#### 6. PPP Social Housing Project

#### [Bundle 1)

Development Site at Convent Lands, Wicklow. The Department of Housing has dedicated €300 million towards delivery of housing through the public, private partnership model in the Rebuilding Ireland Action Plan. Wicklow has been included as a project in Bundle 1. The Part 8 was passed by the members at the Council Meeting of 3rd July 2017.

#### 7. Approved Housing Bodies (AHBs)

Capital Advance Leasing Facility (CALF) - 5 units were provided under a CALF lease to Co-operative Housing on the Greenpark Road in Bray.

Approval has been received from the Department of Housing, Planning Community and Local Government for a leasing arrangement with Cluid to provide 45 units of accommodation on the Council's site at St. Earnan's View, Ballybeg, Rathnew. Estimated delivery date of these units is quarter 3 2019.

A new CALF project with Tuath Housing was approved on 20th September 2017 for 32 units at Bollarney North, Wicklow Town. There is currently no start or completion date available.

**Capital Assistance Scheme (CAS)** The CAS call for 2017 has been recently advertised.

Expressions of Interest – Social Housing on Council lands - A preferred proposal has been identified.

#### 8. Housing Schemes Remediation

#### Glending, Blessington - Remediation

Stage 2 and Stage 3 Phase 3A – No 1 to No. 12 Glending Road has been completed.

#### 11. Wicklow Sports Partnership

Sports Capital 2017 – Wicklow Overall Allocation - €1.796.244

71 applications submitted in total from Wicklow for Sports Capital grants 2017. 8 Applications were deemed invalid, 60 applications successful to date. A further 3 applications are being assessed under Regional applications which are worth up to max. €200,000 and there is €4 million allocated nationally to this section.

#### **Parkrun Wicklow**

First Adult Parkrun (A free timed 5km run) was held on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> of December in Russborough House, Blessington and will continue every Saturday morning @ 9:30am. Over 100 people took part in this event.

The next adult Parkrun at planning stage is for Avondale House, Rathdrum.

**Operation Transformation 2018** Operation 2018 will take place on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> of January. Wicklow walks are planned for Blessington, Arklow and Bray for 2018.

#### **Dormant Accounts Allocation**

- €16,000 allocated to run an intervention programme for teenage girls in conjunction with the Ladies Gaelic Football Association.
- €13,000 allocated to run a 2018 community coaching activation programme.
- Awaiting results on Urban Outdoor Adventure programme for Bray with an allocation of €50,000.

#### Wicklow Healthy Ireland Fund Allocation 2017

Wicklow has secured €135,000 for the promotion of health and well-being in the county under the Health Ireland Fund.

The money was jointly secured by the Wicklow Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) and Children and Young People Services Committee (CYPSC).

Healthy Ireland, the government framework for action to improve the health and wellbeing of people living in Ireland over the coming generation, was launched in March 2013. It sets out actions that will be undertaken by Government Departments, public sector organisations, businesses, communities and individuals to improve health and wellbeing and reduce the risks posed to future generations.

Wicklow's Healthy Ireland application from the LCDC and CYPSC involved projects from multiple agencies, including Wicklow County Council, Wicklow Sports Partnership, HSE, Bray Area Partnership, County Wicklow Partnership, KWETB and Wicklow Child and Family Project.

There are a number of exciting programmes planned under this initiative, namely an inclusive mid-term activity camp, physical activity training for preschool teachers, older adults exercise HSE physiotherapist programmes, programmes, mental health and physical activity interventions, literacy friendly health and well-being courses for adults, social eating programmes, Healthy Ireland Week, Fostering Healthy Families and Kids Go Smoke Free.



The application included the development of a Healthy Wicklow Strategic Plan that will begin development in early 2018. This plan will inform future Healthy Ireland applications from County Wicklow and will provide a vision on how to best implement the Healthy Ireland plan throughout Wicklow.

This investment and interagency collaboration has resulted in a very strong application from Wicklow and an exciting opportunity to take the first steps in making Wicklow a healthy place to live for this and future generations.

#### 12. Wicklow Library

Tender process has commenced for an architect and team to lead up the new Wicklow library and Archives project, with a closing date of the first week of January for submissions. A number of firms have now visited the building and expressed interest in tendering for the project.

