San Sab Officer's Report
3rd August 1920

I inspected 200 premises, and served 6 notices under Public Health Act for various Sanitary purposes which were complied with. The usual flushing of main drainage and Gully Traps has been carried out satisfactorily.

Some months ago the cover was carried away off the flushing trap in the Marlton River. I would recommend that a new Cover be obtained for same as the pipes are filling up with the rubbish of the river.

The Doctor-steps leading to the Quay at Main Street is getting in a bad state as several of the steps have gone down. I believe that the shore that runs down same has broken down and is causing the complaint.

During the month I served notice on a Timber Merchant for throwing timber on the road at the South Quay, the same has not been complied with and at one part the Road space is only 9 ft. I went to the Merchant the second time and he promised to remove it off the road same had not been done and is a danger to the public.

Waterworks Overseer reported Water in Reservoir is down 1'-2" below old overflow, this means there is 11 inches more water in it than last month.

No. 1. Filter Beds were cleaned out during the month.

I repaired Fountain in Lower Strand Street and on Kilmartin Hill, and put in part new service to Woodenbridge Fountain. I would require an new instrument for night testing, as the one in use at present is broken.

I shall thank the Council to give an order for a leak locator, and also 10 fountains requires new internal fittings. A Pipe locator is also required.

Road Overseer's Report:- I beg to report that men continue cleaning water-ways & hedges trimmed. There is an old stone shore at Kilmartin Hill into which a pipe sewer from Mr Hylands house is laid and as there is very little water passing through it, the sewerage matter lodges and causes a breakage as the walls are decayed.

If pipes were laid and water diverted from the opposite side of the street, it would prevent this happening.

*San Sub Officer's Report
4th Sept 1920*

During the month I inspected upwards 300 premises and served 5 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes, three of these notices have been complied with and the other two is under consideration. There has been 2 cases of diphtheria in the Town, and by orders of Medical officer I had the two premises disinfected and the inner walls properly sprayed. Owing to complaints about Flag Water been turned into the

public stream on the Marlton Road I took a sample at the overflow and sent it to Sir Charles Cameron for analysis. There is some of the railing broke down on the Bachelor's Walk by cattle going to the railway from enquiries I made I believe the cattle belonged to (Casement, Cronne, Ashford) The disinfecting of the mains and gully traps has been done twice during the month. The flag over the Town Hall has been taken away twice by night during the month and the Halliards cut down. A fire broke out in Main St about 4 p.m. on the 3rd Sept. I had the fire apparatus and 8 men engaged putting out same and sent on there names to the Town Clerk for payment. The Scavengers work on the Streets is satisfactory

As no tradesman was available to lay the sewer pipes at Kilmarlin Hill the work had to stand over. The decayed trees at the Mall should be removed and replaced by new plants.
