MINUTES OF ORDINARY MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY 16th January 2019

Item 1 - Vote of Sympathy:

A minutes silence was observed.

Item 2 - Confirmation of Minutes of the Arklow Municipal District Meeting, held on the 12th of December 2018.

The Minutes of the Arklow Municipal District Meeting held on the 12th December 2018 were proposed by Cllr Annesley and seconded by Cllr Fitzgerald.

Item 3: Matters Arising.

Brendan Doyle DE confirmed that AMD were waiting on replies in relation to the issues about the public lighting on the Wexford Road and that there was no timeline given. It was noted that ESB Networks would be replacing the timber poles and upgrading to LED lighting across the town. A schedule of works will be circulated when available.

Cllr Bourke requested information on cable laying in the town - it was noted that a new contractor was engaged and works would be reviewed at the end of January.

Cllr Kennedy confirmed that contact had been made with Coillte and that the commitment to do the works was there but no timeframe given. Brendan Doyle DE said that they would continue to liaise with them about the works required.

Item 4: To receive an update on the LA Housing Fabric Upgrade Programme of Works 2018/2019 – Declan Marnane T/Senior Engineer Housing and Corporate Estate.

Declan Marnane SE Housing gave a report on the works completed to date in phase 1 and confirmed that phase 2 would not begin until phase 1 works were completed. Phase 2 will require departmental approval. Any tenants that were notified of works in 2018 should have works done as part of phase 1 where suitable. Older houses would most likely be part of phase 2. Property surveys are ongoing to determine suitability for pumped insulation; the alternatives would be dry-lining or external insulation. Details of any particular cases of concern can be sent to Housing. Cllr Kennedy asked how many on the original list had works completed and Declan Marnane confirmed that there were small pockets of houses throughout the district that needed works done − approx. 32 left within the district. The cost per unit is between €2000 and €3000. Declan Marnane SE confirmed that houses could be added; Cllr Fitzgerald noted the difficulty in securing contractors.

Housing grants (HAG,MAG,HAOP) were discussed and Declan Marnane re-iterated that prospective applicants should not be put off by delays in getting works started.

Cllr Kennedy asked for the number of properties without heating and Declan Marnane SE confirmed that the number was in the region of 400 and that the elderly tenants would be looked after first. Cllr Annesley asked if a tenant had missed out on the Central Heating Scheme, what could they do – Declan Marnane advised that they contact Housing directly.

<u>Item 5 : To discuss Kilbride graveyard / Arklow Pyramid – Ms D Burns Heritage Office Wicklow County Council.</u>

Deirdre Burns, Heritage Officer was welcomed to the meeting. The issue has been on the agenda for a long time and her input was needed.

The pyramid is a rare example of its kind and is listed as a protected structure in the County Development Plan. Ownership has been established and WCC own a small area at the roadway. Vandalism to graves and headstones is prevalent on the site. The visual presentation of the site needs to be upgraded and access established as a heritage site. Grants are available and the application should be made by the owners and assistance can be given.

The ongoing vandalism needs to be dealt with – to turn this around will take extreme effort and a formal structure put in place. An approach can be recommended and WCC could provide the expertise.

Cllr Murphy enquired about insurance on the plot as a tourist attraction and the general consensus was that the owner is responsible for insurance cover. Cllr McDonald asked if the onus was on the owner legally to keep the site to a particular standard – D Burns replied that they would not be allowed to change it either by construction or through neglect. Notice could be served but is rarely successful – the structure is the pyramid and does not include the graves.

Cllr Bourke to follow up on meeting with the owner.

Item 6: to receive a report from Brendan Doyle Senior Executive Engineer on the following works - .

2018 Roads Programme

The 2018 Roads programme is now completed with works completed at the below locations as part of road strengthening and surface dressing;

• Road Strengthening

L-6126 - Glenmalure,L-2196 - Moorshill/ Ballinasillogue,L-7136 - Cappagh / Asknagap,R748 - Carnew - Killaveny (Rosnastraw),R752 at Avoca (Tinnahinch),R772 at Ferrybank ,L-2188 at Kish.

