted
into an elongated ash-pit and deposit for remains of old carts
and the water courses in the three latter being full of dirt
and decayed vegetable matter - The following matters
require immediate attention -

1. Weed Killer should be provided for panel channels in the town.
2. Several Stop cocks are without iron covers.
3. Flush tank opposite Grand Hotel should be connected with
Abbey river -
4. Dust-boxes on sewer ventilators and all street-gullies are
choked up with dirt - Sometimes a disinfectant is poured
into dirty gullies which is quite useless, clearing them and
sealing them with water is the proper course to adopt -
5. There is a bad deposit in Lane at the Northern boundary of the
Convent premises (Stanlows Plot) this should be at once abolished.
6. No steps have been taken in regard to the flushing cistern at
N.C. School House -
7. Melancholy Lane bad with projecting hedge and choked water-table
8. Post and Chain fence broken down on Marlowe,
9. Low overhanging boughs in Bachelor's Walk should be cut;
10. I recommend that a concrete water wall be built south of Glades
Forge on Marlton Road to prevent storm water from flooding Wentworths

The householders on Church Hill should be requested to deposit
their dust-bins close to the public road, the Scavenger and his man
waste a lot of time walking to and from each house, four times in
8 or 9 cases a distance of from 40 to 60 yards from road. This
time should be spent in remedying some of the defects above men-

Gentlemen, I beg to report that I have audited the accounts
 of the Wicklow Urban District-Council for the year ended 31st
 March last. Dutifully certified abstracts thereof are transmitted
 herewith.

As regards the books, presented by the Rent-Collector,
 Mr. Woolittle, I am unable to certify to anything in them
 save their obvious incorrectness. Now the arrears were
 not correctly brought forward from last year. Certain
 arrears stated to be irrecoverable, have never been sub-
 mitted to the Council, or ruled off them by any way. Hence
 they must be carried forward until so dealt with.

It passes my comprehension how the Council

Our Executive Sanitary Officer has laid before us reports from the Medical Officer of Health dealing with five cases of diphtheria and five of Scarlet Fever.

In all cases the Patients have been removed in the ambulance car to Fever Hospital, houses disinfected, bedding and clothes destroyed, paper removed from the walls of the apartments, walls limewashed and every precautionary measure taken to prevent the spread of the disease. The bedding and wall paper was removed and burnt by our Sanitary Officer. - Where children are on the premises, the Parents have been cautioned not to send them to school and isolate them from the public.

With reference to Salors case the Inspector of Dairies has had the milk vessels removed from off the premises to New St and thoroughly cleansed, cows are being milked on the lands and no person from Salors premises Abbey Street allowed to be in touch with the milking or distribution of milk.

Our Committee approve of the precautionary measures taken and request the Sanitary Officers not to relax their efforts and do all in their power to stamp out the disease.

Town Surveyor's Report
5th October 1915

The condition of the public works in your district is not at all satisfactory. A few of the principal streets have been fairly attended to during the quarter, but the high level streets and roads are neglected and are in a bad state with rough jolting surfaces, water channels choked up with grass and weeds, briars and thorns projecting out over the working way. The time of the two Scavengers is wholly occupied with domestic and public scavenging and obviously the other men are not able to repair and maintain 10 miles of roads. I recommend the Council to employ a sufficient staff to put the roads in reasonable order. Of course the longer this work is delayed the more costly it will become. Portions of the girders in the wooden bridge are rotten, planks loose and grass growing in the joints; this work should be done at once. A large piece of the palisade and posts at the far Woods have been taken up and carried away by some person or persons unknown.

The water meter diagram, herewith, is satisfactory, the weeds should be removed from the Reservoir while the water is low. The tramway rails in Strand St should be adjusted and the track metalled.

The following places are in a most unsatisfactory condition with every description of refuse and filth, Lower Strand St, Nott St, Ball Alley at Convent-Boundary wall (reported on previously) water course on Harbour Road under Castle St, water course opposite Antiguan Dwellings Cottages Road, stagnant duck ponds on this in addition to the other matters.

Sanitary Sub Officers Report
4th October 1915

I respectfully beg to report that during the past month I made my usual sanitary inspections visiting 169 premises and served seven notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes.

The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. The usual disinfecting of main drains and washing down of Doctor's Steps was carried out satisfactorily. I have noticed during the flushing and disinfecting of the sewers that there is an accumulation of sewage matter in Main St, Castle St and Strand St Sewers, and apparently the flushing is not able to remove the sediment. I respectfully suggest that the Town Surveyor's attention be called to this matter with a view to have the sewers put in proper working order. I cannot too strongly urge on the Council the immediate necessity of having this matter attended to at once.

During the month I had ten patients removed to Fever Hospital in Ambulance Car and 6 premises disinfected and some bedding destroyed by burning as ordered by the Medical Officer of Health.

The Scavengers were attentive to their work. The Bathing Boxes have been removed to storage and I await your directions with regard to the public seats.

The old wheel pump on Summer Hill should be removed to storage as the top of same is detached from the body and dangerous to children.
