



Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

3rd May, 1927

Inspected 217 premises and submit list of premises showing the sanitary accommodation of same. The usual flushing of the main drainage and the disinfecting of the Gully traps and Urinals on the North & South Quays have been carried out weekly. Had the sewerage cleaned out between the Council's Premises in Bond Street and Strand Street.

By the Council's instructions had about 34 yds of concrete curbing laid at the Corners of Bath & Strand Streets and filled up with old material to form a Path. Had 12yds of Cement Paving made and erected at the Bond Street end of the Stone Bridge. During the month had all loose stones removed off the Streets and carted to depot by the Council's men who are at present engaged at the quarterly cleaning of water tables, catch pits etc. I had 12 loads of



material carted to Church Road and spread in water table to level up same and sunk a French shore at Boat-House to carry out surface water lying at same. The men are at present on Newline Road cleaning.

Had hose of water Car repaired and the Car-working watering Main Streets.

I wish a Committee to inspect the Woodenbridge to have their opinion as I believe it to be dangerous to heavy traffic.

Report on Slaughter Yards

Inspected Yard and Slaughter House of Mr Nuzum, Fitzwilliam Square. The premises is in good repair and has both sewerage and water and is suitable for a Slaughter House.

Inspected Yard and Premises of Mr O'Neill's New Street and his Son pointed out the House they intend to make a Slaughter House. The premises would be suitable if the alterations were carried out. The premises is not suitable in its present state.

WATERWORKS OVERSEER'S REPORT

3rd May, 1927

There is now 17ft 9 ins of Water in the Reservoir. On this date last year there was 17ft and the water was decreasing at the rate of about one inch per day. At present the water is holding its own.

During the month I repaired Fountains on the Murrough, St Patrick's Road and Main on Church Hill., also fitted in new piece of pipe to Pound Yard.

I would like if it be possible for the Council to get a Set of Stocks and dies, also taps and plugs, to enable me to put new threads in heads of fountains as the threads are worn out and a lot of the heads cannot be properly fixed on.

Eletrical Engineer's Report

3rd May, 1927

During the month ending April 30th Plant has been running satisfactorily and all services maintained as usual. The lighting of the Streets and Harbour has been discontinued since the coming in force of summer time, and if it is intended to carry out any of the proposed alterations to Harbour lights I would be glad to be notified as early as possible.

It will be necessary after the Winter running to dismantle and carry out all repairs which may be needed to Engines & Generators. I have put this work in hand, I also propose to replace the underground Mains leading from Power Station to upper portion of Town with overhead wiring as considerable trouble was caused during winter by Water coming in under Engine Room floor.

During the month I collected and lodged £192 : 2 : 5.

There were five tenders received and considered for supplying and delivering 30 tons of Fine Sand to Waterworks. The tenders were from 6/6 to 10/- per ton.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

6th June, 1927

Inspected 115 premises and submit lists showing the sanitary accommodation of the small houses in the District.

The usual flushing of the main drainage and the disinfecting of the Gully Traps and the Urinals on the North & South Quays were carried out weekly during the month.

By the Council's instructions had two new pitch pine lengths put in Woodenbridge and a new length of Concrete laid in same. The timber of bridge now requires to be painted as it is starting to decay at the ends.

During the month the new fine sand was delivered at the Filtering beds as per contract. I had one of the Council's men employed putting part of the new Sand into No.1. Bed and cleaning up catch pits.

One of the Filtering Beds now working needs cleaning and some new Sand put into it.

Repaired Fountains at High St and Quarantine Hill. Made several night tests and served 14 notices for waste through leakage. Turned water off of a number of houses owing through bad leaks

There are a number of houses with defective fittings which cannot be properly repaired, and are giving a lot of trouble from time to time

There is now 16ft 1 inch of Water in the Reservoir on same date last year there was 14ft 5 inches. I should like the Frame of the Cottage Door put in repair.

Electrical Engineer's Report

7th June, 1927

I beg to submit report for month ending 31st May. During this period Plant has been running when required and all services supplied continuously, I am at present engaged on the running of new overhead mains from Power Station to replace underground Cables damaged by water during the Winter. I have prepared specification for cleaning and painting of Standards and hope it may be possible to put this work in hand at once. One new Consumer has been connected to Council's Mains and one new service completed. During the month I collected and lodged £104 : 5 : 11.

Inspected 30 premises and served 2 notices under the Public Health Act for accumulation of Manure which have been complied with.

The usual flushing of the main drainage and the disinfecting of the Urinals on the North and South Quays have been carried out weekly during the month. Owing to some person or persons throwing large Stones into the inlets of the Urinal on the North Quay, I had to close up two of the inlets which leaves only one inlet for use

now I wish the Council's permission to have the Main Street cleaned at an early hour on Sunday mornings during the month of July and August.

During the month the Council's Men were engaged on Church Rd, St Patrick's, Rokeby Rd and Green Hill Rd cleaning and side dressing same and their services have been required at Waterworks and with the Electrical Engineer. Owing to large Pond of Water at High St it is necessary that the Gully Trap be laid as recommended by the Committee sometime ago.

I require half a dozen lime brushes for lime washing purposes.
