

San Sub Officer's Report  
1<sup>st</sup> July 1919

During the month I inspected 300 premises and served 12 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes, which were complied with, and also had six premises lime-washed and gave lime for same.

I had the main sewerage and all gully traps disinfected twice during the month. The Bathing Boxes are at their usual place on the beach. I invited several persons to apply to the Council for the caretakers of same.

The Scavenger work during the month is not satisfactory and the Medical Officer called my attention to Upper and Lower Strand St, and Upper Monkton Row, which is not cleaned often enough. I have sent the Scavenger time after time to those places and found the streets not cleaned, and I had to get the Council men to clean out the gully traps several times during the month.

Dairy Inspector reported that the Cowkeepers continue to keep their premises in a satisfactory condition.

Road Overseer reported that he had the allotment plots on the Convent Road fenced and the palings repaired on the Murragh, the Wooden Bridge cleaned and the loose planks secured also the water ways cleaned and the grass picked at Wentworth Place, Abbey Street, Main Street, The Mall, Castle Street, Kilmartin Hill, St Patrick's Hill & High Street.

The Waterworks Overseer Reported that Water in Reservoir was 3 ft 4" ins below old overflow & enumerated work done during the month; he also asked for permission to have weeds etc removed from upper portion of Reservoir.

new piping be laid down in this house so as to produce proper flushing.

5 August 1919

I beg to report that during the month I inspected upwards of 400 premises, and served 9 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes which were complied with, and also had six premises lime-washed. The main Sewerage from the New St houses got choked during the month. I had the obstruction removed by the Council's men.

I had all gully traps and pipe outlet disinfected twice during the month.

The Wooden railing along Bachelor's Walk is in need of repairs as some of the standards and lengths are rotten and falling down.

The Scavenging work of the Streets was done by the Council's men during the month.

During the month I made several inspection of the lodging-houses and found they are not keeping any nightly men in any of them since I served notice on them. Two of the Market Hall Windows have been broken with stones from the Quay.

The Water coming from the Well itself looks quite good.

Members Wicklow Urban District Council.

Gentlemen:

Accompanied by the Chairman Mr S. J. Doyle, Councillor Murtagh, and the Town Clerk, I made a careful inspection of a number of sites in connection with the proposed Housing Scheme and beg to report thereon as follows:-

No. 1. On the corners of Monkton Row and the Main Road leading to Glanbar, in the occupation of Mr Graham. This plot would be most unsuitable for a building site as there are extensive indications of outcrops of rock.

No. 2. Situate in Castle Street. A very small plot, on portion of which stand two thatched cottages occupied by Kinsella & Byrne. This site being in a very congested and overcrowded area it would, in my opinion, be inadvisable to erect cottages thereon.

No. 3. A field on the Green Hill Road. This site which at its lowest point stands some six feet over the road, is of very uneven surface, consequently building thereon would be expensive.

No. 4. A field opposite the Coastguard Station, in the occupation of Mr Wall. Practically the same remarks apply to this as to site No. 1.

No. 5. A field adjacent to the Coastguard Station, Mr Delahunt occupies, together with adjoining field in occupation of Mr Flynn. This would be in every respect an admirable building site of all those inspected it is the only one I could recommend to the Council as suitable for the proposed Housing Scheme.
