I beg to report to your Board that since last monthly meeting there has been some fresh cases of Scarletina but for a short time past it appears on the decayed premises that have been visited by it I have had disinfected and cleaned. I have in my possession an estimate of the cost of the Sanitary Work contemplated on the two premises on St. George's Plot. And it appears that to find materials and labour it would cost £3. 10. 0. Gentle as the fine weather is approaching I would draw your attention to the state of the murrenagh Promenade the late storms leaving it in a very bad state for walking on. I am requested to bring under your notice the dangerous state of the Wooden Bridge. I served the medical officer with the usual notices. I inspected a number of houses and premises and served six notices under the Public Health Act.