• Surface Dressing

R-754 — Avoca to Conary ,L-6126 — Glenmalure ,L-2196-0 & L-2196-30 — Moorshill/Ballinasillogue,L-7136 — Cappagh/Askanagap.

Communication ongoing regarding actioning of snags between AMD and the current contractor for the works sections at L-6197 – Ballycoog to Clone and L-2143 – Annacurragh to Preban.

Discretionary Projects

The discretionary projects list of approximately 15 different projects agreed, each of the projects is at a varying stage of progression.

Footpaths / IPB Remedial Works

With regard to the Footpaths/IPB Remedial Works projects list of approximately 13 different project locations agreed, each of the projects is at a varying stage of progression.

Low Cost Safety Schemes

Civil Works have been completed. Lights installation and ESB connection works are outstanding. Contact with ESB has been made to advance the works as a priority.

Other Road Works - Storm Damage and LIS Works

<u>Storm Damage Works:</u> Works at Greenan, Ballyteige and Toberpatrick are ready to commence. A firm start date is awaited for all projects but is anticipated to be within the next 10 days.

<u>Local Improvement Scheme Works:</u> Works at Cronawinna, Kilmagig Upper and Ballycooleen have commenced and are due for completion by 19th December 2018. Works at Carriglineen are due to commence in the next 5 days.

Cllr Annesley commented that newly laid surfaces should not be dug up so soon after the original works. Brendan Doyle DE said that roads would be protected for the first 5 years.

Cllr Murphy raised the issue about IW looking to access resident's attics – Michael Geaney DM said he would check this out. Cllr Annesley said that residents should always look for ID before letting IW staff in the door.

Members wished Brendan well with his new post.

Item 7: To discuss the Discretionary Budget for 2019.

Mr. Brendan Doyle District Engineer advised the Members that the sum of €356,250.00 was available from three separate budgets as follows:-

Item 8: To receive an update on URDF Project for AMD.

Design works are progressing and tenders documents could be issued February/March 2019, it is hoped that the contract could be awarded by the end of April – the Courthouse hub should be operational by the end of 2019. The public realm project will be a larger project and should finish late 2020.

Parking issues relating to the public realm works was discussed and it was noted that there are a number of parking areas available throughout the town at mass times.

Item 9: To discuss a maintenance programme for St Gabriel's Graveyard.

It was noted that the town crew are committed throughout the year to maintain the graveyard as part of their normal work schedule.

The issue will remain on the agenda and be considered on a district basis.

Item 10: To receive an update on the Arklow Flood Relief Scheme.

A geomorphology study has been commissioned and work is progressing on preparing the project for planning process. The study will inform the plans for the bend in the river.

Cllr Murphy informed the meeting that the residents are looking for another meeting. Michael Geaney DM advised that the meeting will take place after the study has been completed and a report issued.

Item 11: To discuss the possibility of holding the AMD March Meeting in Redcross.

It was agreed to hold the March meeting in Redcross.

Item 12: Correspondence

An Oral Hearing chaired by ABP has been scheduled on the 22/1/19 in the Arklow Bay Hotel in relation to the planning application for the Arklow WWTP.

Correspondence has been received from the residents on Sea Road, Arklow requesting ramps be installed on the road. Cllr Fitzgerald asked that this be considered and other options be explored to slow down the traffic.

Correspondence has been received from the residents on Blackberry Glade in relation to the speeding traffic through the estate and the condition of the road. Also raised were problems with overgrown trees, manholes and dumping. Rob Mulhall confirmed that the area was on the list for assessment. Linda McDonald DA to reply.

Item 13: Any Other Business

Rob Mulhall EE put a proposal to the members for submission of at Part VIII planning application for an upgrade of St Mary's Park. The Members welcomed the proposal and agreed that the Part VIII should go out to public consultation.

Cllr Bourke raised concerns about the works on the Vale Rd and Cllr Murphy said that the contractor is not keeping the road surface clear. Michal Geaney will look into the works in relation to IW and Brendan Doyle will check the road opening licence details.