#### 13. Business Information

Thanks to grant aid from Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government, Vision-Net will be available to all Wicklow library users in 2018. This will provide online access to all the latest Irish /UK/NI Company, business and director information. All data is sourced from the Company Registration Office, the UK Companies House, the Courts, National Newspapers and the Insolvency Service. The product is currently used daily by a number of county councils, libraries, the media industry, banks, solicitors and general industry. All Wicklow County Council library members may access Vision-net remotely including home, mobile phone etc.

#### **14. SICAP**

- Unsuccessful tender bids were submitted by Bray Area Partnership and Co. Wicklow Partnership for their respective Lot areas for SICAP 2018-2022 contract.
- Wicklow LCDC are therefore now entering a negotiated procedure with both parties to assist them in compiling a better quality tender document.

### 2. Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) Action Plan

The Economic Development Unit of the Enterprise and Corporate Services Directorate is charged with implementing the economic actions in the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP). Many of the 142 actions listed in the LECP have come from the County Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) Action Plan. The CWETT which was initiated in 2013 was a collaborative project initiated by Wicklow County Council and involved the business community from across the county and the County Enterprise Board (now LEO Wicklow).

#### **BRAND**

The Endless Opportunities Brand will be re-launched in January 2018, in conjunction with the web-portal launch.

#### **FILM**

Wicklow County Council continues to liaise with local service providers and state agencies with regard to the development of the film industry in County Wicklow. The development of Wicklow County Campus as a Content Creation hub, with possible funding from the Regional Enterprise Development fund, is being explored.

Arising out of a visit to China, by a delegation representing Wicklow County Council and Wicklow County Tourism, the possibility of working collaboratively with Hainan Province on the development of the film industry is also being explored.

#### **RETAIL**

#### **The Florentine Centre**

By developing the Bray town centre Site at Main Street/ Quinsborough Road/ Florence Road, Wicklow County Council aims to rejuvenate the heart of the town and its environs, to enhance the retail mix to include a more diverse offering including fashion retail, to extend the trading period on Main Street and to add life and vibrancy to the Main Street area in the evenings.

Planning consent was granted to Wicklow County Council for the following;

- Two anchor stores
- 8 retail units at upper ground floor level and at first level
- 3 restaurant units at upper ground floor level
- 3 business units at first floor level
- 5 screen cinemas at upper ground, first and second floor levels
- 256 car parking spaces at lower level with 320 cycle spaces
- Change of use of Nos. 6-7 Eglinton Road (protected structures) from residential to office use, demolition of rear returns and out buildings, construction of a glazed link extension to the rear of the structures and refurbishment of previous office use at No.8 Eglinton Road
- New urban street accessed from Main Street into the new development creating a central plaza with pedestrian access from Quinsborough Road, incorporating an events space, seating, landscaping and kiosks
- Demolition of Nos. 3 and 4 Florence Villas, Florence Road, and creating a new vehicular access for services at this location
- Demolition of No. 7 Main Street

 Demolition of the façade of No.5 Main Street.

Following a two stage procurement process, one tender was received by the closing date of 6<sup>th</sup> December 2017. This tender was recommended to and accepted by the Chief Executive. The statutory disposal notice has been sent to the elected members for their consideration at the Wicklow County Council meeting of 15<sup>th</sup> January, 2018, the contract cannot be signed until the disposal has been approved by the members.

#### Retail - Other

The Council and the Municipal Districts have worked with the various Town Teams and the Chambers of Commerce to support the various Christmas retail initiatives in order to encourage people to "shop local". Reports from Retail Excellence Ireland would indicate that the move towards online purchasing continues. Wicklow County Council via the Local Enterprise Office offers support and training for retailers wishing to sell goods online, it is vitally important that local retailers have an online presence.

In 2018 it is intended to further expand the Age Friendly Business Recognition programme for County Wicklow businesses in the retail and hospitality sectors.

#### **TOWN TEAMS**

Town Teams have been established in Bray, Arklow, Greystones and Wicklow .A key objective of the Town Team initiative is to encourage more collaboration, communication and cooperation between the Local Authority, business and the wider community and to develop one voice from one team for each town.

Towns Matter consultants have completed town centre health checks for Wicklow and Arklow and will present the final report and recommendations to each of the towns in January 2018.

Town Teams have made applications for LEADER funding for a variety of projects under the sub headings of Rural Tourism, Enterprise Development and Rural Towns.

An application has been made to the Department of Justice for CCTV for Arklow. It is proposed to submit a similar application in respect of Wicklow Town in 2018.



Wicklow County Council is working with the Town Teams to develop one or more digital hubs within the County in 2018.

