Sanitary Supt Officers Report

30th April 1917

During the month I inspected 286 premises, and served nine notices under the Public Health Acts all of which have been complied with. Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. The flushing and disinfecting of main drainage was carried out satisfactory. Complaints were made that an obstruction had occurred in Strand St. Sewer owing to it not been flushed, on examination it was found to be in thorough working order moreover this sewer is flushed twice weekly, a similar report was made to the late Mr. Parry with the same result. I beg to bring under your notice dangerous state of premises owned by Mr. Thomas Woolittle on South Quay and I recommend that notice be served on the owner to have it remedied same being in a dangerous condition and a receptacle for nuisances - On the 9th Inst at 8.30 pm a fire occurred at Messrs Haskins premises Bridge St. I had the fire apparatus and hose laid on to the building and the fire extinguished in a short time. I beg to apply for my usual uniform clothing.

The springs are closing since the 1st of the month and the water in Reservoir is down 1-9' from old overflow.
