






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Arts Office funding opportunities

- Wicklow County Council Arts Office established these funding schemes in 2013, which are designed to support artists, arts participation, artform development, community groups, creative engagement and arts festivals
- These schemes form part of a wider set of actions initiated and developed by Wicklow Council Council Arts Office directed at developing quality practice and public participation in the arts throughout the county
- Applications are welcome from all artforms including film, music, visual arts, theatre, dance, literature, architecture, animation, performance, circus, traditional arts and drama




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Overview and purpose of the schemes

- The Artist Award Scheme supports professional practising artists to develop or realise a particular body of work or to undertake professional development. <u>Maximum funding available</u>: €5,000, <u>although awards are often made for lesser amounts</u>
- The Artist & Community Collaboration Award Scheme supports artists and communities to engage in arts programmes, explore their creativity, interact and exchange ideas with others and embark on new learning journeys. Professional artists and community groups are invited to apply for this scheme. Maximum funding available: €5,000
- The Arts Festival Award Scheme seeks to assist Festival development plans and / or programmes. <u>Maximum funding available: €15,000</u>




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Eligibility

- The Artist Award Scheme is open to professional artists at all stages of their careers that are from Co. Wicklow or residing in Co. Wicklow for the past 3 consecutive years
- The Artist & Community Collaboration Scheme the community group must be based in Co. Wicklow and the project must take place in Co. Wicklow. Written confirmation from both the artist and the community group of their commitment to the proposal **must be obtained** in advance of applying. Any licences / permissions needed for the project must be sought and approved in advance of applying
- The Arts Festival Scheme is open to established arts festivals that take place in Co. Wicklow and demonstrate a strong track record of delivery



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Tips for application writing

Application Checklist

- ✓ Strong project idea that clearly aligns with the award guidelines and criteria
- ✓ Provide clear, concise answers to all questions
- ✓ Clear outcomes: who benefits, what changes, how impact will be measured.
- ✓ Audience engagement plan: how you will reach and involve people (if applicable)
- ✓ Detailed, realistic budget listing all items, costs and services. Pay attention to ineligible expenses
- ✓ Evidence of capacity: relevant experience, partners, governance
- ✓ Clear timeline or phased delivery plan
- ✓ Evaluation plan (feedback, participant / audience numbers, case studies, WCC accreditation)
- ✓ Strong letters of support that show real commitment and relevance to the proposal
- ✓ Supporting CV and high quality examples of past work which support your specific proposal
- ✓ Proofread: all documents, word counts, and requirements are checked
- ✓ Submit applications at least 24 hours before the deadline. **Do not leave it to the last minute**

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Budgeting

Budget tips


- ✓ Income and expenditure totals must match
- ✓ Detailed, realistic budget with all items, costs and services listed
- ✓ Clearly indicate all artist fees, including the number of days or hours associated with the fee and the daily / hourly rate. Wicklow County Council is committed to the fair and equitable payment of artists. Applications that do not align with this commitment will be deemed ineligible
- ✓ If you expect to receive in-kind support, you must assign it a financial value so that the contribution it makes to the real value of your proposal is clear. In-kind support refers to non-monetary contributions towards the realisation of your project i.e. free / reduced cost venue hire, marketing support, equipment hire, etc

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How to apply

- Read all documentation carefully
- Applications can only be submitted online via the **Submittable platform**
- Enter all relevant details on the online application form
- Upload the completed budget template available on the Wicklow Arts Office website
- Upload supporting documentation (CV, up to 5 examples of past work, supporting letters, etc.)



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Documentation & Evaluation

- Successful projects must be documented throughout the duration of the project
- The final report submitted to Wicklow Arts Office upon completion of the project <u>must</u> include:
 - Evaluation report including a reflection of the overall experience
 - A short report detailing how the award was spent (i.e. project details, cost, timeframe, etc.)
 - An expenditure report detailing a breakdown of costs along with proof of expenditure i.e. paid invoices / detailed supplier receipts to the value of the award: receipts / paid invoices must be dated from the time of award acceptance
 - A visual record (images / video) of the main stages of the project (Wicklow County Council may use this content for publicity relating to the funding schemes). Signed image consent forms are required for all individuals captured in images / video
 - Evidence of your recognition / accreditation of Wicklow County Council's financial contribution to the project




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Documentation & Evaluation

- Think about what your project aims to achieve:
 - Develop your artistic practice
 - Work with specific communities
 - Increase audience reach
 - Other objectives
- How will you evaluate the project?
- How will you determine the success of your project?
 - Data capture
 - Participant / audience feedback
 - Social media / press feedback
 - Anecdotal evidence
- Why have you selected that method and why is it important?
- Encouraging you to think critically, strategically, and with an eye to the future