Town Teams will be established in Rathdrum and Blessington in 2018.

#### **Web Portal Project**

The web-portal project is at the final stage of development and testing. When completed the Web Portal will play a key role in communicating the new 'Wicklow' brand which encapsulates what Wicklow has to offer across multiple dimensions: start and grow a business, live and work, visit and stay. It is anticipated that the new portal will be launched toward the end of January 2018

#### **TOURISM**

### Tourism Statement of Strategy and Work plan 2017-2022:

Following a tendering process Wicklow County Council appointed 'Bluesail Consulting Ltd.' to draft a County Wicklow Tourism Strategy in November, 2017.

The overall vision is to make Wicklow the number one choice for visitors seeking an idyllic escape that harmonises a wide range of outdoor pursuits in Wicklow's world class natural arena, while driving job creation.

Blue Sail has carried out some initial analysis.In 2016 Wicklow welcomed 329,000 domestic visitors, they stayed for an average of 3.1 nights and spent €71 million. There has been very strong growth in numbers of domestic visitors coming to Wicklow in recent years

Also in 2016 Wicklow welcomed 272,000 overseas visitors who spent €86 million in the County. Wicklow has 3% of Ireland's visitor accommodation but only 2% of income from visitor accommodation. A workshop will be held in mid February with representatives of Wicklow County Council, Wicklow Tourism Strategy Group and Wicklow County Tourism to present and test recommendations prior to the roll out of the tourism strategy.

#### **Other Tourism Activity**

Following the visit to China in November by representatives **of** Wicklow County Council and Wicklow County Tourism a delegation from Hainan University visited Wicklow on 13<sup>th</sup> December. The group visited Powerscourt Estate, Glendalough and Wicklow Gaol. They also visited Wicklow County Campus Rathnew where they met the Leas

Cathaoirleach and received presentations on the topics of Tourism, the Wicklow Film Commission and Wicklow County Campus. They were joined by the Cathaoirleach and the Chief Executive for dinner and traditional music at Wicklow Brewery.

Hainan University is an International Education Partner of the DIT School of Hospitality, Management and Tourism. Wicklow County Council and Wicklow County Tourism are working with DIT and Hainan University to strengthen this relationship through supporting internships and work experience for Hainan University Students within the County. In anticipation of direct flights from China commencing in 2018, Wicklow is positioning itself as the ideal location for visitors to base themselves while visiting Ireland. Wicklow County Council and Wicklow Tourism will be participating in the 2018 EU China Lightbridge Project aimed at attracting increased visitor numbers from China though developing a better understanding of visitor needs.

#### **MARITIME**

The Maritime Business Development Group met on 30<sup>th</sup> November and received presentations on aquaculture from Stephen Kavanagh of Marine Health Foods and from Kate Dempsey of the Irish Seed Mussel Company (winner of the County Wicklow Best Young Entrepreneur). Both Stephen and Kate confirmed that there are "endless opportunities" for the development of aquaculture along Wicklow's coastline, in a sustainable way

A presentation was also delivered by Jerry Barnes of McCabe Durney Barnes on the opportunities for offshore wind energy. Planning consent exists for up to 400 turbines capable of powering up to 800,000 homes annually. The Codling Bank Windfarm Project was developed with a view to exporting energy to the UK this project has not progressed due to failure to reach agreement on tariffs.



Wicklow County Council has made a submission to the Department of Communications Energy and Natural Resources seeking to be included as a stakeholder given the likely impacts/ opportunities arising out of these projects.

#### Next Steps for the Maritime Business Development Group

The development of a maritime strategy which will include an audit of marine assets, and an audit of land available in the vicinity of the commercial harbours and a plan to maximise opportunities arising out of tourism, wind energy and aquaculture.

- maximise opportunities arising out of tourism, wind energy and aquaculture.
- How best to maximise the opportunity presented by offshore wind energy developments: The ESB is seeking expressions of interest for the provision of renewable energy marine services related to offshore wind farms. ESB plans to develop or acquire the offshore wind farms commencing in 2018. The location of these initial offshore wind farms is expected to be in the Irish sea. This is very significant for County Wicklow and we need to ascertain how to best maximise the benefit of such activity.
- Investigation into the development of an aquaculture cluster in County Wicklow

#### 3. Local Enterprise Office (LEO)

#### **LEO Objectives**

To foster an enterprise culture and stimulate enterprise at local level by:

