Acting San Sub Officer's Report  
3rd December 1918

During the second week of last month I had a 100 tons of Macadam spread on the road between the Railway gate and Bridge Street. In consequence of the heavy traffic it was necessary to have it recovered this week again. There were three wagon loads of stones spread on the South Quay. I had three drains repaired viz:- One on the Nunbar Road, and two on Hillside a new pipe drain was laid, and kerb stone set at the dangerous part of the road.

It was necessary to call the Scavenger's attention to the proper cleaning of the water channels and gully traps as they are overflowing and so causing damage to the surface of the streets.

I supplied 150 persons with lime and a 130 premises were limewashed.

I inspected 290 premises and served 8 notices under the Public Health Act, six of which were complied with.

During the month 5 patients were removed to hospital - two from the rural district and 5 premises were disinfected. Since your last meeting several lamps were broken but otherwise the lighting of the town was satisfactory.

### Sanitary Sub Officer's Report 1<sup>st</sup> January 1919

I beg to report that I took up duty on 21<sup>st</sup> December 1918, during which time I inspected 135 premises, and served 30 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes. In twenty cases the notices have been complied with and in the remaining ten cases the notices have not been complied with.

On my inspection of the Township I find a large number of premises with neither drains, ashpits or closets, and in a good many cases the drains are choked up, with the result that the Yards are in a very bad state. Also there are several premises with accumulation of manure etc, and I have served those parties with notices to have same removed. I shall be glad to have the Council's instructions in the matter of making the Owners of houses who have no sanitary accommodation to provide the necessary accommodation as soon as possible.

The Public lighting of the Town has not been satisfactory the cause I understand being that the lamps are continually being broken.

The Scavenger's work on the Streets during my time of the month is not at all satisfactory.

Since your last meeting I had 30 tons of Screening spread on footpaths, also 200 tons of Macadam spread on the different streets. It was necessary to have drains and water ways cleaned on the Marlton Road and the Rathnew Road. With the exception of the Main Street and Church Street there is no improvement in the cleaning of the gully traps and water channels by the Scavenger.

During the month I called the Timber Merchants' attention to the danger of blocking up the thoroughfare on the South Quay with timber. They had some removed but still there is only about 7 ft of a passage in some parts.

Several complaints have been made against Mr Alex Ryland Bollaney for allowing his pigs to stray and causing damage to the roads; as he paid no attention to my warnings I want your instructions on the matter.

#### Waterworks Overseer's Report

6<sup>th</sup> January 1919

I beg to submit my first monthly report since taking over care of Waterworks. The Reservoir is full to overflowing. Filtering beds have been thoroughly cleaned but there is a great many leaks in wall of same. It is impossible however to repair those leaks until summer season, when the Reservoir is at its lowest. The water suddenly reduced in pressure on 14<sup>th</sup> Dec 1918, leaving Convent without water, I proceeded to Waterworks, and found No. 1. Filter off which the Town was being supplied, was not able to keep enough water in fresh water chamber, so I immediately turned on No. 2. Set of filters, and the water in the fresh water chamber, started coming up to usual level, thus leaving pressure alright again. On examining No. 1. Filters I found Ball valve jammed, I repaired same and left it in working order.

I repaired leaks in fountains at Bond Street, Castle Street and Ball Alley, and found a number of leaks in private houses, which were repaired.
