4. HOUSING SUPPLY - PROGRAMME OF DELIVERY

Update on Kilbride Lane Social Housing Scheme, Bray, Co Wicklow

The situation regarding MDY Construction Limited, the contracting firm engaged to construct the 42 Social Housing units at Kilbride Lane in Bray is complicated from a legal and procurement perspective.

Wicklow County Council is obtaining advice from their legal team on how best to proceed to continue with the development of this project and further updates will be provided when more clarity on the situation is known.

In the meantime, Wicklow County Council is providing 24 hour security at the site.

6. PPP SOCIAL HOUSING PROJECT

[Bundle 1)

Development Site at Convent Lands, Wicklow for 51 Social Housing units. The Department of Housing has dedicated €300 million towards delivery of housing through the public, private partnership model in the Rebuilding Ireland Action Plan. Wicklow has been included as a project in Bundle 1. The Part 8 was passed by the members at the Council Meeting of 3rd July 2017. The project is expected to commence on site in December 2018.

7. APPROVED HOUSING BODIES (AHB'S)

Capital Advance Leasing Facility (CALF) - 5 units were provided under a CALF lease to Cooperative Housing on the Greenpark Road in Bray.

6 apartments (Abbey St. Wicklow) purchase completed by Tuath AHB.

Approval has been received from the Department of Housing, Planning Community and Local Government for a leasing arrangement with Cluid to provide 45 units of accommodation on the Council's site at St. Earnan's View, Ballybeg, Rathnew. Estimated delivery date of these units is quarter 4 2019.

Capital Assistance Scheme (CAS) The CAS call for 2017 has been recently advertised.

Expressions of Interest – Social Housing on Council lands - A preferred proposal has been identified.

8. Housing Schemes Remediation

Glending, Blessington - Remediation

Stage 2 and Stage 3 Phase 3A – No 1 to No. 12 Glending Road have been completed.

Stage 3 Phase 3B – No. 1 to No. 10 *Glending Square and No. 1 to No. 4 Glending Way* – Contract commenced on 3rd January 2018 with internal works to 1-10 Glending Square complete. External works on these properties substantially complete with works to public areas underway. Internal and External works on 1-4 Glending Way are complete with roofing works substantially complete.

Hillview, Wicklow - Remediation

Roofing contract completed and contractor off site. Refurbishment works to "B Types"- 13 of 14 completed, Bridge works to "F Types" and ceiling repairs to "C and F Types" as before at 70% and 90% respectively.

Sonas Facility, Wicklow (Domestic Violence)

6 Adult (Female) & 10 children.

Sonas has advised that it is withdrawing services from Wicklow. The operation of the facility is being tendered out to Approved Housing Bodies to operate the facility as a Homeless Hub. Current residents will be assisted into alternative accommodation with a dedicated support worker being assigned to this project.

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray and Arklow, leased to AHBs, provide 22 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients.

11. People of the Year Awards 2018

These awards recognise the local heroes, ordinary people doing extraordinary things, for the benefit of their communities, their neighbourhoods, and their society as a whole.

The awards ceremony took place in the Glenview Hotel on 21st September. There were 11 recipients receiving awards in the categories as follows – sportsperson, social inclusion, good neighbour, lifetime volunteers, music, local hero, health and community.

Wicklow County Council co-sponsors this event with the People Newspapers, Irish Public Bodies Insurance and the Glenview Hotel.

Proceeds go to the Wicklow Hospice Foundation.

12. SOCIAL INCLUSION COMMUNITY ACTIVATION PROGRAMME (SICAP)

(i) Pobal utilised the Clermont Campus to run a SICAP training day on September 11th for Wicklow LCDC members, Wicklow's two LDCs (Local Development Companies) and a number of attendees from Carlow LDC. All attendees very impressed with the facilities and venue.

(ii) Co. Wicklow Partnership recently filled the new position of SICAP Programme Coordinator. This should greatly enhance the



delivery of the SICAP Programme in Wicklow, Arklow and Baltinglass Municipal Districts.

(iii) LDCs nationally, including Bray Area Partnership and County Wicklow Partnership, are focused on the completion and submission of indepth case study reports by 5th October to Pobal and to their local Local Community Development Committee (LCDC).