- Promotion of the enterprise message at local level.
- Working with the relevant stakeholders in the county to foster entrepreneurship.
- Delivering appropriate enterprise training and mentoring to entrepreneurs.
- Providing funding options to entrepreneurs, early stage promoters and viable businesses to support growth and development of micro enterprises.
- Developing a progression pathway for clients to Enterprise Ireland
- Acting as a First Stop Shop for business information and referral

#### **ENERGY MONITORING & REPORTING - QTR 4 2017**

- All public bodies are expected to achieve a target of 33% reduction in energy usage from baseline figures in 2009 to 2020
- Analysis of key parameters in the Monitoring and Reporting System, including improving activity metrics, Irish Water data removal and robust data collection procedures have been analysed in conjunction with the Carlow Kilkenny Energy Agency (CKEA). This included assistance in completing gap to target analysis & investment strategies for 2018 – 2020 to ensure targets are met
- Information has also been sought for all buildings in Council ownership or usage with a view to energy efficiency measures that may be taken and also details of usable floor areas. This latter with a view to improving the activity metrics reported by Wicklow County Council to demonstrate our energy use more accurately.
- The awareness campaign run by the Energy Team has done daily emails to all staff with tips for improved energy efficiency at home and at work since September and will continue with these on a weekly basis from January
- November-December Audits on the three larger Recycling Centres were carried out by CKEA and we are awaiting the report on these and recommendations for energy efficiencies.

<u>Proposed Measures for 2018</u>- A comprehensive energy audit for larger facilities and energy users, where all potential energy savings measures will be

identified, and life cycle cost analysis will be completed during the next 12-18 months. 38 buildings and facilities were identified and the audits of the first 10 of these will begin in early February. This would include full certification of all public building that require DEC/BER

#### **CLIMATE CHANGE 2017**

One of the important aspects of Climate Change Adaptation planning will be the necessity to develop two-way communications with local groups and communities.

With this in mind a meeting was held in early December of the County Wicklow PPN with a view to explore the possibilities for setting up a Co Wicklow Environmental Network. All groups with an environmental focus (i.e. ecological protection/environmental sustainability) were welcome to attend.

Wicklow County Council gave a presentation on the current status of Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Plans and encouraged the meeting to work towards forming a comprehensive Environmental Group.

The meeting agreed to develop an environmental network that can be supported by Co Wicklow PPN. Any group with an interest in Environmental issues can participate. The focus of the group will be on two-way information to inform community groups with support from the PPN while giving the opportunity for communities to communicate and engage on environmental issues relating to Climate Change.

#### Winter Maintenance

The 2017/2018 winter maintenance programme continued during November with 141 call outs made and with approximately 730 tonnes of salt used over 9 individual gritting routes across the county. Salt stocks were also replenished during the last week of the month with deliveries made to the depots at Baltinglass, Blessington, Carnew and Roundwood. Further salt deliveries are set to continue during December 2017.

#### Winter Service Plan 2017/2018

- Plan operational from 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017 to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018
- Wicklow County Council uses the Road DSS Manager system to assist in predicting appropriate response to weather events involving ice/snow.
- The Road DSS system comprises a software package and weather stations located at various locations along the road network. Met Eireann provide forecasts as to likely weather conditions.

- A decision is made by the Duty Engineer as to whether or not to grit based on the forecast provided. Some or all of the following routes are treated according to the forecast weather conditions.



#### 3. Register of Electors

Following completion of the Draft Register, there were 100,027 electors in the system. 4,911 letters issued to those people that the fieldworkers were unsuccessful in contacting either through having moved out of the county or being unable to establish if they were still resident.

Out of the 4,911 letters issued to constituents, 65% - 70% of these have been returned as still resident at that address and have been keyed into the system accordingly. 600 e-mails were received, responded to and auctioned. Approximately 1,200 letters have been returned marked as "gone away" or "not known at this address". A further batch of letters will be sent to give these voters one last opportunity to either remain on the register in Wicklow or to provide a new address elsewhere for forwarding onto other local authorities. It is anticipated that in the region of 400 replies will be received.

The Claims Court with the County Registrar, Mary Delahunty took place on 12<sup>th</sup> December.

The compiling of the Postal and Special Voters list is ongoing whereby electors registered in nursing homes, army personnel, disabled voters living at home, postal voters by circumstance of occupation and the diplomatic service are being contacted to

see if they wish to remain on or be removed from this list.

A complete re-run of the draft register will take place in January 2018.


