HOUSING COMMITTEE MEETING
30th JUNE, 1919

Your Housing Committee met this evening and inspected building Sites at Castle Street, Monkton Row etc, and after careful consideration have selected the Field in the occupation of Mrs Graham, as the most suitable building Site for Labourers Cottages.

Before your Committee can proceed any further with the Scheme it will be necessary to have the following particulars:-

- (1) Plans of a few types of houses and estimates of their probable cost.
- (2) Estimate of the incidental costs, equitable value of Site, law costs, Engineer's fees, making approaches, roads, water, sewers etc.

Only with this data before us can we estimate probable rent, therefore we recommend the immediate employment of an Architect to give us preliminary figures under these headings in order to guide the Council in determining the Site and number of houses they propose to build.

Medical Officer of Health's Reports

No. 1.

I hereby report to you that the ground in front of Gregory's Cottages is very dusty and in a bad sanitary state. This is due to the fact that there is no proper Gully way in front of these Cottages. These cottages are on a slope so water tends to flow towards the houses; and I recommend that a permanent Gully-way of concrete be built in front of these cottages. This would obviate any tendency to collections of water and refuse and it could be cleaned very easily.

No. 2.

I hereby report to you that there are a group of houses in Bond Street in a very bad sanitary state. The Yards at back of these houses have no drains and in winter the water simply lodges there. There are no W. C's or any attempt at proper sewerage; and I recommend that these yards be improved and some sort of sewerage system be installed.

No. 3.

There are 5 houses in Strand Street which are in a very bad state of repair. There is only one room in each house to accommodate a whole family. There are no sanitary arrangements of any kind. These houses are hardly fit for human habitation, and I recommend that these houses be put into repair as soon as possible or else be condemned as unfit to live in.
