Unique construction features include imperial sized bricks specially made in Scotland, and large sized timber for the upper floor and roof structure based upon original design dimensions.	
RPS ADD2	Nuns Cross Bridge, Ashford	Bridge	Free standing, narrow single arch bridge over Vartry River, constructed c. 1800	
RPS ADD3	Ballyraheen House, Ballyraheen Crossroads, Tinahely	Ballyraheen House	Detached seven-bay two and a half-storey over basement country house, built c.1760.	
RPS ADD5	Delgany(on west side of Bellevue Road, first house north on junction with regional road)	Cottage	Long, single-storey thatched house with deep thatch ¹ .	
RPS ADD6	Foresters Hall, Aughrim	Hall	Detached, four bay single storey hall built c. 1912 by Aughrim branch of the Irish National Order of Foresters.	HALIBERE
RPS ADD7	Ashford	Garda Station	Detached three-bay two-storey former RIC barracks with flat-roofed porch to front, cell to rear and outbuildings within rear yard.
