Referring to the Memorial from the Town Commissioners dated the 24 day of Nov 1863, praying their Lordship sanction to postpone payment of the debt due by the Harbour Commissioners to the Town Comrs until the loan now being applied for, from the Board of Trade has been repaid, and having reference to their Lordship's reply dated 24 Feb 1864 whereby their plans and sections of the works already done, and of those works proposed to be executed with the loan of £10,000 now proposed to be borrowed.

In reply I am directed by the Town Commissioners to forward to your

Lordship inspection, the Plans and Sections proposed by the late Bay of Dublin, then Engineer of the Board of Works, Ireland and sanction by the Lords of the Treasury Admiralty and of which the works were executed and also to forward for their Lordship inspection a copy of the Survey made in 1864 by order of the Admiralty under the Dublin Corporation Water Works Bill

Their Lordship will perceive by the Sections Cross Sections and depth water that the dredging required to enable the Harbour Commissioners to collect tolls under the Harbour Act can be effected at a very moderate cost if only being required under the 107 feet of the Harbour Act. that there shall be 8 feet water at low water mark of ordinary spring tides.

The Town Commissioners by the draw the attention of their Lordship to the fact that the position of the Pier at Breakwater and works also refer to an rule sent for Wicklow Harbour, and the Commissioners are bound in this statement of all the material men acquainted with the port of Wicklow, and the Commissioners wish to inform your Lordship, that the failure of the works was caused by the manner in which they were executed, and so satisfied are the Commissioners with the suitability of the Pier & as shown on the admiral plan that they propose the reconstruction of the Pier in a permanent manner so as to resist the winter gales.

If the revenue to be derived from the Harbour was receivable under the Harbour Act, they would amount to over £1000 thousand pounds annually
