Testaments & Wills

- A will is often the last record of an individual
- Date of death on a will can indicate a death cert/record date, which will give an age at death giving an indication of a birth date to look for, and may also list surviving family members
- Wills more common in C 20th. Earlier than this mainly gentry and propertied classes

• Key Terms:

- PROBATE: the legal act of the administration of a deceased person's estate and the conveying of it to their next of kin or named beneficiaries
- If the deceased has a will then they are termed to have died TESTATE The documents relating to this will are called GRANTS OF PROBATE
- If no will is left it is termed INTESTATE and the court decides the destination of the estate...The documents relating to this situation are called LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION