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION NETWORK (PPN):

- (i) The national PPN annual report 2017 was launched on 4th September and is available online.
- (ii) Wicklow PPN hosted a training, information and networking fair in the Brockagh Resource Centre, Laragh on 8th September.
- (iii) A discussion evening was held on 13th September in An Tairseach Ecology Centre, Wicklow on the Future of our Coastal Communities.
- (iv) Ongoing talks are taking place on the topic of "Community Well-Being" at various venues during September and October. See Wicklow PPN Facebook page for more details.
- (v) The PPN National Conference will take place on 11th and 12th October in Athlone. Wicklow will have representatives in attendance.

13. WICKLOW LIBRARY SERVICE

LIBRARY TECHNOLOGY GRANTS

Wicklow County Council will invest €246,000 in innovative technology throughout all 13 public libraries in the coming months. Of this, more than €150,000 will be grant aided from the Department of Rural and Community Development.

All libraries will receive Wi-Fi enabled laptops and tablets to assist the public with information queries and book requests.

The larger libraries will also have a number of additional items, including:

- Tablet lending stations, which enables the public to borrow a tablet for use in the library
- Event headsets, which in addition to improving sound quality for live audiences, will give the potential to podcast or live stream events on the library social media platform
- Digital signage, which will be used to inform library user of upcoming events, both in our libraries and general information from Wicklow County Council
- High spec laptop trolleys will enable our libraries to host coding workshops and gaming sessions for younger library users. These would also be used for Work Matters programme events
- Conference cameras for use in community rooms, will enable video conference calls.
 They may also be used for library events in order to mainstream them on social media platforms
- Microfilm readers / scanners will be available in Bray, Greystones, Wicklow, Arklow and Blessington libraries. The request for these arose from direct consultation with local history groups, county wide, who stressed the inconvenience of having to travel to Bray to carry out research
- Dementia table technology will be available in Arklow, Blessington and Ballywaltrim libraries. This is an interactive innovation in the area of assisting people with dementia, in addition to people with learning disabilities, intellectual disabilities and autism.

All of the above will be promoted and advertised when it becomes available, towards the end of 2018.

HERITAGE WEEK

Wicklow County Council Library Service hosted a number of talks and exhibitions throughout its libraries for Heritage Week (August 18 - 26).



These included:

"Arklow Through the eyes of Strangers" - talks and exhibitions - Arklow library until August 31. Students of UCD Landscape Architecture explored Arklow and invited the public to view the exhibition and provide feedback. Some of the topics included "What Makes a Town Centre?", "Why Can't I Cycle to School?" and "Memories of Arklow". Leila's Tea Party was a particularly well supported aspect of this, which included a look back at old times. Also, on Thursday 23rd August (6-8PM) students were present to discuss their work with the public. Historian, Liz Gardner gave talk on "The Flooding of the Liffey Valley, 1940" in Blessington library on 21st August.

Courtesy of Blessington library, Davidstown old school tour took place on Saturday 18th August. The tour went to the school, places of interest and old homesteads in the Glen of Imaal, and was enjoyed by all.

Bray Historical Society gave talks on "This Day in Bray, 1943" in Ballywaltrim Library and "1918 in Bray" at Bray library, Eglinton Road.

SUMMER STARS

This programme has been a great success again in libraries throughout the count, with 2.937 children taking part this year. Summer Stars is a national initiative to encourage children to read during their long summer holidays. Certificates are currently being presented to all children who took part. All were delighted with the programme and activities throughout the summer.

14. COUNTY WICKLOW LOCAL SPORTS PARTNERSHIP (LSP)

EUROPEAN WEEK OF SPORT 2018

The European Week of Sport will run from 22nd to 30th September 2018 and is a week-long celebration of sport and physical activity. The aim for 2018 is to continue to grow and develop the week and Sport Ireland encourages all sporting bodies to take part to build on the tremendous success of the previous three years. Wicklow Local Sports Partnership intends to raise activity levels by providing a variety of programmes to national schools throughout the week. There is also an event organised on 29th September from 7pm - 9pm on Bray Seafront. Wicklow LSP has partnered with Bray Sports Promotion Unit, FAI and Tug of War Ireland and will be running Soccer League, Tug of War and a variety of fun games.

BALTINGLASS COUCH TO 5K

Wicklow LSP ran a successful 6 week Couch to 5k programme in Baltinglass. 18 people registered for this programme and 8 successfully completed the programme. The programme was run by Patrick Walsh who is on a Tús programme with County Wicklow Partnership and his placement is shared with Wicklow LSP. The group graduated with a 5k run at Russborough parkrun on the 1st September 2018.

KATIE TAYLOR BURSARY 2018

Wicklow Local Sports Partnership sent out application forms and guidelines for the Katie Taylor Bursary 2018 to each college to bring to the attention of their first year students. The closing date for applications was Friday 14th September 2018.



Community Coaching Programme 2018

8 applications have been received for the Community Coaching Programme 2018 which is commencing on 24th September 2018.

Gaelic4Teens

Wicklow Local Sports Partnership in conjunction with The Ladies Gaelic Football Association ran a very successful Gaelic4Teens Programme which was funded by dormant account funding secured through Sport Ireland. The programme will help clubs to retain their current playing bases while also recruiting players in the 15-17 age bracket, which has been identified as a group with a high drop-out rate. A number of clubs took part in this initiative in County Wicklow which culminated in a National Blitz Day in Sport Ireland Headquarters. Wicklow Local Sports Partnership will be hosting a presentation night for the local clubs to look back on the success of the programme. This will take place on the 26th September 2018 in the Glenview Hotel where an evaluation presentation will be given by Dr Wesley O'Brien.

14. County Wicklow Arts Office

CREATIVE IRELAND PROGRAMME

Creative Ireland local strategies were launched in the Irish Architecture Archive on Merrion Square on 12th September 2018 with An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar in attendance along with Minister for Housing, Planning & Local Government Eoghan Murphy and Minister for Culture, Heritage & The Gaeltacht Josepha Madigan.

CREATIVE YOUTH IRELAND PROGRAMME

Wicklow County Council is partnering with Kildare & Wicklow Education & Training Board (KWETB) to apply to the Creative Youth Ireland Programme which, if successful, would see a €100,000 investment in a pilot project as one of

three national pilots for the development of new and sustainable programmes under the Creative Ireland Scheme.

CULTURE NIGHT 2018

Culture Night had a busy event programme with 12 events listed in our brochure and many more fringe events happening countywide.

MUSIC GENERATION

Music Generation has begun anew term with new commissions planned to begin in partnership with Wicklow County Council in the final phase of 2018. In addition, a new youth choir initiative will begin.

15. LECP

Community Enhancement Programme 2018

The Community Enhancement Programme builds on and replaces the Communities Facilities Scheme and the re-cast RAPID programme. It is being put in place for 2018 following a review of those two schemes. Wicklow County Council has been allocated €141,343 under the first round of this scheme and an additional €209,187 under the second round of the scheme was announced on 21 st September bringing the total general fund to €250,530 to date.

The application process is being administered by Local Community Development Committees (LCDC's). The awards under Round 1 have been approved and all applicants will be contacted by early October.

Community Enhancement Programme 2018 (Men's Shed Funding)

The Department of Rural and Community Development allocated €0.5m to fund capital equipment or minor capital works in Men's Sheds. This is a ring-fenced fund, under the existing Community Enhancement Programme.



The application process is being administered by Local Community Development Committees (LCDC's). All Men's Sheds in Ireland that are affiliated with the Irish Men's Shed Association are eligible to apply. The awards have been approved and all applicants will be contacted by early October.

AGE FRIENDLY INITIATIVES

Dementia table technology has been launched and will be available in Arklow, Blessington and Ballywaltrim libraries by the end of 2018. This is an interactive innovation in the area of assisting people with dementia as well people with learning disabilities, intellectual disabilities and autism.

Signage in respect of Age Friendly Parking for Older People has been recently installed in Arklow.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, PLANNING AND INFRASTRUCTURE

1. WICKLOW ECONOMIC THINK TANK (CWETT) ACTION PLAN/LOCAL ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY PLAN (LECP) (ECONOMIC)

The Economic Development Unit of the Enterprise and Corporate Services Directorate is charged with implementing the economic actions in the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP). Many of the 142 actions listed in the LECP have come from the County Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) Action Plan. The CWETT which was initiated in 2013 was a collaborative project initiated by Wicklow County Council and involved the business community from across the county and the County Enterprise Board (now LEO Wicklow).

BRAND

A sub group of the Wicklow County Council Communications committee is developing guidelines for the use of the brand on Council stationery, emails etc.

FILM

Wicklow County Council is in the process of developing a Masterplan for Wicklow County Campus, to develop the site as a creative Content/Film hub.

An application has been submitted to Enterprise Ireland under Stream One of the Regional Enterprise Development Fund. The project team made a comprehensive presentation to Enterprise Ireland in September. Funding announcements will be made in November.

RETAIL

The Florentine Centre

Work is well underway on the Florentine Site development. Wicklow County Council/Bray Municipal District has arranged alternative free town centre parking for the duration of the works.

TOWN TEAMS

A key objective of the Town Team initiative is to encourage more collaboration, communication and cooperation between the Local Authority, business and the wider community and to develop one voice from one team for each town. An update on Town Team activity will be given at each Municipal District Meeting. Chamber of Commerce members on Town Teams have been asked to update their members on Town Team activity also.

Four towns were nominated to enter the Bank of Ireland Enterprise Town Awards 2018. Judging took place in Arklow and Bray on Tuesday 25th September and in Roundwood and Wicklow on Wednesday 26th September. All four towns showcased what their area had to offer and the calibre of presentations was outstanding. Each town demonstrated a strong community spirit and the benefits of collaborating on various improvements to the town.

TOURISM

Tourism Statement of Strategy and Marketing Plan 2018-2022:

The Tourism Strategy has been completed. An implementation team is being put in place to commence the roll out of the strategy.

Glendalough

The Chief Executive is chairing a working group consisting of representatives of Failte Ireland, NPWS, Coillte, OPW, aimed at progressing the development of Glendalough as one of Ireland's premier visitor destinations. The aim is to enhance the visitor experience through improved interpretation, signage, facilities and access.

MARITIME

The blue economy is an important pillar of Wicklow's economic development strategy.

Wicklow County Council is finalizing a vision statement for Bray Harbour and will be engaging a consultant to prepare the statement of maritime strategy for the County, taking account of challenges and opportunities particularly in the areas of tourism, aquaculture and offshore energy.

SSE Ireland made a presentation to the members at the Ordinary Meeting of Wicklow County Council in September. The presentation looked at the



proposed development of offshore wind energy in Ireland, along with plans to progress the development of 520MW+ Arklow Bank Wind Park project off the coast of County Wicklow.

COMMUTER SURVEY

Census 2016 indicated that 21,000 Wicklow residents commute outwards from the County to work each day. Wicklow County Council wishes to find out where commuters are travelling to, what they are working at with a view to identifying opportunities for reverse commuting.

Wicklow County Council has appointed consultants to carry out a Commuter Survey.

Data analysis is underway. A publicity campaign will be launched in early October with the actual survey being completed by the end of October.

URBAN AND RURAL REGENERATION FUNDING

The SEO with responsibility for Economic Development has been assigned to leading the team of officials responsible for making applications for funding under the Urban Regeneration Development Fund and under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund.

The Department of Housing Planning and LG has allocated €2 billion to Urban Regeneration in the NDP to 2027.

The fund is designed to leverage residential and commercial development, supported by infrastructure within the existing footprint of larger towns.

Bids should be a catalyst for development which otherwise would not occur, ideally local authority led, valued at a minimum of €2 million and matched by 25% funding. The purpose is to ensure that our urban areas can become attractive and vibrant places in which people choose to live, work, invest in and visit.

As part of Project Ireland 2040 the government has allocated €1 billion for a Rural Regeneration and Development Fund aimed at supporting the revitalisation of rural Ireland. The objective is to support co-ordinated and integrated projects between Government Departments, State Agencies, Local Authorities and other public bodies, which will contribute to sustainable rural regeneration.

A number of projects, in all areas of the County, were proposed as applications under this funding. Not all projects were feasible for this stream of funding but may be considered in the future. The team has worked to ensure a strong application was submitted in relation to each viable proposal. The application itself was comprehensive and sought evidence of collaboration and leveraging from relevant stakeholders, along with associated maps, plans and strategic documents. Applications were submitted at the end of September and it is anticipated that successful bids will be announced in Autumn 2018.

2. LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICE (LEO)

LEO Objectives

To foster an enterprise culture and stimulate enterprise at local level by:

- Promotion of the enterprise message at local level.
- Working with the relevant stakeholders in the county to foster entrepreneurship.
- Delivering appropriate enterprise training and mentoring to entrepreneurs.
- Providing funding options to entrepreneurs, early stage promoters and viable businesses to support growth and development of micro enterprises.
- Developing a progression pathway for clients to Enterprise Ireland
- Acting as a First Stop Shop for business information and referral

- LEO LEAN for Micro Programme ongoing with 9 companies undergoing one to one LEAN training with specialist LEAN consultants.
- The Business Advice Clinics continued throughout September in Wicklow County Campus On Tuesdays and Thursday, in the Glenview Hotel on Monday evening and in Blessington civic offices on the last Thursday every month depending on demand.

The Regional Assembly executive is in the process of preparing a draft RSES. Early working draft chapters have been circulated and we have engaged closely with the RSES term to provide feedback. The proposed draft RSES is due to be issued to the members of the Assembly for their approval in October 2018.

A two week Volunteer/ Community Archaeology Excavation was co-ordinated at Glendalough from 7th- 17th August with over 50 participants.

WHITESTOWN REMEDIATION PROJECT

Wicklow County Council have now employed Fehily Timoney Company to advise on the remediation of the site at Whitestown, in accordance with the judgments of Mr Justice Humphreys. They are independent experienced Environmental Consultants. An initial meeting has taken place with the consultants and a steering committee has been formed to monitor progress on the remediation project.

PORTS & HARBOURS

Improvements have continued in Wicklow & Arklow Harbours over the summer. Fendering works have been carried out along the quay walls in both harbours. A new engineer is expected at the start of September and she will progress other projects such as improvements to the upper deck of the East Pier and importantly replacing the mooring bollard on the Packet Pier in Wicklow. In Arklow, Arklow Marina Ltd. won the franchise to operate the 16 berth marina in Arklow.

BLUE FLAG BEACHES

The lifeguard service drew to a close at the end of August in Wicklow Harbour and Arklow. The service will continue for the first 3 weekends of September on the Blue Flag Beaches in Bray, Greystones and Brittas Bay North and South. The focus this year has been on accident prevention. Through greater interaction with the public and early intervention the work of the lifeguards has resulted in there being no recorded rescues. The long hot summer saw huge increases in visitors to all our beaches. There was a corresponding higher recorded number of people presenting for first aid. The number of lost children also increased but all reports ended happily with the children being found safe and sound and quickly. New lifeguard huts in the red and yellow livery were provided this season at Wicklow Harbour and Brittas Bay North and South. They provided lifeguards with increased visibility and comfort while being a visible point of contact for the public.

The Environment Section and Sports Partnership worked together to provide the Beach Wheelchair at Brittas Bay North, which is wheelchair accessible beach. The service was facilitated by Suzanne Brennan of "The Beach Hut" at Stauntons Caravan Park, Brittas Bay who took the bookings. The first bookings took place in August and the level of use is very encouraging. It is hoped to extend the facility to other locations next season. During the winter months use of the wheelchair can be arranged through Sports Partnership.

Other uses of the Blue Flag beaches this year include location for several film crews, a packed out drive-in movie and also an open air cinema, and the venue for a triathalon and the Leinster Surf Rescue Championship.

Targeted Leakage reduction Programme.

Co Wicklow is part of a nationwide programme for reduction in Water Leakage. Over recent months, 680 leaks have been detected by the local authority / Irish Water leak detection crew and find and fix contractors. Repairs have also been carried out to 260 leaks which have been reported by members of the public.

The Key Performance Indicator statistics show that the unaccounted for water in Wicklow has dropped from 41% to 32% showing that the targeted leakage reduction programme is working.


