Hello We have been advised that our home, The Old Schoolhouse on Kilcoole Road, was reviewed for removal from the Record of Protected structures based on an exterior view of the house. We would like to follow up in any way to have the house reviewed from the interior and have this decision reconsidered. The schoolhouse was renovated and extended in the 1960s with poor workmanship and again in the 1980s and 1990s. These works moved most original features and altered every original wall/window and the entire ceiling in the home. The only original feature of the house still in existence is actually the roof which has been altered by patches and repairs over its 140+ year life. All the current windows which have had their openings made smaller and frames have warped. All of the floors were removed and concrete interior walls were poured, the front door was also made into a window of a bedroom and replaced in a poorly constructed extension. We have several neighbours who attended the school as children and knew the previous owner who applied for the protection and have been advised by them that the house has been so altered they cannot understand why it was approved for protection. If someone could please contact me in regards to this as soon as possible it would be greatly appreciated.
