SCHEDULE

Projects may provide for the construction, improvement or reconstruction of roads or bridges and must be of benefit to agricultural production and benefit two or more parcels of land owned or occupied by different persons or serve the public.

PART II - TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The scale of contribution ranges from **10**% for eligible roads with up to and including 5 residents to **15**% for those with 6 or more residents.
- 2. There must be more than one landholder on a Local Improvement Scheme road and the road must be open to the public at all times (i.e., no gates restricting access)

3. Eligible Roads

Eligible roads are non-public roads, often leading to houses and important community amenities such as graveyards, beaches, piers, mountains, etc. or other non-public roads that provide access to parcels of land, or provide access for harvesting purposes (including turf or seaweed) for two or more persons.

There must be more than 1 landholder on a Local Improvement Scheme road and the road must be open to the public.

4. Non Eligible Roads

- Roads serving only houses or buildings occupied or used by persons not engaged in Agriculture, and
- Roads leading to commercial enterprises.
- 5. The proposed works must be strictly necessary and not simply maintenance of the kind that applicants could do themselves but should provide for essential works of a more substantial kind such as strengthening weak sections, resurfacing, opening water channels. Existing fences may also be removed or set back, and new fences provided where necessary and feasible at reasonable cost
- 6. The applicants must make the necessary apportionment amongst themselves of their respective portions of the joint contribution, and must arrange to collect the agreed amount and lodge it with the Council before the work is put in hands. The local contribution must be submitted in one full sum, which can be receipted individually if a list is given with the name of the beneficiary and the amount paid.
- 7. The contributors and any other persons whose land or interests appear to be affected by the proposed work must, when required prior to the commencement of operation, sign the prescribed form giving their full consent to the execution of the work including entry to their lands, etc.
- 8. The applicants must arrange amongst themselves for the provision without cost to the Council of any lands, which may be required for the construction or widening of the roadway or drain as the case may be.
- 9. The Council will employ the necessary labour and will arrange to carry out the work subject to the conditions that:
- The person in charge of the work will be appointed by the Council or their agent.
- No person, whether a contributor or not, whose interests are affected will impede the
 execution of the work by making unreasonable demands on the person or other official in
 charge.

Failing the fulfilment of any of these conditions the work would not be put in hands and if already started would be closed down and any unexpended portion of the applicants' contribution returned to them through their representative.

- 10. The payment of a contribution by the applicants will not constitute a claim to employment on the work.
- 11. The Council, in their discretion, will decide on the specification of the work to be done and on the best manner of carrying it out, and the applicants shall not have any claim against the Council for any imperfection which may exist in the finished work, not for any failure to complete the full amount of the work which was envisaged.
- 12. The Council will expend upon the work the sum agreed upon (i.e. the estimated cost) and in the event of that sum not being sufficient to complete the entire work specified, the Council will not have any liability to be bound to expend on the work for its completion any sum in addition to the agreed sum, but the making of a supplementary grant will be considered on its merits if the applicants so request and agree to pay such sum as may be required by way of additional local contribution.
- 13. When the work has been carried out the applicants shall maintain it in good order and repair at their own charge and expense, and the Council will not have any liability for the maintenance of the work.
