The main dram in Castle Street, is chocked with sand and requires to be tapped to clean out pipes, I wish the Council's permission to tap same.

The pipes carrying water from well (known as Colley Weil) is chocked and requires to be opened up and cleared, the concrete slab on the top of same has been removed by some persons.

On the morning of the 21st ultimo, a fire was reported to me which broke out in a premises on St.Patrick's Road, I had eight men engeged with the fire hose and after about three hours we succeeded in having the fire put out.

With the Council's instructions I had the Gully-traps at High Street and Kilmantan Hill, connected with main drain, and the Well at Upper Monkton Row filled in with cement and stones, to road level.

During the month the Council's men were also engaged on the Church Hill Road, Brickfield Lane, Marlton Road, Cooper's Lane and St. Patrick's Road, clearing up water; tables and trimming

briars, and clearing river-bed at Woodenbridge.

I had the public seats removed off the Piers and Murrough to Stores.

ENGINEER'S REPORT.

The making of the section of the Rathnew-Wicklow Road is proceeding fairly satisfactorily.

The stones from the beach, which had been raised prior to my arrival in Wicklow, have proved, as I thought and said at the time, a difficult proposition. The rolling and consolidation of these stones requires double the time, of that required in ordinary rolling.

I found it impossible in several cases during the work to follow the Specification as handed to me when I took over the work.

The use of local stone is indicated in this Specification and I was forced to reject this stone as it was of a slatey nature and unsuitable for use in a surface coat, though it may be consolidated as a first coat.

I procured several cubic yards of good stone from Ballylusk

Quarry and have a gang of men working in Murren Hill Quarry, for the

past four weeks. The expense of hauling from these Quarries

and the double carting from the Mill-Yard crusher, of coarse raised the cost of the material very much above that allowed in the Specification, but this factor is not to be considered when good material is obtained.

The portion of the road between the White Gates and Mr Steven's entrance has always been, and is, in a very bad condition and here again I found it necessary to go outside the Specification and am compelled to give the road two layers of material, first a spread of 3 to 6 inch stones and then a surfacing of 5 inches. That will require of coarse, a large quantity of stone, about twice the specified amount, but this will put the road in a proper condition

Six hundred yards of road has been raised and rolled.

About one hindred yards has been tarred.

During the month the Council's men were engaged on all roads throughout the district, cleaning out Gullies and repairing roads that were toren up by the heavy rain storms, and in several cases drains had to be opened up and cleared, and in one case and old disused cellar on footpath at Morton's Tame, fell in, I had same filled in.
