Engineer's Report.

3rd November, 1925.

The rolling has been completed to the corner of the Marlton Road, being a total length of 1100 yards approximately.

The cost to the 31st October, 1925 is £2400.

I have, therefore £5 on hands and it will require £95 to finish

the rolling to the setts at Laror's corner which would be a very suitable ending, I have about half the quantity of stone required for this at present at the Abbey. I shall require about £80 to finish the surface with tar and chips when the fine weather sets in and it will therefore be necessary to stop the roller and gang tomorrow unless the Council see their way to agree to adopt the following proposition:

I propose to let the Council have about 60 cubic yards of broken stone at present left over and which I consider unfit for rolling at 10/- per cubic yard. This will make £30 available for use in tarring.

I have already passed payment to your Council on my paysheets for the sum of £22: 15 : 0 for sea stone which had been raised and broken prior to this Council's term of office. Should you see your way to allow this sum to be allocated to this road Grant for tarring purposes I would then have £52: 12 : 0.

At the end of this week, working full time I will have £5 remaining out of £2500. This together with the £52: 12 : 0 will leave a total of £57: 15 : 0, available for surfacing the road at a later date with tar and chips.

On the 19th October, I foresaw, that owing to lack of sufficient cars and bad weather, a shortage of materials for rolling would take place and was compelled to hire a lorry to draw from the Quarry.

I had to engage this lorry for a certain period as the owners could not guarantee it without two days notice, and gave it reluctantly only when I explained the special circumstances of the position.

The Carters had sufficient work at the time in Murrin Hill Quarry, but only a small number turned out, I had experienced trouble in this respect with certain Carters before, when they preferred to leave the road job, and got to work of a lighter, and, possibly, more lucrative nature and I was not prepared to take the risk again of allowing the rolling to be held up and the men engaged with the roller stopped.

WICKLOW FORESHORE PROTECTION WORKS

Gentlemen,

I to-day inspected the protection Works. The south easterly Gale of Sunday last which synchronized with Spring Tides cut away a considerable amount of the Beach (for a depth of about 4' 6") at the southern end of the repaired pitched slope. The sea washed under two of the concrete blocks and slightly undermined a small area of the pitched slope which being green showed cracks, it was found necessary to put in 1½ c Yds of concrete to make this good.

I am arranging for the construction of a concrete apron for the retaining wall. Having regard to the violence of the sea and in view of the fact that the work is of such recent construction I consider that it has stood well, it is fortunate that it was so far advanced when this gale took place.

 the month.

The water-table on Summer Hill at the crossing leading to Colley Street
 has sunk and requires a 6 inch pipe laid along in water-table, and
 the road made up on Summer Hill side of same to suit the pipes.

The length of pipes required are 11 yards.

The footpath in Bridge Street, at Miss Kennedy's premises, the flags
 have worn in the centres of same, and the rain water lodges on the

flags and then soaks into the premises.

I recommend a Committee to inspect these two places.

Several flags along the Main Street also requires resetting.

During the last storm several slates were blown off roof of the
 Boathouse and require to be replaced.

During the month the Council's men were engaged on all roads
 repairing water-gullies and catch-pits, and had 102 loads of stones
 carted off Rathnew Road and spread on the different parts of the roads
 that required same.

Owing to the bad state of the roads I require a 100 loads of stones
 to spread this month.

The balance of the stones on the Rathnew Road is only suitable to
 spread on the North Quay.

I had about 20 loads of fines from the Mill Yard spread on footpaths.

wants repairing as the pointing between the brickwork is all gone.

Sub-Sanitary Officer's Report

4th January, 1926

Inspected 30 premises and served two notices for defective drainage which were complied with. The flushing of the Main Drainage and disinfecting of the Urinals on the North & South Quays were carried out weekly during the month.

Owing to complaints from Residents of the dumping of refuse at the rear of their premises (by persons unknown) at night also the same is happening at the Public Fountains throughout the District I wish the Council's advice as this practice is growing worse at night."

During Christmas week 102 men were employed throughout the district at extra work as recommended by the Committee. Owing to the continuous Frost the finishing course of Cement on new Footpath Bridge Street has not set hard. During the month the Council's men were engaged spreading stones on the several Paths:- Summer Hill, Leitrim Place, Church Hill, Abbey Street, and had 110 yds Stones spread on the Streets. Owing to the bad weather I had to scrap off mud at Bond Street, Monkton Row, Rocky Rd and South Quay. Owing to bad condition of the Roads for stones it will take 100 yds to do this season.
