#### Finance Committee's Report 4<sup>th</sup> Oct 1920

Your Finance Committee met this evening and have had before us Soss Rate Collector's Accounts together with lists of irrecoverable rates + rates outstanding for half year ended 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 1920. We wish to draw the Council's attention to the following:—

1. The Collector did not close his collection within the half year.
2. The Collector did not lodge the full amount of his Warrant in accordance with the terms of his Bond.
3. During the year there were several underlodgements made, and this occurred through the carelessness of the Collector in not checking his totals. These sums amounting to £3-9/- have not yet been lodged.
4. We find receipts amounting to £17-0-1 in respect of 2<sup>nd</sup> moiety of Soss Rate missing from the blocks.
5. The Collector has also in hand £2-4-7 which he has not lodged with the Treasurer.
6. We also recommend that the Collector's attention be called to the fact that he does not enter on the counterfoil the date on which he receives the rates. This must be done.
7. We have deferred going further into his accounts until the full amount of his warrant is lodged.

During the past month some shingle was broken and spread in the ruts on the Rathnew & Railway Roads. A footpath is been made with material carted from Mr Clarke's premises and deposited by his men at Bond Street. A Shore was made on the Dunbar Road near Ardkeen House to carry away the water that used to lodge there.

A second gully trap would be necessary in Strand Street to help to carry away the overflow of water, and the present one properly connected as it frequently chokes and so a lot of time is lost clearing it.

I wish to bring to your notice that the Saling at the back of Ken's Bake house has been broken and so affords no protection to the Public. The embankment inside the little gate near the Woodenbridge is in a dangerous way also

San Sub Officer's Report  
5<sup>th</sup> Oct 1920

During the month I inspected upwards 250 premises and served 5 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes. Three of these notices have been complied with and the other two not. There has been three cases of Diphtheria. Two of these cases are belonging to Fever Hospital. I had the other premises disinfected. The usual flushing & disinfecting of the Sewers & gully traps has been done twice during the month. I inspected the four houses in Lower Strand Street as ordered. I found that in each case the ceilings have been replaced and new floors laid down and the plaster inside the walls repaired where necessary and the outer walls cemented. The Closets are not sanitary as there is no way left to clean them and can only be used by placing a bucket or some moveable vessel in them as ordered

by Medical officer of Health. On my inspection of Upper Monkton Row I found a Pig housed in a living room. I had notice served to have it removed same has not been done up to the time of writing. I wish to have the Council's instructions on the distance a Piggeny should be from a living room. During the week the storm water flooded the houses in Lower Strand Street, the cause of same I believe is due to the gully-trap been too small and would require another gully trap about the middle of the Street.

One of the Council's houses at High Street is in an insanitary condition and will need to have some repairs done before the bad weather sets in.

The Scavengers work on the Streets is satisfactory. I wish to have the Council's instructions to remove the seats from the Murrugh to the Store for the Winter.

Waterworks Overseer's Report:- Water in Reservoir is down 2'-8" below old overflow. I flushed mains in Castle St, Summer Hill, St Patrick's Road, Convent Road, Murrugh, & Wentworth Place. The mains are in a bad way with rust and do not seem to improve with flushing. No. 1. Filtering beds are now turned on. I might mention that the leak in this bed seems to be increasing. I repaired fountains on Friars Hill and in Strand St. I also packed Sluice valves in High St & Market Square.
